aircraft and land vehicles of a foreign state with respect to which His Majesty, by Order in Council, declares that the laws thereof confer corresponding rights with respect to the use of inventions in vessels, aircraft and land vehicles of the United Kingdom when coming into the foreign state or the territorial waters thereof:

And whereas by Section 91 of the said Acts, it is provided, inter alia, that where it is made to appear to His Majesty that the legislature of any part of His Majesty's dominions outside the United Kingdom has made satisfactory provision for the protection of inventions, designs or trade marks, patented or registered in this country, it shall be lawful for His Majesty, by Order in Council, to apply the provisions of the said Section to that part of His Majesty's dominions, with such variations or additions, if any, as may be stated in the Order:

And whereas by Section 93 of the said Acts it is provided, *inter alia*, that in the said Acts the expression "His Majesty's dominions outside the United Kingdom" includes any territory in respect of which a mandate on behalf of the League of Nations is being

exercised by His Majesty:
And whereas the laws of Tanganyika Territory confer rights with respect to the use of inventions in vessels, aircraft and land vehicles of the United Kingdom when coming into Tanganyika Territory or the territorial waters thereof corresponding to those mentioned in Section 48 of the said Patents and Designs Acts, 1907 to 1932:

And whereas it is made to appear to His Majesty that the legislature of Tanganyika Territory has made satisfactory provision for the protection of trade marks registered in the United Kingdom:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, in exercise of the powers conferred upon Him in manner hereinbefore recited and of all other powers in that behalf, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, is pleased to order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:—

- 1. The provisions of Section 48 of the Patents and Designs Acts, 1907 to 1932, shall apply to vessels, aircraft and land vehicles of Tanganyika Territory in like manner as they would apply to vessels, aircraft and land vehicles of a foreign state with respect to which an Order in Council had been made under subsection (2) of that Section.
- 2. The provisions of Section 91 of the Patents and Designs Acts, 1907 to 1932, so far as relates to trade marks, shall apply to Tanganyika Territory.
- 3. This Order may be cited as the Patents and Trade Marks (Tanganyika Territory) Order, 1937.

- "I, Geoffrey Francis, Bishop of Chester, beg leave to represent to your Grace in pursuance of the 26th Section of the Act of Parliament of the first and second years of the reign of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria Chapter 106.
- "That the portion of the Parish of Ashton-upon-Mersey in the Diocese of Chester which is coloured brown on the accompanying plan and which contains a population of approximately two thousand persons is distant from the Parish Church of Ashton-upon-Mersey and is in closer proximity to the Parish Church of the New Parish of Saint Mary Magdalene Ashton-upon-Mersey in the said Diocese of Chester and the spiritual care of the inhabitants of the said portion coloured brown will be more conveniently and effectually provided for by the Incumbent of the New Parish of Saint Mary Magdalene Ashton-upon-Mersey aforesaid
- "That the portion of the said Parish of Ashton-upon-Mersey which is coloured blue on the said plan and which contains a population of approximately one thousand nine hundred persons is distant from the Parish Church of Ashton-upon-Mersey and is in closer proximity to the Church of the New Parish of St. Alban Broadheath in the said Diocese of Chester and the spiritual care of the inhabitants of the said portion coloured blue will be more conveniently and effectually provided for by the Incumbent of the said New Parish of Saint Alban Broadheath.
- That the portion of the said New Parish of Saint Mary Magdalene Ashton-upon-Mersey which was formerly in the New Parish of Saint John Baguley (the last mentioned Parish now being in the Diocese of Manchester) and which was transferred to the said New Parish of St. Mary Magdalene Ashton-upon-Mersey under the provisions of the Wythenshawe Parishes (Transfer) Measure 1933 and is coloured green on the accompanying plan and which portion contains a population of approximately three thousand eight hundred persons is distant from the Parish Church of the New Parish of St. Mary Magdalene Ashton-upon-Mersey aforesaid and is in closer proximity to the Parish Church of the New Parish of St. Paul Sale in the said Diocese of Chester and the spiritual care of the inhabitants of the said portion coloured green will be more conveniently and effectually provided for by the Incumbent of the said New Parish of St. Paul Sale.
- "That the Patronage of the Rectory and Parish Church of Ashton-upon-Mersey aforesaid belongs to Lawrence Chetwynd Atkinson in full right and that the Reverend Percy Holland Lester Clerk M.A. B.D. is now Rector of the said Rectory and Parish Church.
- "That the Patronage of the Vicarage and New Parish of St. Mary Magdalene Ashtonupon-Mersey belongs to Arthur Withnall Prince Leslie Steains Thomas Hopwood Harry Richardson and Edward Lawrence Riley as Trustees and that the Reverend William Dysart Acheson Smyth Clerk M.A. is now Vicar of the said Vicarage and New Parish of St. Mary Magdalene Ashton-upon-Mersey.
