PHARMACY AND POISONS ACT, 1933.

Notice is hereby given that on the 2nd November, 1937, the Secretary of State for the Home Department, after consultation with the Poisons Board, made an Order, entitled The

Poisons List (Amendment) Order, 1937, under Section 17 (5) of the Pharmacy and Poisons Act, 1933, amending the Poisons List, being the list of the substances which are to be treated as poisons for the purposes of the Act; and further that the Secretary of State has made Rules entitled the Poisons (Amendment) Rules, 1937, under Section 23 of the Pharmacy and Poisons Act, amending the Poisons Rules, 1935.

COUNTY OF DORSET.

CORONERS (AMENDMENT) ACT, 1926.

Order for the Alteration of Coroners' Districts.

Whereas a vacancy has arisen in the office of Franchise Coroner for the Cranborne Hundred in the County of Dorset:

And whereas by the operation of Section 4 (1) of the Coroners (Amendment) Act, 1926, the area in which the Franchise Coroner had jurisdiction has become merged in the said County for all purposes relating to Coroners:

And whereas by Section 4 (2) of the said Act it is provided that where any area in which a Franchise Coroner had jurisdiction is merged in a County which is divided into Coroners' Districts, any consequential alteration of the division of the County into Coroners' Districts shall be effected in manner provided by the Act:

And whereas the said County is now divided into four Coroners' Districts:

And whereas by the Dorsetshire Review Order, 1933, the Parishes of East Woodyates and West Woodyates in the Eastern Coroners' District of the County were added to the Parish of Pentridge and the Parish of Canford Magna in the said District was abolished:

And whereas the Franchise Coroner for the Cranborne Hundred exercised jurisdiction in the Parishes of Alderholt, Cranborne, Edmondsham, Hampreston, Verwood, West Parley and Witchampton, part of the Parish of Pentridge as altered by the Dorsetshire Review Order, 1933, and part of the Parish of Holt:

And whereas the Council of the said County has pursuant to Section 12 of the said Act and to the Coroners (Orders as to Districts) Rules, 1927, submitted to the Secretary of State a draft Order to provide that the area in which the Franchise Coroner exercised jurisdiction shall be added to the existing Eastern Coroner's District of the said County:

Now therefore I the undersigned, one of His Majesty's Principal Secretaries of State, in pursuance of the power vested in me by Section 12 of the said Act do hereby order that the
