## FOOT-AND-MOUTH DISEASE (INFECTED AREAS) ORDER OF 1937 (No. 79).

### SUBJECT.

I. Further contracts the Soke of Peterborough, Lincoln, Isle of Ely, Huntingdon, Northampton and Rutland Foot-and-Mouth Disease Infected Area, as from the 21st December, 1937, so as to comprise only the area described in the First Schedule.

II. Releases the Soke of Peterborough, Lincoln, Isle of Ely, Huntingdon, Northampton and Rutland Foot-and-Mouth Disease Infected Area from restrictions and revokes the Orders described in the Second Schedule, as from the 26th December, 1937.

## FIRST SCHEDULE.

### Contracted Infected Area.

An Area comprising:—

*In the county of Lincoln (Parts of Kesteven).*

The parish of Uffington.

*In the county of Northampton.*

The parishes of Easton on the Hill, Collyweston, Duddington, King's Cliffe, Nassington, Yarwell, Apethorpe, Woodnewton, Fotheringhay; and so much of the parish of Warmington as lies to the north and north-west of the road

running from Elton Church via Warmington Smithy, Warmington Church and Tansor Cross Roads to Oundle.

### *In the county of the Soke of Peterborough.*

The parishes of Wothorpe, St. Martins Without, Barnack, Wittering, Thornhaugh, Bainton, Southorpe, Wansford, Sutton, Upton, Ufford, Helpston, Ailsworth, Castor, and Marholm; and so much of the parishes of Etton and Glington as lies to the south-west of the London and North Eastern Railway line running from Peterborough to Stamford Station.

### *In the county of Huntingdon.*

The parishes of Sibson cum Stibbington, Water Newton, and Elton; and so much of the parishes of Orton Waterville, Alwalton, and Chesterton as lies to the north of the road running from Botolph Bridge via Alwalton Church and Chesterton Church to Elton.

## FOREIGN HAY AND STRAW (AMENDMENT) ORDER OF 1937 (No. 6).

### SUBJECT.

Prohibits as from the 18th December, 1937, the landing of hay and straw from the Union of South Africa (including the Mandated Territory of South West Africa) subject to the exceptions specified in Article 2 of the Foreign Hay and Straw Order of 1912.
