PRESENT,

The KING's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

WHEREAS His late Majesty King George the Fifth, being satisfied that the Law of the Province of Alberta as respects the duty leviable in respect of property situate in Great Britain when passing on death was to the like effect as the provisions of sub-section (1) of Section 20 of the Finance Act, 1894, was pleased by an Order in Council bearing date the 25th day of May, 1933, to apply Section 20 of the Finance Act, 1894, to the Province of Alberta:

And whereas by the said Section it is, amongst other things, enacted that His Majesty in Council may revoke any Order issued under the said Section applying its provisions to any British Possession when it appears that the Law of such British Possession has been so altered that it would not authorise the making of such an Order:

And whereas the Law of the Province of Alberta has been so altered as aforesaid, and it is expedient to revoke the said Order in Council:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by virtue and in exercise of the power of the Finance Act, 1894, in His Majesty vested, is pleased by and with the advice of His Privy Council, to order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:—

1. The provisions of the Order of the 25th day of May, 1933, which apply section 20 of the Finance Act, 1894, to the Province of Alberta, are hereby revoked.

2. This Order shall be deemed to have come into operation on the 19th day of May, 1937.

The KING's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

WHEREAS by Treaty, grant, usage, sufferance, and other lawful means, His Majesty the King possesses jurisdiction within the French and Spanish Zones of the Shereefian Empire:

And whereas by a convention signed at London on the 29th July, 1937, His Majesty has renounced such jurisdiction in the French Zone of the Shereefian Empire as from the 1st January, 1938, save as provided by Article 4 of the said convention with regard to cases instituted before the date of the entry into force of the said convention:

And whereas it is expedient that the Morocco Orders in Council 1889-1933 (Consolidated) should be repealed in their application to the said French Zone, save in so far as they should continue to be applied for the conclusion of cases instituted before the 1st January, 1938:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by virtue and in exercise of the powers in this behalf by the Foreign Jurisdiction Acts, 1890 and 1913, or otherwise in His Majesty vested, is pleased, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, to order and it is hereby ordered, as follows:—

1.—(1) This Order shall take effect on the 1st January, 1938, which date is hereinafter referred to as the commencement of this Order.

(2) The Consul-General shall forthwith, on the receipt by him from His Majesty's Principal Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs of a certified printed copy of this Order, cause printed copies of this Order to be affixed and exhibited conspicuously in the offices of every
