Thence in a straight line running due south for about 113 miles, passing Lingy Pits Moss, in the County of York, and Fair Snape Fell, in the County of Lancaster, to a point on the main road from Preston to Longridge situated south-east corner of Grimsargh Thence in a general southerly Reservoir. direction along the road past The Hermitage to the point where it crosses the Thirlmere Aqueduct at the road junction about ½ mile north-west of Elston. Thence following the Aqueduct in a south-south-easterly direction to the point where it is crossed by the main road from Preston to Hoghton about 600 feet southeast of Hoghton Railway Station.
