to break up private streets within the limits of supply for the purpose of supplying premises abutting on any such street; to empower the Corporation to make specifications in regard to the construction and placing of pipes, etc.; to relieve the Corporation from obligation to supply gas in such circumstances as may be defined in the Order; to enable the Corporation to compel consumers to repair fittings in cases of danger; to provide that fittings let for hire shall not be subject to distress and that such fittings shall continue to be the property of the Corporation although fixed to premises or to the soil thereunder; to make provision for the application of the proceeds from the sale or hire of fittings; to authorise the Corporation to require the placing of meters in positions approved by them; to empower the Corporation to inspect, take off, remove, test, repair and replace meters; to authorise the Corporation to levy and recover charges for special readings of meters; to empower the Corporation to prevent the improper use of gas and to cut off supplies of gas where charges due for gas supplied by the Corporation or apparatus let by the Corporation on hire or hire-purchase have not been paid; to make provision as to the mode of cutting off supplies of gas; and to confer on the Corporation the right to take licences for the use of patents.
