

interest or dividends in respect of any investments made or to be made by us of the rents and royalties received by us in accordance with the said new leases shall amount to the sum of £64 all further rents and royalties payable to us under the said new leases shall cease to be held or received by us for the benefit of the Incumbent of the said Benefice of Methley and shall be held or received by us for the benefit of our Common Fund to be applied as in the said Acts mentioned.

"And we further recommend and propose that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from making any other recommendations and proposals relating to the matters aforesaid or any of them in accordance with the provisions of the said Acts or Measure or of any of them or of any other Act of Parliament or of any other Measure of the National Assembly of the Church of England."

And whereas the Notice of the foregoing Scheme, which is required by the hereinbefore mentioned Acts, has been given by the said Commissioners to the Patron of the said Benefice of Methley, and such Patron has raised no objection to the said Scheme:

And whereas the said Scheme has been approved by His Majesty in Council:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His said Council, is pleased hereby to ratify the said Scheme, and to order and direct that the same and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the time when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Acts.

And His Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the said Diocese of Ripon.
