"(3) For Leading Seamen holding the nonsubstantive rating of Pilot, the requirement of having passed professionally for Petty Officer as a condition of the payment of increase of pay after one year's service in the substantive rating to be waived.

"(4) Ratings who are permitted to relinquish finally, or who on account of physical unfitness not due to their own misconduct, carelessness or neglect have to relinquish finally the non-substantive rating of Pilot, to be paid an allowance, to be known as 'Air Duty (Non-Flying) Allowance,' of 9d. a day. allowance to be discontinued in the event of a man qualifying subsequently for another nonsubstantive rating with equal or higher pay.

" (5) Ratings qualified as Pilot on ceasing to be available for full flying duties but remaining fit in all respects for such duties, to be paid, in addition to 'Air Duty (Non-Flying) Allowance 'an allowance to be known as 'Reserve Pilot Allowance' of 9d. a day for so long as they continue in active Naval service, subject to their having re-engaged to complete time for pension, continuing to be competent pilots and carrying out such periodical flying training as we may require.

WHEREAS it is, among other things, provided by subsection (1) of section eighteen of the Finance Act, 1923, as extended by section nine of the Finance Act, 1931, that if His Majesty in Council is pleased to declare-

(a) that any profits or gains arising from the business of air transport which are chargeable to British income tax are also chargeable to income tax payable under the law in force in any foreign state; and

(b) that arrangements, as specified in the declaration, have been made with the Government of that foreign state with a view to the granting of relief in cases where such profits and gains are chargeable both to British income tax and to the income tax

payable in the foreign state;

then, unless and until the declaration is revoked by His Majesty in Council, the arrangements specified therein shall, so far as they relate to the relief to be granted from British income tax, have effect as if enacted in that Act, but only if and so long as the arrangements, so far as they relate to the relief to be granted from the income tax payable in the foreign state, have the effect of law in the foreign state:

And whereas the arrangements contained in the Schedule to this Declaration have been made by His Majesty's Government in the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Northern Ireland with the German Government:

Now, therefore, His Majesty is pleased, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, to declare, and it is hereby declared-

(a) that certain profits or gains arising from the business of air transport which are chargeable to British income tax are also chargeable to the income tax payable under

the law in force in Germany; and

(b) that the arrangements contained in the said Schedule have been made with a view to the granting of relief in cases where profits or gains arising from the business of air transport are chargeable both to British income tax and to the income tax payable in Germany

And His Majesty is further pleased to order, and it is hereby ordered, that this Declaration may be cited as "The Relief from Double on Air Transport Income Tax

(Germany) Declaration, 1938.'

#### SCHEDULE.

AGREEMENT BETWEEN HIS MAJESTY'S GOVERN-MENT IN THE UNITED KINGDOM AND THE GOVERNMENT OF THE GERMAN REICH REGARD-ING THE EXEMPTION FROM TAXATION OF CERTAIN PROFITS ARISING FROM AIR TRANS-

The Government of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Northern Ireland and the German Government, being desirous of concluding an agreement for reciprocal exemption from taxation in certain cases of profits or gains arising from the business of air transport, by their Plenipotentiaries, viz.:.

His British Majesty's Ambassador Extraordinary and Plenipotentiary at Berlin, the Right Honourable Sir Nevile Henderson,

acting for the Government of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Northern Ireland;

The Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs, Hans Georg von Mackensen, and the Director in the Ministry of Finance of the Reich, Professor Dr. Otto Hedding,

acting for the German Government;

have agreed as follows:-

#### Article 1.

The Government of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Northern Ireland undertake that any profits or gains arising from the business of air transport carried on by an individual resident in Germany and not resident in the United Kingdom or by a company which manages and controls such business in Germany shall, so long as the exemption specified in Article 2 hereof remains effective, be exempted from Income Tax (including Surtax) chargeable in the United Kingdom for the year of assessment 1931-32 commencing on the 6th day of April, 1931, and for every subsequent year of assessment, and will take the necessary action under Section 18 of the Act of Parliament of the United Kingdom known as the Finance Act, 1923, as extended by Section 9 of the Act of Parliament of the United Kingdom known as the Finance Act, 1931, to profits or gains arising from the business of air transport, with a view to giving the force of law to the exemption aforesaid.

#### Article 2.

The German Government undertake that any profits or gains arising from the business of air transport carried on by an individual resident in the United Kingdom and not resident in Germany or by a company which manages and controls such business in the United Kingdom shall, so long as the exemption specified in Article I hereof remains effective, be exempted from Einkommensteuer and Körperschaftssteuer chargeable in Germany for periods subsequent to the 1st day of April, 1931, and will take the necessary action under Section 15 of the Reichsabgabenordnung with a view to giving the force of law to the exemption aforesaid.

## Article 3.

The expression "business of air transport" means the business carried on by an owner of aircraft, and for the purposes of this definition the expression "owner" includes any charterer.

#### Article 4.

This Agreement may be denounced at any time, subject to six months' notice being given by either contracting Government to the other.

#### Article 5.

This Agreement shall not require ratification and shall come into force immediately.

In witness whereof the respective Plenipotentiaries have signed the Agreement and affixed thereto their seals.

WHEREAS by the Northern Rhodesia (Crown Lands and Native Reserves) Order in Council, 1928 (hereinafter referred to as "the Principal Order"), His late Majesty King George the Fifth, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, was pleased to declare what land within Northern Rhodesia should be Crown Land and Native Reserves respectively and to confirm certain alienations of land within Northern Rhodesia:

And whereas it was further declared that the expression "Native Reserves" should mean the lands set apart by the Principal Order (and described in the Schedule thereto) for the sole and exclusive use of the natives of Northern Rhodesia and any lands which might thereafter be constituted Native Reserves by any Order in Council amending or adding to the Principal Order:

And whereas by the Northern Rhodesia Crown Lands and Native Reserves (Tanganyika District) Order in Council, 1929, the lands described in the Schedule thereto and known as Native Reserves, as also the appendant rights set forth in the said Schedule, were vested in the Secretary of State and set apart in perpetuity for the sole and exclusive use and occupation of the natives of Northern Rhodesia subject to the terms of Article 43 (as by the Principal Order amended) of the Northern Rhodesia Order in Council, 1924, and subject also to the provisions set out in Article 3 of the said Northern Rhodesia Crown Lands and Native Reserves (Tanganyika District) Order in Council, 1929:

And whereas it is expedient to amend the said Northern Rhodesia Crown Lands and Native Reserves (Tanganyika District) Order in

Council, 1929:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by virtue and in exercise of the powers by the Foreign Jurisdiction Act, 1890, or otherwise in His Majesty vested, is pleased, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, to order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:—

- r. This Order may be cited as the Northern Rhodesia Crown Lands and Native Reserves (Tanganyika District) Amendment Order in Council, 1938.
- 2. The Schedule to the Northern Rhodesia Crown Lands and Native Reserves (Tanganyika District) Order in Council, 1929, is hereby amended as follows:—
  - (a) by the deletion of the description of the Mambwe (Nsokolo) Reserve set out in item 5 of the said Schedule and the substitution therefor of the following description:
    - 5.—Mambwe (Nsokolo) Reserve.

#### Boundaries:

Commencing at Beacon W231, the south-western corner beacon of Farm No. 563, now No. T.22, the boundary follows the southern boundaries of this farm and Farms Nos. 564, now No. T.23, 565, now No. T.24, 566, now No. T.25, 567, now No. T.26, to the Kamuswadzi River; thence up the Kamuswadzi River to its source; thence in an easterly direction along the watershed between the Saisi and Chozi Rivers to Beacon B309 on Nausu Hill; thence in a straight line to the source of the Chisanzu Stream; thence down the Chisanzu Stream to the Chozi River; thence in a straight line to the junction of the Sansi Stream with the Itende River; thence up the Itende River to its source; thence in a straight line to Beacon B307 between the source of the Kayesuma Stream and the source of the Nyando Stream; thence in a straight line to Ponya Hill; thence in a straight line to the junction of the Kasinda Stream with the Mwambe Stream; thence down the Mwambe Stream to its junction with the Kasenda Stream; thence in a straight line to the source of the Kamalungu Stream; thence down the Kamalungu Stream to its junction with the Fiula Stream; thence up the Fiula Stream to its source; thence in a straight line to the source of the Tiswe Stream; thence down the Tiswe Stream to its junction with the Kabishya River; thence down the Kabishya River to its junction with the Munongo (Mwanamonga) Stream; thence up Munongo Stream to its source; thence in a westerly and southerly direction along the watershed between the Kabishya and Kaonya Rivers to the source of the Pambwe Stream; thence down the Pambwe Stream to its junction with the Kaonya River; thence down the Kaonya River to the Chambezi River; thence

up the Chambezi River to the Abercorn-Kasama motor road; thence in a northerly direction along the Abercorn-Kasama motor road to where the Masamba Stream crosses the road; thence eastwards to Beacon W231, the point of starting.

(b) by the deletion of the description of the Wemba (Makasa) Reserve set out in item 8 of the said Schedule and the substitution therefor of the following description:

8.—Wemba (Makasa) Reserve.

## Boundaries:

Commencing at the junction of the Songolwe Stream with the Chamfubu River, the boundary follows the Songolwe Stream to its source; thence in a northerly direction along the watershed between the Luombe and Losa Rivers to the source of the Losa River; thence in a straight line to the source of the Luela Stream; thence down the Luela Stream to its junction with the Chambezi River; thence up the Chambezi River to its junction with the Kaonya Stream; thence up the Kaonya Stream to its intersection with Parallel of Latitude 9° 30' South; thence eastwards along the said Parallel of Latitude to its point of intersection with the Luchewe River; thence down the Luchewe River to the Luwala Swamp; thence in a straight line in a south-westerly direction to the junction of the Mifunsu Stream with the Chambezi River; thence up the Chambezi River to the junction of the Chamfubu River; thence up the Chamfubu River to the point of starting.

Included within the boundaries as defined above but excluded from the Reserve:

Farm No. 1089, Rosa Mission, 420 acres in extent, situated on the left bank of the Losa River.

- 3. His Majesty, His Heirs and Successors, in Council, may at any time revoke, alter, add to, or amend this Order.
- 4. This Order shall come into operation forthwith and shall be published in the Northern Rhodesia Gazette and the Governor or other Officer for the time being administering the Government of Northern Rhodesia shall give directions for the publication of this Order at such places and in such manner and for such times as he thinks proper for giving due publicity thereto.

The following Statute made by the Governing Body of Merton College, in the University of Oxford, on the 12th day of February, 1938, has been submitted for the approval of His Majesty in Council, and notice of its having been so submitted is published in accordance with the provisions of "The Universities of Oxford and Cambridge Act, 1923."

#### MERTON COLLEGE, OXFORD.

AMENDMENT OF COLLEGE STATUTE.

At a Stated General Meeting held on 12th February, 1938, it was resolved that clause (2) of Statute X be deleted, and that the following clause be substituted for it:—

(1) Income to which this clause applies may be applied in or towards the payment of any charges for University purposes imposed on the College by any Statute or Statutes made for the University from time to time under the powers of the Universities of Oxford and Cambridge Act 1877 and the Universities of Oxford and Cambridge Act 1923 to the extent to which any such charges are so imposed in respect of any such income.

(2) This clause applies to income arising from any endowment benefaction, or trust, and applicable to the maintenance of any Fellowship, Scholarship, or Exhibition within the College, or to any other purpose for the benefit of the College or of the Head or any other member of the College, including any fund for the purchase of advowsons, in every case where

the endowment, benefaction, or trust
(a) was created by an instrument which
came into operation not less than 60 years
before the thirty-first day of December nineteen hundred and thirty-seven; or

(b) is included among the endowments, benefactions, or trusts specified in the schedule appended to this clause, the trustees or governing bodies whereof have consented to the provisions of this clause.

# ORDER OF THE REGISTRAR-GENERAL IN ENGLAND.

(Dated 21st January, 1938).

No. 3/1938.

Whereas the part of the superintendent registrar's district of Wisbech and the parts of certain of the sub-districts comprised therein which are situate outside the Administrative County of the Isle of Ely will on the 1st day of April, 1938, in consequence of and by virtue

of the Isle of Ely Registration Scheme, 1937, made by the County Council of the Isle of Ely and approved by the Minister of Health under Section 24 of the Local Government Act, 1929, become a separate superintendent registrar's district and sub-districts respectively;

And whereas it is expedient that on their becoming a separate superintendent registrar's district and sub-districts as aforesaid provision should be made for the division of the said superintendent registrar's district into two superintendent registrars' districts and for the union with certain other contiguous superintendent registrars' districts of the two superintendent registrars' districts so formed; and for the re-arrangement of sub-districts and the formation of a new sub-district;

And whereas it is necessary to transfer the functions under the Registration Acts in relation to the areas specified in the Schedule hereto:

Now, therefore, the Registrar-General of Births, Deaths and Marriages in England, in exercise of the powers conferred by Sections 10 and 11 of the Births and Deaths Registration Act, 1837, Section 21 of the Births and Deaths Registration Act, 1874, Section 21 (2) of the Local Government Act, 1929, and of all other powers in that behalf, with the approval and sanction of the Minister of Health, hereby orders as follows:—

- I.—(I) This Order may be cited as the Isle of Ely and Norfolk Registration of Births, etc., Order, 1938, and shall come into operation on the 1st day of April, 1938.
- (2) In this Order the term "district" means a superintendent registrar's district, and the terms "existing district" and "existing subdistrict" mean a district or sub-district which existed immediately prior to the 1st April, 1938.

- 2. The parishes specified in the first column of the Schedule hereto (being situate in the county specified in the second column thereof) shall be united with the districts specified in the third column thereof, and shall be added to and form part of or be constituted the subdistricts specified in the fourth column thereof.
- 3. The districts and sub-districts extended or constituted under Article 2 of this Order shall be designated by the names respectively appearing in the third and fourth columns of the said Schedule.
