STANMORE UNUSED BURIAL GROUND.

NOTICE is hereby given that application has been made to Parliament in the present Session by the Reverend Canon William Arthur Steains Hewett, the Rector of Stanmore in the County of Middlesex for an Act under the above name or short title, the full title of which is "An Act to provide for the removal of the restrictions attaching to certain land which is consecrated as a burial ground in the urban district of Harrow; to authorise the sale of such land and its use for building or otherwise; and for other purposes".

In accordance with the Standing Orders of Parliament a full notice containing a concise summary of the purposes of the Bill for the intended Act has been or will be published in the Stanmore Observer and Gazette of the 6th day of May, 1938 and the 13th day of May, 1938.
