become a New Parish, then of the said New Parish, and the nomination of the Minister or Incumbent thereof should be assigned in the manner which is hereinafter recommended and

proposed:

"And whereas the contributors of the said capital sum of £2,000 have nominated to us the Bishop for the time being of the said Diocese of Chichester as the person to whom they desire that the Patronage and right of nomination and presentation of and to the said District or New Parish of Saint Peter, Southwick, should be assigned, and we are satisfied that the said assignment may properly be effected:

" Now, therefore, we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, humbly recommend and propose that the whole right of Patronage of the said District of Saint Peter, Southwick, and when such District shall have become a New Parish, then of the said New Parish, and the nomination of the Minister or Incumbent thereto, shall without any conveyance or assurance in the law other than this Scheme and any duly gazetted Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying the same and upon and from the day of the date of the publication of such Order in the London Gazette be assigned to and be absolutely vested in and shall and may from time to time be exercised by the Right Reverend George, Bishop of Chichester, and by his successors in the same Bishopric for ever.

"And we further recommend and propose that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from recommending and proposing any other measures relating to the matters aforesaid or any of them in conformity with the provisions of the hereinbefore mentioned Act or of any other Act of Parliament."

And whereas the said Scheme has been approved by His Majesty in Council:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His said Council, is pleased hereby to ratify the said Scheme, and to order and direct that the same and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the time when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Acts.

And His Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the said Diocese of Chichester.

WHEREAS the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England have, in pursuance of the Act of the 5th and 6th years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, Chapter 108, and of the Act of the 21st and 22nd years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 57, which Acts are known as "The Ecclesiastical Leasing Acts" and of the Ecclesiastical Commissioners (Powers) Measure, 1936, duly prepared, and laid before His

Majesty in Council, a Scheme bearing date the 5th day of May, 1938, in the words and figures following that is to save

following, that is to say: -

"We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, in pursuance of the Act of the 5th and 6th years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, Chapter 108, and of the Act of the 21st and 22nd years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 57, which Acts are known as 'The Ecclesiastical Leasing Acts', and of the Ecclesiastical Commissioners (Powers) Measure, 1936, have prepared, and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council, the following Scheme relating to the Benefice of Darfield in the County of York and in the Diocese of Sheffield:

"Whereas the annual value of the said Benefice of Darfield has been improved under and by virtue of certain transactions affecting the glebe lands and minerals belonging to the said Benefice which transactions have been carried out under the authority of the said Acts, with the concurrence of us, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, by former Rectors or Incumbents of the said Benefice of Darfield and include three leases dated the 3rd day of April, 1913, the 27th day of July, 1916, and the 27th day of April, 1922 respectively, of certain seams of coal under the glebe lands of the said Benefice:

"And whereas the investments of the net proceeds of the said transactions made by us, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, in accordance with the provisions of the said Acts include (inter alia) a sum of £4,660 4s. 3d. India £3 per centum per annum Stock a sum of £4,327 2s. od. London County £3 per centum per annum Stock and a sum of £8,214 12s. 6d. £3½ per centum per annum Conversion Stock which sums of Stock are now held by us in trust to pay to the Rector or Incumbent for the time being of the said Benefice the annual interest or dividends from time to time arising or accruing therefrom or thereupon, but subject nevertheless to the provisions contained in the said Acts and Measure with respect to making a certain portion of the improved value arising to the said Benefice from the said transactions payable to us for the benefit of our Common Fund to be applied as in the said Acts mentioned:

"And whereas the improvement in the annual value of the said Benefice arising from or by means of the said transactions exceeds the annual sum of £600, and after the appropriation hereinafter recommended to us, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, for the benefit of our Common Fund, the average annual income of the said Benefice will still be considerably in excess of £600:

"And whereas the said Benefice of Darfield is now full, the Reverend Harold Drown being the Rector or Incumbent thereof:

"Now, therefore, we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, humbly recommend and propose that as from the day of the date at which the said Benefice of Darfield shall from whatsoever cause be next voided the aforesaid sums of £4,660 4s. 3d. India £3 per centum per annum Stock and £4,327 2s. od. London County £3 per centum per annum Stock, and a sum of £6,582 6s. Id. £3½ per centum per annum Conversion Stock (being a portion of the aforesaid sum of £8,214 12s. 6d. £3½ per centum per annum Conversion Stock) or any securities or
