

investments then representing such sums of Stock together with all the rents and royalties payable to us under the said leases which shall thereafter become due and be received by us under and by virtue of the said leases or of any renewal or renewals thereof or of any lease or leases which may hereafter be granted of the minerals included in the said leases or any part or parts thereof shall cease to be held or received by us for the benefit of the Rector or Incumbent of the said Benefice of Darfield and shall be held or received by us for the benefit of our Common Fund to be applied as in the said Acts mentioned.

"And we further recommend and propose that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from making any other recommendations and proposals relating to the matters aforesaid or any of them in accordance with the provisions of the said Acts or Measure or of any of them or of any other Act of Parliament or of any other Measure of the National Assembly of the Church of England."

And whereas the Notice of the foregoing Scheme, which is required by the hereinbefore mentioned Acts, has been given by the said Commissioners to the Patrons of the said Benefice of Darfield, and the said Patrons have not made any objection to the said Scheme:

And whereas the said Scheme has been approved by His Majesty in Council:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His said Council, is pleased hereby to ratify the said Scheme, and to order and direct that the same and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the time when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Acts.

And His Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the said Diocese of Sheffield.

WHEREAS the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England have, in pursuance of the Act of the 5th and 6th years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, Chapter 108, and of the Act of the 21st and 22nd years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 57, which Acts are known as "The Ecclesiastical Leasing Acts" and of the Ecclesiastical Commissioners (Powers) Measure, 1936, duly prepared, and laid before His Majesty in Council, a Scheme bearing date the 5th day of May, 1938, in the words and figures following, that is to say:—

"We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, in pursuance of the Act of the 5th and 6th years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, Chapter 108, and of the Act of the 21st and 22nd years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 57, which Acts are known as 'The Ecclesiastical Leasing Acts,' and of the Ecclesiastical Commissioners (Powers) Measure, 1936, have prepared, and now humbly lay

before Your Majesty in Council, the following Scheme relating to the Benefice of Brodsworth, in the County of York and in the Diocese of Sheffield:

"Whereas the annual value of the said Benefice of Brodsworth has been improved under and by virtue of certain transactions affecting the glebe lands and minerals belonging to the said Benefice, which transactions have been carried out under the authority of the said Acts by former Incumbents of the said Benefice of Brodsworth and include two leases dated the 15th day of April, 1915, and the 31st day of July, 1930, respectively of certain seams of coal under the glebe lands of the said Benefice:

"And whereas the investments of the net proceeds of the said transactions made by us, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, in accordance with the provisions in that behalf contained in the said Acts include (inter alia) a sum of £17,986 17s. 7d. £3 10s. per centum per annum Conversion Stock:

"And whereas the improvement in the annual value of the said Benefice arising from or by means of the said transactions exceeds the annual sum of £800 and after the appropriation hereinafter recommended to us, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, for the benefit of our Common Fund, the average annual income of the said Benefice will still be considerably in excess of £600:

"And whereas the said Benefice of Brodsworth is now full the Reverend Canon Fearnley Algernon Cyril Youens being the Vicar or Incumbent thereof:

"Now, therefore, we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, humbly recommend and propose, first, that as from the day of the date at which the said Benefice of Brodsworth shall from whatsoever cause be next voided, all the rents and royalties payable to us under the said leases which shall thereafter become due and be received by us under and by virtue of the said leases or of any renewal or renewals thereof or of any lease or leases which may hereafter be granted of the minerals included in the said leases or any part or parts thereof shall cease to be held or received by us for the benefit of the Vicar or Incumbent of the said Benefice of Brodsworth and shall be held and received by us for the benefit of our Common Fund to be applied as in the said Acts mentioned, and secondly, that as from the same date or from the date, if later, of the cessation of the yearly payment of £409 which became charged upon the revenues of the said Benefice in favour of the Church of England Pensions Board in trust for the Reverend George Frederick Tamplin upon his resignation from the said Benefice, a sum of £11,428 11s. 5d. £3 10s. per centum per annum Conversion Stock (forming part of the aforesaid sum of £17,986 17s. 7d. £3 10s. per centum per annum Conversion Stock) or any securities or investments then representing the said sum of £11,428 11s. 5d. £3 10s. per centum per annum Conversion Stock shall likewise cease to be held by us for the benefit of the Vicar or Incumbent of the said Benefice of Brodsworth and shall be held by us for the benefit of our Common Fund to be applied as in the said Acts mentioned.
