WHEREAS it is expedient that the West African Court of Appeal Orders in Council, 1928-35, Consolidated (in this Order referred to as "the consolidated Order") should be amended as hereinafter provided:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by virtue and in exercise of the powers in this behalf by the British Settlements Act, 1887, and the Foreign Jurisdiction Act, 1890, or otherwise in His Majesty vested, is pleased, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, to order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:—

1. This Order may be cited as "The West African Court of Appeal (Further Amendment) Order in Council, 1938," and shall be read and construed as one with the consolidated Order.

2. The following Section, to be numbered 5 (A), shall be inserted between Sections 5 and 6 of the consolidated Order:—

"5 (A). The Court of Appeal may sit in two or more divisions, and every Judge of the Court may sit in any division."

3. Section 9 (A) (2) of the consolidated Order shall be amended by inserting the words "and in respect of any application or matter incidental to a civil appeal which may be before the Court of Appeal before an appeal is pending" immediately after the words "pending before the Court of Appeal".

4. This Order shall commence and have effect on such day as may be fixed by notification in the London Gazette by one of His Majesty's Principal Secretaries of State.
