

Where the Certificate is in the form of a label, the recognition will apply only if the label is securely affixed to the meat or to the package containing the meat or meat product and if the label has not in any other circumstances or on any other occasion been used as an Official Certificate; and where the Certificate is in the form of a stamp, the recognition will apply only if the stamp is clearly impressed on the meat or the container, as the case may be.

SCHEDULE.

I.

COMMONWEALTH OF AUSTRALIA.

(1) For bacon, ham and other cured meat, a label or stamp having on it a design in either of the forms set out in Part II (1) of the Schedule to the Notice published in the London Gazette of the 15th March, 1938. The certificate will be completed by the addition of the signature of the Inspector.

(2) For canned meats and other meat products, a label or stamp having on it a design in either of the forms set out in Part II (3) and (4) of the Schedule to the Notice published in the London Gazette of the 15th March, 1938. The certificate will be completed by the addition of the signature of the Inspector.

II.

UNITED STATES OF BRAZIL.

(1) *For mutton, lamb, pork or goat in carcase form or as sides quarters or smaller cuts or pieces, a label or stamp of the following size and design:—



The certificate will be completed by the insertion of the number of the Establishment.

(2) *For all meat and meat products (where it is found more convenient to use a circular form of certificate) a label or stamp of the following size and design:—



The certificate will be completed by the insertion of the number of the Establishment.

*The labels or stamps hereby recognised as Official Certificates are in addition to the label or stamp of which particulars were given in Part III of the Schedule to the Notice published in the London Gazette of the 6th August, 1937.

III.

DOMINION OF CANADA.

For baled products, a waterproof tag having on it a design in the form set out below:—



The certificate will be completed by the insertion of the number of the Establishment.

This is the design referred to in the footnote to Part IV of the Schedule to the Notice published in the London Gazette of the 15th March, 1938.
