ORDER OF THE REGISTRAR-GENERAL IN ENGLAND.

(Dated 1st June, 1938.) No. 11/1938.

Whereas under Section II of the Births and Deaths Registration Act, 1837, the Registrar-General, with the approval of the Minister of Health, may divide any superintendent registrar's district into two or more superintendent registrars' districts;

And whereas it is expedient that the Barnsley superintendent registrar's district should be divided into two superintendent registrars' dis-

tricts;

Now, therefore, the Registrar-General of Births, Deaths and Marriages in England, in exercise of the powers conferred by Section II of the Births and Deaths Registration Act, 1837, Section 2I (2) of the Local Government Act, 1929, and of all other powers in that behalf,
