UNIVERSITIES OF OXFORD AND CAMBRIDGE ACT, 1923.

A STATUTE made by the Governing Body of Peterhouse, in the University of Cambridge, on the 6th June, 1938, amending Statute 69 of the College Statutes, has been submitted for the approval of His Majesty in Council, and notice of its having been so submitted is published in accordance with the provisions of "The Universities of Oxford and Cambridge Act, 1923."

TENDERS FOR TREASURY BILLS.

1. The Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury hereby give notice that Tenders will be received at the Bill Office, at the Bank of England, on Friday, the 24th June, 1938, at 1 o'clock, for Treasury Bills to be issued under the Treasury Bills Act, 1877, the National Debt Act, 1889, and the War Loan Acts, 1914-1919, to the amount of £45,000,000.

2. The Bills will be in amounts of £5,000 or £10,000. They will be dated at the option of the Tenderer on any business day from Monday, the 27th June, 1938, to Saturday, the 2nd July, 1938, inclusive, and will be payable at three months after date.

3. The Bills will be issued and paid at the Bank of England.

4. Each Tender must be for an amount not less than £50,000, and must specify the date on which the Bills required are to be dated, and the net amount per cent. (being an even multiple of one penny) which will be given for the amount applied for. Separate Tenders must be lodged for Bills of different dates.

5. Tenders must be made through a London Banker, Discount House or Broker.

6. The persons whose Tenders are accepted will be informed of the same not later than the following day, and payment in full of the amounts of the accepted tenders must be made to the Bank of England by means of Cash or a Banker's Draft on the Bank of England not later than 2 o'clock (Saturday 12 o'clock) on the day on which the relative Bills are to be dated.

7. In virtue of the provisions of Section 1 (4) of the War Loan Act, 1919, Members of the House of Commons are not precluded from tendering for these Bills.

8. Tenders must be made on the printed forms which may be obtained from the Chief Cashier's Office, Bank of England.

The Civil Service Commissioners hereby give notice that the following Regulations are published with the approval of the Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury, viz.:—

REGULATIONS FOR THE NORMAL RECRUITMENT BY OPEN COMPETITIVE SELECTION OF JUNIOR TECHNICAL ASSISTANTS (MALE) IN THE ROYAL MINT.

N.B.—These regulations are liable to alteration from time to time. It is anticipated that competitions, when required, will normally be held in the Spring of the year.

1. Candidates must have attained the age of 20 and must not have attained the age of 25 on the 1st March of the year in which the competition is held.

In reckoning age for this purpose a candidate may deduct any time, up to a maximum of two years, which he has spent in an approved works or in post-graduate research work in an

approved laboratory; and candidates who have served, or are serving, in the Navy, Army or Air Force may deduct from their actual age any time during which they have so served.

2. Every candidate must be a natural-born British subject, the child of a person who is or was at the time of death a British subject; provided that exception may be made in the case of natural-born British subjects who have satisfactorily completed a period of not less than five years' service on full pay in His Majesty's Regular Forces.

Provided also that if the Civil Service Commissioners are satisfied in the case of any candidate who is a British subject but does not fulfil all the requirements of the rule as to nationality and descent, that the candidate is so closely connected by ancestry and upbringing with His Majesty's dominions that an exception may properly be made to that rule, they may accept such candidate as eligible provided that this discretion shall not be exercisable unless (a) the father or the paternal grandfather of the candidate was a natural-born British subject, and (b) neither the father nor the paternal grandfather had acquired any other nationality by naturalisation or by any other voluntary and formal act.

3. Persons holding situations in the Civil Service must obtain the permission of the authorities of their Department to apply for appointment.

No person actually serving in the Navy, Army or Air Force will be eligible for consideration unless he produces, when called upon to do so, the permission of his Commanding Officer to apply for appointment, dated before his appearance before the Selection Board, and given in accordance with such orders as may from time to time be issued.

Persons upon whose training for the occupation of teacher public money has been spent cannot be appointed until the consent of the appropriate education authority has been notified to the Civil Service Commissioners.

4. Applications for admission to a competition for these appointments must be made at such time and in such manner as the Civil Service Commissioners may appoint; an application cannot be recorded until a competition has been announced.

5. The Civil Service Commissioners will take such steps as they think most appropriate to make known the existence of any vacancies which it may be desired to fill on any one occasion.

6. In order to be eligible for appointment a candidate must have passed an examination qualifying for a degree in mechanical or electrical engineering, preferably of Honours standard, or qualifications equivalent in the opinion of the Civil Service Commissioners. Higher National Certificates will not be regarded as equivalent to degrees.

7. When the list of applications in respect of a competition has been closed, the credentials of all the candidates will be examined by the Civil Service Commissioners, who may, if they so desire, invite the assistance of officers of the Royal Mint; and those candidates who appear to have the requisite qualifications and to be best fitted for appointment will be summoned to an interview before a Selection Board, who will recommend for the vacancies existing those candidates who appear to them to possess the highest qualifications. The decision of the

Selection Board will be final. The Board will be constituted by the Civil Service Commissioners in consultation with the authorities of the Royal Mint, who will be represented on the Board.

8. The appointment of selected candidates will be subject to their satisfying the Civil Service Commissioners of their eligibility in respect of age, nationality, health and character, and will not be confirmed unless and until they have passed the prescribed period of probation to the satisfaction of the Deputy Master of the Royal Mint.

9. A fee of 5s. will be required from every candidate applying for admission to a competition; this fee is not returnable in any circumstances. A further fee of £4 15s., being the balance of the prescribed fee of £5, will be required from every candidate selected for appointment, before the issue of the certificate of qualification for appointment.

COUNTY BOROUGH OF GRIMSBY.

BYELAWS AS TO SEAMEN'S LODGING-HOUSES
MADE IN PURSUANCE OF SECTION 214 OF THE
MERCHANT SHIPPING ACT, 1894.

Interpretation of terms.

1. In the construction of the following by-laws, unless the context otherwise requires, the following expressions have the meanings hereby assigned to them, that is to say—

"The Council" means the Mayor, Aldermen and Burgesses of the County Borough of Grimsby.

"The district" means the County Borough of Grimsby.

"Seaman" means any male person (other than the holder of a certificate of competency or service as Master, mate, or engineer, in the merchant service) who is ordinarily employed in any capacity whatsoever on board ship.

"Licence" means a licence granted, or which may be granted, by the Council in pursuance of these by-laws to a person authorising him to keep the house specified therein as a seamen's lodging-house.

"Keeper" means a person to whom a licence has been granted in pursuance of these by-laws.

"House" means a seamen's lodging-house.

Application for licence.

2. Every person who shall apply to the Council for a licence shall furnish, on the application form to be supplied by the Council, a true statement of the particulars therein required to be specified.

Penalty for false statement.

3. A person who, not being duly licensed; shall himself or by means of any agent or servant hold himself out as keeping or purporting to keep a house, shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding *twenty* pounds, and to a further penalty of *ten* pounds for every day during which he shall continue to do so after conviction for so doing.

Grant of licence.

4. A licence shall continue in force (subject to suspension or revocation as in these by-laws provided) for such period as the Council may determine, and shall be subject to such conditions specified therein or endorsed thereon, and not being inconsistent with the laws, by-laws, or regulations for the time being in force in the district, as the Council sees fit, and a

keeper, or any person employed in a licensed house, shall not commit a breach of, or fail to observe, such conditions.

Public-houses, beer-houses or clubs not to be licensed.

5. A house or part of a house which is in connection with any public-house, beer-house or club, in which intoxicating liquor is sold, shall not be licensed as a seamen's lodging-house.

Certain persons not to be licensed.

6. A licence shall not be granted to a person who holds a licence for the sale of intoxicating liquor, nor shall a licence be granted in respect of any house or part of a house where intoxicating liquor is sold, nor shall any keeper sell or be engaged or interested in the sale of intoxicating liquor, nor shall a licence be granted to any person who carries on the business of a dealer in fish, or of a clothier, or in respect of premises in which such businesses are carried on.

Register of licences.

7. The Council shall cause a register to be kept of all licences granted under these byelaws, and the suspension or revocation of any licence shall be noted in such register.

Notice to be affixed to licensed house.

8. A keeper shall affix and keep undefaced and legible a notice with the words "Licensed Seamen's Lodging-house" in the most conspicuous place on the outside of the main entrance from any street to the licensed house, and also the full name and address of the keeper.

Access to seamen's lodging-house and to register of lodgers.

9. A keeper and any person employed in a house shall at all times, by day or night, when required by an officer appointed by the Council for the inspection of seamen's lodging-houses, or by an officer of the Board of Trade, or of the Police, give him or them, or any of them free access to all parts of such house and to the register of seamen lodgers hereinafter referred to.

Number of lodgers.

10. A keeper shall not at any one time receive, cause, or suffer to be received into a house or into any room therein, a greater number of lodgers than shall be from time to time allowed by the certificate of the Town Clerk. Such certificate shall be supplied by the Council to the keeper, and he shall produce such certificate whenever required by any officer appointed by the Council for the inspection of the seamen's lodging-houses, or by an officer of the Board of Trade or of the Police.

11. A keeper shall fix and keep fixed in a conspicuous place in each room appointed for use as a sleeping apartment in a house, a ticket signed by the Town Clerk, stating the number of lodgers allowed to be received into such room, and a keeper and any person employed in a house shall not at any time conceal, deface, alter, or obliterate, or permit or suffer to be concealed, defaced, altered or obliterated, any letters or figures on such ticket.

12. Notwithstanding that the maximum number of lodgers to be received into a house or into any room therein may not have been fixed by the Council as hereinbefore provided, a keeper shall not cause or suffer a greater number of persons than will admit of the provision of forty square feet of floor space for each person to occupy at one time as a sleeping apartment a room which is used for that purpose.

13. Whenever the Council shall consider it necessary to reduce the number of lodgers to be received into any room in a house, the keeper shall, upon receiving notice in writing to that effect under the hand of the Town Clerk, cease to permit such room to be occupied by any greater number of lodgers than that specified in such notice. Upon receiving such notice, the keeper shall also surrender to the Town Clerk, for the purposes of cancellation, the certificate supplied by the Council to him under the provisions of Byelaw 10 hereof and the ticket signed by the Town Clerk referred to in Byelaw 11 hereof, and upon such surrender, the Council will supply to the keeper a new certificate and ticket for the purposes of the provisions of Byelaws 10 and 11 hereof.

Sleeping apartments.

14. A keeper shall not at any time cause or suffer any room which may be appointed for use as a kitchen, scullery, common room, or sitting room, or any underground room to be used as a sleeping apartment.

Ventilation.

15. A keeper shall cause all such means of ventilation as may be provided in or in connection with any room, passage or staircase in a house, and in, or in connection with, any water-closet or urinal belonging to a house to be maintained at all times in good order.

16. A keeper shall cause the windows of every room and of every passage, staircase and water-closet in a house to be kept fully open for such time on each day as may be necessary for the purposes of ventilation, and shall cause the windows of every room which may be appointed for use and occupation as a sleeping apartment to be kept fully open from 9 a.m. to 4 p.m. each day during the months of October, November, December, January, February, March and April, and from 9 a.m. to 6 p.m. each day during the months of May, June, July, August and September.

Provided that such keeper shall not be required in pursuance of this byelaw to cause any window in any room to be opened or to be kept open at any time when the state of the weather is such as to render it necessary that the window shall be closed, or when any bed in such room may be occupied by any lodger in consequence of sickness or other sufficient cause.

Cleansing.

17. A keeper shall, in the first week in the month of April, and in the first week in the month of October, in every year, cause every part of a house to be cleansed, and shall, at the same time, except as in such cases as are hereinafter specified, cause every area, the interior surface of every ceiling and wall of every sanitary convenience belonging to the premises, and the interior surface of every ceiling and wall of every room, staircase and

passage in the house, to be thoroughly stopped, cleansed, and lime-washed or distempered. Provided that if any such interior surface is painted or covered with material which is such as to render the lime-washing thereof unsuitable or inexpedient, this byelaw shall be deemed to be satisfied, so long as such surface is thoroughly cleansed and the paint or other covering thereon is renewed, if such cleansing or renewal be necessary for the purpose of keeping the house in a cleanly and wholesome condition.

18. A keeper shall, as often as may be necessary to keep the same in a clean and wholesome state, cause all the rooms, passages, stairs, floors, windows, doors, and walls of a house to be thoroughly cleansed and freed from vermin, and shall also cause the floors of every room to be thoroughly swept daily before the hour of ten in the forenoon, and to be well and sufficiently washed on Friday in each week before the hour of twelve noon.

19. A keeper shall cause all bed clothes and bedding and every bedstead used in a house to be thoroughly cleansed as often as shall be required for the purpose of keeping such bed clothes, bedding and bedsteads in a clean and wholesome condition and free from vermin.

Chamber utensils, facilities for personal cleansing and washing of clothing.

20. A keeper shall, for the use of the lodgers received into a house, cause to be provided a sufficient number of chamber utensils and a sufficient number of washing basins or other proper receptacles for water, of adequate capacity and suitably placed, and a sufficient supply of water, and adequate means of drainage to receive waste water, and a sufficient number of towels for use in connection with such washing basins and other receptacles and shall cause such basins or receptacles to be kept clean and in good order, and the supply of towels to be renewed as often as may be requisite.

Beds and bedding.

21. A keeper shall cause every room which may be appointed for use and occupation as a sleeping apartment in a house to be furnished with such number of beds and bedsteads and with such a supply of bedclothes as may be sufficient for the requirements of the number of lodgers authorised to be received into such room, and he shall cause every sleeping apartment to be furnished with bedsteads and bedding of a size adapted for one person only.

Food storage.

22. Where the lodgers board themselves, a keeper shall provide a sufficient number of separate ventilated lockers for the storage of food, and make suitable provision for the cooking of food.

Removal and storage of refuse.

23. A keeper shall cause all solid or liquid filth or refuse to be removed once at least in every day before the hour of ten in the forenoon from every room in the house, and shall once at least in every day cause every vessel, utensil, or other receptacle for such filth or refuse to be thoroughly cleansed. A keeper shall provide a sufficient number of ashbins of regulation size for the storage of refuse.

Infectious disease.

24. A keeper, immediately after he shall have been informed or shall have ascertained that any lodger in his house is suffering from any infectious disease shall—

(a) adopt all precautions necessary for preventing the spread of the disease;

(b) permit no other person, except a person in attendance on the lodger to use or occupy the same room as the lodger who is so suffering;

(c) immediately after the removal or recovery of the lodger, comply with all proper instructions of the Medical Officer of Health as to the cleansing and disinfection of the room occupied by the lodger and of any articles liable to retain the infection, and he shall not permit such room or such articles to be used by any other person until they have been cleansed and disinfected in accordance with such instructions.

Water-closets.

25. A keeper shall provide sufficient and proper water-closet accommodation in a suitable and convenient situation for the use of the lodgers in a seamen's lodging-house in the proportion of one such closet to every 12 or fractional part of 12 persons in a house authorised to receive not more than 24 persons; one to every 15 or fractional part of 15 persons in a house authorised to receive more than 24 and not more than 60 persons; one to every 20 or fractional part of 20 persons in a house authorised to receive more than 60 and not more than 100 persons; and one to every 25 or fractional part of 25 persons in a house authorised to receive more than 100 persons. He shall cause all water-closets in a house and every part of the apparatus of such water-closets, to be kept clean, and shall cause the same and every drain or means of drainage with which they or either of them may communicate, to be maintained in good order and efficient condition.

Maintenance of premises.

26. A keeper shall cause every part of the structure of a house to be maintained at all times in good order and repair.

27. A keeper shall cause the yard, area, forecourt, or other open space within the curtilage of a house to be maintained at all times in good order and thoroughly clean and free from any accumulation of filth or other refuse.

No female lodgers.

A keeper and every person employed in a house shall not receive any female lodger into such house.

Exclusion of persons of improper character.

29. A keeper and every person employed in a house shall not knowingly lodge, or knowingly harbour, any thief or reputed thief, any prostitute or reputed prostitute, or any other person of improper character.

Register of Lodgers, etc.

30. A keeper shall keep a register and shall enter therein the name, age, and nationality of every seaman lodger received into a house, the name of the last vessel from which such

seaman lodger was discharged, and the port of discharge, with the name and port of registry of any vessel he may join while resident in such house, and his declared destination on leaving.

Scale of Charges.

31. A keeper shall put up or affix and keep up or affixed a copy of these byelaws in a suitable and conspicuous position in the common sitting-room of a house, in such manner that the contents of such copy may be clearly and distinctly visible and legible, and shall enter upon the space left for the purpose at the foot of that copy a scale of the charge per day for board, lodging, and necessaries, made in such house, and shall not make a higher charge than is provided by the scale on any pretence whatever.

Licence may be Suspended or Revoked.

32. Upon the Council being satisfied that any keeper has been guilty of a breach of the Merchant Shipping Act, 1894, or the Acts amending the same, or of any offence under the Aliens Order, 1920, or that such keeper has kept, or is keeping or is allowing to be kept, a house in which drunkenness, gambling, opium smoking, or immoral or fraudulent practices prevail, or is or has been a party to such proceedings, or neglects to remove from such house any person of improper or immoral character who may have entered therein or has failed, or is failing to comply with these byelaws or any of them, the Council may suspend or revoke all licences granted to such keeper.

Officers not to be Obstructed.

33. No person shall obstruct any officer or person engaged in securing the execution of these byelaws.

Penalty.

34. Every person offending against any of the foregoing byelaws, except where otherwise expressly provided, shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding *ten* pounds for every such offence, and in the case of a continuing offence to a penalty of *five* pounds, for every day during which the offence may be continued after conviction for the first offence.

35. These byelaws shall come into force on the 1st day of July, 1938.
