## "THE FIFTH SCHEDULE.

"The territory to be dissevered from the said New Parish of Saint Andrew, Huddersfield, and to be annexed to the said New Parish of Saint John the Evangelist, Bay Hall, being:

"All that portion of the said New Parish of Saint Andrew, Huddersfield, which is bounded upon the north-east by the said New Parish of Saint John the Evangelist, Bay Hall, upon the west partly by the New Parish of the Holy Trinity, Huddersfield, and partly by the Parish of Huddersfield, both in the said County and Diocese, and upon the remaining side, that is to say, upon the south-east, by an imaginary line commencing at the point where the boundary which divides the said Parish of Huddersfield from the said New Parish of Saint Andrew, Huddersfield, crosses the middle of the said Manchester to Leeds Line of the London, Midland and Scottish Railway, and extending thence north-eastward along the middle of the said line of railway for a distance of 11 chains or thereabouts to the boundary which divides the said New Parish of Saint Andrew, Huddersfield, from the said New Parish of Saint John the Evangelist, Bay

And whereas drafts of the said Scheme or Representation have been transmitted to the Patrons and to the Incumbents of the Cures affected by the arrangements which are contemplated by such Scheme or Representation and such Patrons and Incumbents have, with the exception hereinafter mentioned, respectively signified their assent thereto:

And whereas one of the Patrons of the Vicarage of the said New Parish of Saint Andrew, Huddersfield, has not signified his assent to the said Scheme:

And whereas a period of more than one calendar month has elapsed since drafts of the said Scheme or Representation were transmitted to the said Patrons and Incumbents:

And whereas the said Scheme or Representation has been approved by His Majesty in Council:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His said Council, is pleased hereby to ratify the said Scheme or Representation, and to order and direct that the same and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the time when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Acts.

And His Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the said Diocese of Wakefield.

WHEREAS the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England have, in pursuance of the Act of the 5th and 6th years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, Chapter 108, and of the Act of the 21st and 22nd years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 57, which Acts are

known as the "Ecclesiastical Leasing Acts", and of the Ecclesiastical Commissioners (Powers) Measure, 1936, duly prepared, and laid before His Majesty in Council, a Scheme bearing date the 19th day of May, 1938, in the words and figures following, that is to say:—

say:—
"We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, in pursuance of the Act of the 5th and 6th years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, Chapter 108, and of the Act of the 21st and 22nd years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 57, which Acts are known as 'The Ecclesiastical Leasing Acts,' and of the Ecclesiastical Commissioners (Powers) Measure, 1936, have prepared, and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council, the following Scheme relating to the Benefice of Kelloe, in the County of Durham and in the Diocese of Durham:

"Whereas the annual value of the said Benefice of Kelloe has been improved by means of certain sales of portions of the glebe lands belonging to the said Benefice, which sales were effected under the authority of the said Acts by former Vicars or Incumbents of the said Benefice of Kelloe:

"And whereas the investments of the net proceeds of the said sales made by us, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, in accordance with the provisions in that behalf contained in the said Acts include (inter alia) a sum of £6,960 IIS. 8d. £3 IOS. per centum per annum Conversion Stock which sum of Stock is now held by us in trust to pay the Vicar or Incumbent for the time being of the said Benefice the annual interest or dividends from time to time arising or accruing therefrom or thereupon but subject nevertheless to the provisions contained in the said Acts and Measure with respect to making a certain portion of the improved value arising to the said Benefice from the said sales payable to us for the benefit of our Common Fund to be applied as in the said Acts mentioned:

"And whereas the improvement in the annual value of the said Benefice arising from or by means of the said sales exceeds the annual sum of £245 and after the appropriation hereinafter recommended to us, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, for the benefit of our Common Fund, the average annual income of the said Benefice will still be considerably in excess of £600:

"And whereas the said Benefice of Kelloe is now vacant:

"Now, therefore, we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, humbly recommend and propose that as from the day of the date of the publication in the London Gazette of any Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this Scheme the said sum of £6,960 IIs. 8d. £3 Ios. per centum per annum Conversion Stock or any securities or investments then representing the said sum of Stock shall cease to be held by us for the benefit of the Vicar or Incumbent of the said Benefice of Kelloe and shall be held by us for the benefit of our Common Fund to be applied as in the said Acts mentioned.

"And we further recommend and propose that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from making any other recommendation and proposal relating to the matters aforesaid or any of them in accordance with the provisions of
