#### RULES PUBLICATION ACT, 1893.

#### ROAD TRAFFIC ACTS, 1930 TO 1934.

The Minister of Transport hereby gives notice under the Rules Publication Act, 1893, that he proposes after the expiry of at least forty days from this date in pursuance of the power conferred upon him by the Road Traffic Acts, 1930 to 1934, to make Regulations amending the Traffic Signs (Pedestrian Crossings) (No. 2) Provisional Regulations, 1934, to provide that the prescribed distance between lines placed on the carriageway to indicate a crossing place shall be measured from the outside edges of such lines.

And notice is hereby further given that on account of urgency the Minister has under Section 2 of the Rules Publication Act, 1893, made the Traffic Signs (Pedestrian Crossings) (Amendment) Provisional Regulations, 1938, to come into force forthwith as Provisional Regulations and to continue in force until Statutory Rules have been made in accordance with the provisions of Section 1 of that Act.

#### ELECTRICITY (SUPPLY) ACTS, 1882 TO 1936.
