"Whereas by Section 3 of the Naval and Marine Pay and Pensions Act, 1865, it is enacted *inter alia* that all pay, pensions or other allowances in the nature thereof payable in respect of services in Your Majesty's Naval or Marine Force to a person being or having been an Officer, Seaman or Marine therein shall be paid in such manner and subject to such restrictions, conditions and provisions as are from time to time directed by Order in Council:

"And whereas by Order in Council bearing date the 8th day of June, 1937, sanction was given *inter alia* to the establishment of a branch of Photographer ratings on a substantive basis with pay at the rates set out in Schedule I thereto:

"And whereas we consider that the rates of pay at present provided for Photographer ratings are inadequate for men who are capable of performing efficiently air photographic duties:

"We beg leave humbly to recommend that Your Majesty may be graciously pleased, by Your Order in Council, to sanction, for ratings of the Photographer branch when they have qualified in air photographic work, the rates of pay set out in the accompanying Schedule, being a general increase of threepence a day.

"The Lords Commissioners of Your Majesty's Treasury have signified their concurrence in this proposal.

"PHOTOGRAPHER BRANCH—SUBSTANTIVE PAY FOR MEN QUALIFIED IN AIR PHOTOGRAPHIC WORK.

And whereas by the Act it is further enacted that any such Order in Council may contain such supplemental, incidental and consequential provisions as appear to His Majesty in Council to be necessary or proper for the purposes of the Order and may be revoked or varied by a

subsequent Order:

And whereas in pursuance of the Act His late Majesty King George the Fifth in Council was pleased to make Orders on the fifth day of October, 1934 (S.R. & O. 1934 (No. 1132) I, p. 870), and on the fifteenth day of July, 1935 (S.R. & O. 1935 (No. 677) p. 730), and His former Majesty King Edward the Eighth in Council was pleased to make Orders on the third day of March, 1936 (S.R. & O. 1936 (No. 193) I, p. 1531), and the twenty-fourth day of March, 1936 (S.R. & O. 1936 (No. 302) I, p. 1532):

Now, therefore, His Majesty is pleased, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, to order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:—

1. Juvenile courts for the metropolitan police court area shall sit in the places specified in

the first column of the Schedule hereto and the division assigned to each place shall be that portion of the said area which is specified in the second column of the Schedule:

Provided that a juvenile court may sit at any time in case of emergency in a magistrate's room at Bow Street Police Court for the purpose of hearing cases arising in any part of

the metropolitan police court area.

2. Juvenile courts sitting at the places specified in the first column of the Schedule hereto shall be held on the days and at the hours specified in the third column of the Schedule or on such other days and at such other hours as may from time to time be approved by the Secretary of State:

Provided that-

(i) a juvenile court which would in pursuance of the foregoing provision be held on a day when the metropolitan police courts are closed may be held on the preceding day; and

(ii) a juvenile court may hold additional sittings at such times as may be necessary

for the business of the court.

- 3. The justices of the peace for the county of London who are to sit at the several sittings of the juvenile courts shall be selected by the panel of justices nominated by the Secretary of State and by the metropolitan police magistrates nominated by the Secretary of State to act as chairmen of juvenile courts within the metropolitan police court area.
- 4.—(1) This Order may be cited as the Juvenile Courts (Metropolitan Police Court Area) Order, 1938, and shall come into force on the first day of July, 1938.
- (2) The Orders in Council made in pursuance of the Act on the fifth day of October, 1934 (S.R. & O. 1934 (No. 1132) I, p. 870), the fifteenth day of July, 1935 (S.R. & O. 1935 (No. 677) p. 730), the third day of March, 1936 (S.R. & O. 1936 (No. 193) I, p. 1531), and twenty fourth day of March, 1936 (S.R. & O. 1936 (No. 302) I, p. 1532), are hereby revoked.

And whereas by an Order in Council made on the 22nd day of October, 1937, in pursuance of the above recited powers, the engineering establishment which might be maintained by the Corporation of the Trinity House of Deptford Strond (hereinafter referred to as "the Corporation"), being one of the General

Lighthouse Authorities referred to in the Merchant Shipping Act, 1894, and the amount of the salaries to be paid out of the General Lighthouse Fund in respect of the said establishment were (among other things) duly fixed:

WHEREAS by Section 214 of the Merchant Shipping Act, 1894 (57 & 58 Vict. c. 60) it is provided that a local authority, whose district includes a seaport, may, with the approval of the Board of Trade, make byelaws relating to seamen's lodging houses in their district, and that those byelaws shall be binding upon all persons keeping houses in which seamen are lodged, and upon the owners thereof and persons employed therein; and further that such byelaws shall, amongst other things, provide for the licensing, inspection, and sanitary conditions of seamen's lodging houses, for the publication of the fact of a house being licensed, for the due execution of the byelaws, for preventing the obstruction of persons engaged in securing that execution, for the preventing of persons not duly licensed holding themselves out as keeping or purporting to keep licensed houses, and for the exclusion from licensed houses of persons of improper character, and shall impose sufficient fines, not exceeding fifty pounds, for the breach of any byelaw; and further, that whenever His Majesty in Council orders that in any district or any part thereof, none but persons duly licensed in pursuance of byelaws under the said Section shall keep seamen's lodging houses or let lodgings to seamen from a date therein named, a person acting in contravention of that Order shall for each offence be liable to a fine not exceeding one hundred pounds:

And whereas the Council of the County Borough of Grimsby (hereinafter called "the Council") is the local authority in the County Borough of Grimsby and a local authority within the meaning of the said Section:

And whereas the Council have, with the approval of the Board of Trade, made Byelaws to come into force on the 1st day of July, 1938:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, is pleased to order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:—

I. None but persons duly licensed in pursuance of the said Byelaws which come into force on the 1st day of July, 1938, or of Byelaws for the time being in force in substitution for or in modification or variation of or in addition to such Byelaws, shall keep seamen's lodging houses or let lodgings to seamen in the district of the Council, including the seaport of Grimsby or in any part thereof.

2. This Order may be cited as the Merchant Shipping (Grimsby Seamen's Lodging-houses Keepers) Order, 1938.

And whereas by subsection (3) of Section 2 of the Weights and Measures Act, 1936 (26 Geo. 5 & I Edw. 8 c. 38) it is enacted that every receptacle (whether forming part of a vehicle or not) which, for the purpose of trade, is used or intended to be used in measuring sand or ballast by the cubic yard shall, subject as thereinafter provided, be deemed for the purposes of the Weights and Measures Acts, 1878 to 1926, to be a measure:

And whereas the Board of Trade have represented to His Majesty that it would be expedient further to vary the Principal Order and to specify new fees to be paid on the verification and stamping of receptacles deemed

to be measures as aforesaid, which said receptacles are hereinafter referred to as sand and ballast measures:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by virtue of the powers vested in Him as aforesaid and of all other powers enabling Him in that behalf, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, is pleased to order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:—

- 1. This Order may be cited as the Weights and Measures (Verification and Stamping Fees) Order, 1938, and shall come into force on the 1st July, 1938.
- 2. The fees specified in the Schedule hereto shall be paid in respect of the verification and stamping of the sand and ballast measures mentioned in the said Schedule.
- 3. The fees specified in the Schedule hereto shall likewise be paid in respect of any sand and ballast measure which on verification is found to be incorrect or defective.

WHEREAS by the Colonial Naval Defence Act, 1931 (hereinafter referred to as "the Act") it is enacted that the legislature of any colony may, with the approval of His Majesty in Council, make provision for maintaining and using vessels of war; and that where the legislature of any colony has made provision for raising a force for the naval defence of the colony within its territorial waters, that legislature may, with the approval of His Majesty in Council, further make such provision regarding the discipline and service of officers and men of that force as is set out in the Act:

And whereas by the Act it is further provided that His Majesty in Council may, on such conditions as He thinks fit, authorise the Admiralty to accept any offer made by the Government of a colony to place at His Majesty's disposal for general service in the Royal Navy vessels of war maintained, or officers or men of such force as aforesaid raised, by the colony:

And whereas by the Nigeria Naval Defence Force Ordinance, 1937, of the Legislature of Nigeria provision has been made for raising a force for the naval defence of Nigeria called the Nigeria Naval Defence Force (hereinafter referred to as "the Force"):

Now, therefore, His Majesty, in exercise of the powers vested in Him by the above recited provisions, is pleased, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, to order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:—

1. This Order may be cited as "The Nigeria Naval Defence Order, 1938".

2. Approval is hereby given to the exercise by the Legislature of the colony of Nigeria of the power contained in Section I of the Act, to make provision at the expense of the colony for maintaining and using vessels of war.

3. The Admiralty is hereby authorised to accept any offer made by the Government of Nigeria to place at His Majesty's disposal for general service in the Royal Navy any vessel of war so maintained, provided that, as regards any such vessel maintained by the colony of Nigeria in conjunction with any other colony, a like offer is made by such last mentioned colony.

4. Approval is hereby given to the exercise by the Legislature of the colony of Nigeria of the powers contained in Subsection (1) of Section 2 of the Act, namely, to provide that officers and men of the Force—

(a) shall, whether serving ashore or afloat or within or without the limits of Nigeria, be subject to all the enactments and regulations for the time being in force for the enforcement of discipline in the Royal Navy, with such modifications and adaptations as may be made by the Legislature to adapt those enactments and regulations to the circumstances of Nigeria;

(b) shall be liable to service and training in any ship, establishment or other place without the limits of Nigeria, whether belonging to Nigeria or not;

(c) shall, in the case of officers or men entered on the express terms of accepting general service in the Royal Navy in emergency, form part of the Royal Naval Reserve or of the Royal Naval Volunteer Reserve, or that some shall form part of the Royal Naval Reserve and others of the Royal Naval Volunteer Reserve.

5. The Admiralty is hereby authorised to accept any offer made by the Government of Nigeria to place at His Majesty's disposal for general service in the Royal Navy any officers and men of the Force.

WHEREAS by the Northern Rhodesia (Legislative Council) Order in Council, 1924 (hereinafter referred to as the Principal Order), as amended by the Northern Rhodesia (Legislative Council) Amendment Order in Council, 1929, and the Northern Rhodesia (Legislative Council) Amendment Order in Council, 1937, provision is made for the constitution of the Legislative Council of Northern Rhodesia:

And whereas it is expedient to make other provision than in the said recited Orders is contained with regard to the composition of the

said Legislative Council:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by virtue and in exercise of the powers in that behalf by the Foreign Jurisdiction Act, 1890, or otherwise in His Majesty vested, is pleased by and with the advice of His Privy Council, to order, and it is hereby ordered as follows:

1. This Order may be cited as "The Northern Rhodesia (Legislative Council) Amendment Order in Council, 1938."

2. The Northern Rhodesia (Legislative Council) Amendment Order in Council, 1929, and Articles 3, 5 and 8 to 11 inclusive of the Principal Order are hereby revoked, without prejudice to anything lawfully done thereunder, and the following articles shall be substituted for the said Articles:—
"3. The Council shall consist of the

Governor as President, five ex-officio Members, Nominated Official Members not exceeding three in number, one Nominated Unofficial Member to represent the interests of the Native community, and seven Elected

Unofficial Members."

'5. The Nominated Official Members of the Council shall be such persons holding office of emolument in the service of the Crown in the Territory as His Majesty may from time to time appoint by any Instruction or Warrant under His Sign Manual and Signet, or as the Governor in pursuance of Instructions from His Majesty through a Secretary of State may from time to time appoint under the Public Seal of the Territory. They shall hold their places in the Council during His Majesty's pleasure and shall in any case vacate their seats at the next dissolution of the Council after their appointment, but may be reappointed.

If any Nominated Official Member of the Council ceases to hold office of emolument in the service of the Crown in the Territory, his seat in the Council shall become vacant.

"8. The Members of the Council shall take precedence as His Majesty may specially assign, and in default thereof, first the ex officio Members in the order in which their respective offices are named in Article 4 of this Order; secondly, the Nominated Official Members according to the priority of their respective appointments, or if appointed by the same Instrument according to the order in which they are named therein; thirdly, the Elected Unofficial Members and Nominated Unofficial Member according to the length of time during which they have been continuously Members of the Council, Members elected or appointed at the same general election, or on the same day at any other time, taking precedence amongst themselves accord-

ing to the alphabetical order of their names:

Provided that in determining whether during any time any person has been continuously a Member of the Council, the interval between a dissolution of the Council and the first meeting thereafter shall be dis-

regarded."

(1) Whenever any person shall be lawfully discharging the functions of more than one of the offices the holders of which are ex officio Members of the Council, the Governor may by an Instrument under the Public Seal of the Territory appoint some other person holding office of emolument in the service of the Crown in the Territory to be provisionally a Member of the Council for so long as the functions of the said offices continue to be discharged by one person as

aforesaid,
(2) Whenever any Nominated Member of the Council shall die, or whenever the seat of any such member shall become vacant from any cause other than the dissolution of the Council, or whenever any such member shall be suspended from the exercise of his functions as a Member of the Council, or be

declared by the Governor by an Instrument under the Public Seal of the Territory to be incapable of exercising his functions as a Member of the Council, or be absent from the Territory, or, being a Nominated Unofficial Member shall be appointed temporarily to an office of emolument in the service of the Crown in the Territory, the Governor may, by an Instrument under the Public Seal, appoint in his place some other fit person within the Territory and eligible to be appointed under Article 5 or Article 7 of this Order as the case may be, to be provisionally a Member of the Council.

- (3) Every person shall hold his place in the Council during His Majesty's pleasure, and every such provisional appointment may be revoked by the Governor by any such Instrument as aforesaid."
- "10. Subject to the provisions of the preceding Article, every person so provisionally appointed shall be to all intents and purposes a Nominated Official Member or Nominated Unofficial Member of the Council, as the case may be, until his appointment shall be superseded by a definitive appointment, or until the person in whose place he has been appointed shall be relieved from suspension, or declared by the Governor by an Instrument under the Public Seal to be capable of exercising his functions as a Member of the Council, or shall return to the Territory or shall cease to hold a temporary appointment as aforesaid."
- "II. The Governor shall forthwith report to His Majesty, through a Secretary of State, every provisional appointment of any person as a Member of the Council."
- 3. The following Article shall be inserted in the Principal Order immediately after Article 6 thereof:—
 - "7. The Nominated Unofficial Member to represent the interests of the native community shall be such person not holding any office of emolument in the service of the Crown in the Territory as His Majesty may from time to time appoint by any Instruction or Warrant under His Sign Manual and Signet, or as the Government in pursuance of Instructions from His Majesty, through a Secretary of State may from time to time appoint under the Public Seal of the Territory. He shall hold his place in the Council during His Majesty's pleasure and shall in any case vacate his seat at the next dissolution of the Council after his appointment, but may be reappointed."
- 4. Article 12 of the Principal Order shall be numbered as paragraph (1) of that Article and the following paragraph shall be added thereto:—
 - "(2) If any Nominated Member of the Council shall—
 - (a) be removed by the Governor from the exercise of his functions as a Member of the Council, or
 - (b) resign his seat in the Council by writing under his hand addressed to the Governor and his resignation shall be accepted by the Governor, or
 (c) being a Nominated Unofficial Mem-

(c) being a Nominated Unofficial Member be appointed permanently to an office of emolument in the service of the Crown in the Territory,

his seat in the Council shall thereupon become vacant."

5. His Majesty, His Heirs and Successors in Council may from time to time revoke, add to, alter or amend this Order.

6. This Order shall come into operation on a date to be fixed by the Governor by Proclamation in the Northern Rhodesia Government Gazette, and shall be published in the said Gazette.

"Whereas the Right Reverend Francis, now Bishop of Bath and Wells, is desirous that certain improvements should be made at the said Episcopal House of Residence and has submitted to us the particulars of such improvements and we have specified our general approval of the same:

"And whereas the said Bishop is also desirous and it appears to us to be expedient that towards the cost of effecting the aforesaid improvements a sum of £120 (being a sum which together with the outstanding balance of the sum already borrowed under the authority of the statutes hereinbefore mentioned for effecting improvements at the said Episcopal House of Residence does not exceed two years' income of the See) should be provided by way of advance from us, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, to be repaid out of the emoluments of the Bishopric of Bath and Wells:

"Now, therefore, with the consent of the said Francis, Bishop of Bath and Wells (testified by his having affixed his signature and Episcopal Seal to this Scheme), we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, humbly recommend and propose that the said Bishop be authorised to borrow and that we be authorised to advance and pay to him a sum of £120, and that the whole or any part or parts of the said sum of £120 so to be advanced shall be applied by us at such time or times and in such manner as shall appear to us to be expedient towards effecting the said proposed improvements at the Episcopar

Residence aforesaid, and that such sum of £120 shall be repaid with interest thereon as hereinafter mentioned, in the manner following, that is to say, during the period of ten years from the day of the date of the publication in the London Gazette of any Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this Scheme, the said Bishop or his successors shall at the end of each year pay to us, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, one tenth part of the said principal sum of £120 and shall also at the end of each year pay interest at the rate of £4 per centum per annum on the said principal sum or on so much thereof as shall from time to time remain unpaid or alternatively it shall be permissible for us, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, to provide for the repayment of the said sum of £120 and interest thereon or on outstanding balances as aforesaid by way of a yearly deduction during the said period of ten years from the annual sum payable by us to the said Bishop of Bath and Wells and his

successors.

"And we further recommend and propose contained shall prevent us from recommending and proposing any other measures relating to the matters aforesaid or any of them in conformity with the provisions of the herein named Acts or of either of them or of any other Act of Parliament."

And whereas the said Scheme has been

approved by His Majesty in Council:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His said Council, is pleased hereby to ratify the said Scheme, and to order and direct that the same and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the time when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette pursuant

His Majesty The KING has been graciously pleased to award the Edward Medal in Silver to Harold Gleave, in recognition of his gallantry in the following circumstances:—

At about eleven o'clock at night on the 18th April, 1938, at Bank Quay Railway Station, Warrington, a passenger named Gaughan fell from No. 1 platform and lay across the nearest rail in the path of an incoming train, then about 150 yards away and still travelling at a fair speed.

Gleave was then on No. 3 platform. Hearing shouts of persons on No. 1 he rushed to that platform, crossing some railway lines and No. 2 platform, a distance of about 35 yards. When he arrived, the train was only about 20 yards from where Gaughan was lying and it appeared obvious that it could not be stopped in that distance. It was then travelling about 5 miles an hour, that is, at the rate of 22 yards in 9 seconds.

Another porter, James Topping, endeavoured to jump down on to the rails to rescue Gaughan, but was held back by passengers. Gleave, coming up behind him, jumped down, swung Gaughan's body on to the way between the rails so that the train might pass above him, and then endeavoured to scramble out of the path of the train, but was struck by it. Fortunately he was thrown clear; but he did not escape without some injuries. Gaughan was also injured.

was also injured.

After the train had come to a standstill Gleave, notwithstanding his injuries, assisted in the work of extricating Gaughan.

Gleave displayed conspicuous initiative, presence of mind and courage in rescuing Gaughan from almost certain death at imminent risk to his own life.
