The KING has been graciously pleased to approve of the Award of the Medal of the Military Division of the Most Excellent Order of the British Empire to the undermentioned:—

For Gallantry.

Rais Rachid Abdul Fattah, Trans-Jordan Frontier Force.

At dusk on the 1st March, 1938, this officer was ordered to make a dismounted attack with his troop on a strongly-held village. The attack involved house-to-house fighting under heavy fire, and Rais Rachid Abdul

Fattah, by his exceptional qualities of leadership and coolness, succeeded in capturing the village.

Later, on the 4th March, the same officer with his troop, advanced to attack another village. He was heavily fired on, but by exceptional resource and bold leadership, was able to seize a hill close to the village.

The success of these two actions with such a small detachment was entirely due to this officer's outstanding example, tactical skill, leadership and courage.

He has on many previous occasions shown gallant and courageous conduct when leading troops against armed bands.
