SPEED LIMITS IN THE LONDON TRAFFIC AREA.

WE, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, in consideration of a benefaction of Seven hundred pounds which has been duly secured for the spiritual benefit of the Parish and Benefice of Bramber with Botolphs, in the County of Sussex and Diocese of Chichester, in respect of which benefaction we have undertaken to pay out of our Common Fund to the Incumbent for the time being of the said Benefice and to his Successors, Incumbents of the same Benefice, a yearly sum of Twenty-one pounds subject to the conditions hereinafter mentioned, do hereby, in pursuance of the Act of the 29th and 30th years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, chapter III, section 5, grant, subject as hereinafter mentioned, out of our Common Fund to the Incumbent for the time being of such Benefice, and to his successors, one yearly sum or stipend of Twenty-one pounds, such yearly sum or stipend to be calculated as from the 26th day of August, 1937, and to be payable in four equal quarterly portions on the 1st day of February, the 1st day of May, the 1st day of August and the 1st day of November in each and every year. Provided that so long as the said Benefice shall be held in plurality with the Benefice of Upper Beeding, in the said county and diocese, the said yearly sum or stipend so granted and the said yearly sum payable in respect of the benefaction aforesaid shall be payable only upon the production to us on or after each of the said quarterly days of payment of a certificate (in such form as may be required by us) under the hand of the Bishop of the Diocese in which the Benefice is situate certifying that during the quarter then ended, there has been employed both within the Parish of Bramber with Botolphs and within the Parish of Upper Beeding and duly licensed by such Bishop an Assistant Curate serving such Parishes and in receipt of a stipend after a rate of not less than £120 per annum.
