“We beg leave humbly to recommend that Your Majesty may be graciously pleased, by Your Order in Council, to sanction the increase of pay accordingly, effect to be given from a date to be determined by us.

“The Lords Commissioners of Your Majesty's Treasury have signified their concurrence in the above proposal.”

WHEREAS by section 8 of the Air Force (Constitution) Act, 1917 (7 & 8 Geo. 5. c. 31), it is enacted that:—

(1) for the purpose of the administration of matters relating to the Air Force and to the defence of the realm by air there shall be established an Air Council consisting of one of His Majesty's Principal Secretaries of State, who shall be President of the Air Council, and of other members who shall be appointed in such manner and subject to such provisions as His Majesty may, by Order in Council, direct.

(2) His Majesty may, by Order in Council, make provision with respect to the proceedings of the Air Council and the manner in which the business of the Council is to be distributed among the members thereof:

And whereas His Majesty, by Order in Council dated the 29th day of March, 1935 (S.R. & O. 1935 (No. 303) p. 97), made provision with respect to the constitution of the Air Council and the manner of the appointment of the members thereof:

And whereas by section 14 of the Air Force (Constitution) Act, 1917, Orders in Council made under that Act may be varied and revoked by subsequent Orders in Council:

And whereas it is expedient to make provision for the re-constitution of the Air Council: Now, therefore, His Majesty is pleased, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, to order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:—

(1) The Air Council shall consist of the following members, that is to say:—

One of His Majesty's Principal Secretaries of State who shall be President of the Air Council.

The Parliamentary Under-Secretary of State for Air.

The Chief of the Air Staff.

The Air Member for Personnel.

The Air Member for Development and Production.

The Air Member for Supply and Organization.

The Permanent Under-Secretary of State for Air.

(2) Of the members of the Air Council (other than the President) the Chief of the Air Staff shall be appointed by His Majesty and the other members shall be appointed by the Secretary of State.

(3) There may be included in the Air Council such additional members (if any) not exceeding two, as may be appointed by the Secretary of State.

(4) The Secretary of State is to be responsible to His Majesty and Parliament for all the business of the Air Council.

All business, other than business which the Secretary of State specially reserves to himself, is to be transacted in the following principal divisions:—

(a) The Parliamentary Under-Secretary of State for Air to be Vice-President of the Air Council and to be responsible to the Secretary of State for so much of the business of the Air Council as may be assigned to him from time to time by the Secretary of State.

(b) The Chief of the Air Staff, who shall be the first and Senior Air Member of Council and principal adviser of the Secretary of State in the direction of the Air Force, the Air Member for Personnel, the Air Member for Development and Production, and the Air Member for Supply and Organization, to be responsible to the Secretary of State for the administration of so much of the business of the Air Council relating to the command, disposition, organization, personnel, training, equipment, armament and maintenance of the Air Force as may be assigned to them, or each of them, from time to time by the Secretary of State.

(c) The Permanent Under-Secretary of State for Air, in relation to the Air Council and concurrently with his corresponding duties in respect of the general business of the Air Ministry, to be responsible for such duties discharged by the Air Council as are not assigned to other members of Council; for financial advice and, as Accounting Officer, for the control of all expenditure; for the general conduct of correspondence, the direction of the organization and the co-ordination and furtherance of the business of the Air Council; and also to be designated Secretary of the Air Council and as such charged with the preparation of all official communications of the Council.

(5) Subject to the foregoing provisions, the powers and duties of the Air Council may be exercised and performed by any three of their number and notwithstanding that any office, the holder of which is a member of the Air Council, is temporarily vacant, provided, however, that documents may be signed on behalf of the Air Council by any two members of the Air Council.

(6) This Order in Council shall be substituted for the Order in Council dated the 29th day of March, 1935.

WHEREAS by section 20 of the Finance Act, 1894, as modified by Article 14 of the Government of Ireland (Adaptation of the Taxing Acts) Order, 1922, and by Article 2 of the Irish Free State (Consequential Adaptation of Enactments) Order, 1923, it is enacted that His Majesty the King may, by Order in Council, apply that section, to any British possession where His Majesty is satisfied that by the law of such possession either no duty is leviable in respect of property situate in Great Britain when passing on death or that the law of such possession as respects any duty so leviable is to the like effect as the foregoing provisions of that section:

And whereas on the 2nd day of February, 1895, Her late Majesty Queen Victoria in Council was pleased to extend section 20 of the Finance Act, 1894, to British India:

And whereas on the 1st day of April, 1937, Burma ceased to be part of India:

And whereas His Majesty is satisfied that by the Law of British Burma no duty is leviable in respect of property situate in Great Britain, when passing on death:

Now, therefore, His Majesty is pleased, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, to order, and it is hereby ordered, that section 20 of the Finance Act, 1894, shall apply to British Burma as from the first day of April, nineteen hundred and thirty-seven.

WHEREAS by subsection (1) of Section 735 of the Merchant Shipping Act, 1894, 57 & 58 Vict., c. 60, it is enacted that the Legislature of any British possession may by any Act or Ordinance confirmed by His Majesty in Council repeal wholly or in part any provisions of the first mentioned Act (other than those of the Third Part thereof which relate to emigrant ships) relating to ships registered in that possession but that any such Act or Ordinance shall not take effect until the approval of His Majesty has been proclaimed in the possession or until such time thereafter as may be fixed by the Act or Ordinance for the purpose:

And whereas the Merchant Shipping Act, 1894, has been from time to time amended by various Acts of Parliament which are to be construed as one with the Merchant Shipping Act, 1894, and may be cited together with the said Act as the Merchant Shipping Acts, 1894 to 1937:

And whereas the Legislature of the Colony of Hong Kong by an ordinance entitled the Merchant Shipping (No. 2) Amendment Ordinance, 1934, has in part repealed the provisions of the said Acts (other than those of the Third Part of the Merchant Shipping Act, 1894, which relate to emigrant ships):

And whereas it is expedient that the said Ordinance should be confirmed by His Majesty in Council:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, is pleased to confirm the said Ordinance.

WHEREAS by Section 21 (1) (a) of the Foreign Marriage Act, 1892 His Majesty The King in Council is authorised to make regulations prohibiting or restricting the exercise by marriage officers of their powers under the Act in places where sufficient facilities appear to His Majesty to exist without the exercise of those

powers for the solemnization of marriages to which a British subject is a party:

And whereas by Section 21 (2) of the said Act it is provided that regulations made in pursuance of the said Section may be made *inter alia* with reference to any particular class of cases:

And whereas it appears that without the exercise of their powers under the said Act by marriage officers in China sufficient facilities exist under the forms of marriage referred to in Sections 12 and 22 of the said Act for marriages in China of British subjects who are serving in China in His Majesty's Naval or Military Forces or in the Royal Air Force:

And whereas on account of urgency this Order should come into immediate operation:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by virtue and in exercise of the powers conferred by the Foreign Marriage Act, 1892, or otherwise enabling Him in this behalf, is pleased, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, to order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:—

1.—(1) This Order may be cited as the Foreign Marriages (China) Order in Council, 1938.

(2) No marriage officer in China shall solemnize any marriage between parties either of whom is serving in China in His Majesty's Naval or Military Forces or the Royal Air Force.

(3) Nothing in this Order shall be deemed to affect the powers as a marriage officer under Section 12 of the Foreign Marriage Act, 1892, of any commanding officer of any of His Majesty's ships.

2. This Order shall come into operation forthwith as a provisional Order in accordance with the provisions of Section 2 of the Rules Publication Act, 1893.

WHEREAS the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England have, in pursuance of the Act of the 3rd and 4th years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, Chapter 113, of the Act of the 6th and 7th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 37, and of the Act of the 19th and 20th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 104, duly prepared and laid before His Majesty in Council a Scheme, bearing date the 21st day of July, 1938, in the words and figures following, that is to say:—

"We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, in pursuance of the Act of the 3rd and 4th years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, Chapter 113, of the Act of the 6th and 7th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 37, and of the Act of the 19th and 20th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 104, have prepared and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council the following Scheme for constituting a separate District for spiritual purposes to be taken partly out of the Parish of Fugglestone with Bemerton and partly out of the Parish of Fisherton Anger, both in the County of Wilts and in the Diocese of Salisbury:

"Whereas we are satisfied that the said Parish of Fugglestone with Bemerton and the said Parish of Fisherton Anger are Cures wherein or in parts whereof the provision for public worship and for pastoral superintendence is insufficient for the spiritual wants of the inhabitants thereof and it has been made to appear to us that it would promote the interests of religion that the particular portions of the said Parish of Fugglestone with Bemerton and of the said Parish of Fisherton Anger, which are hereinafter mentioned and described, should be constituted a separate District in the manner which is hereinafter set forth:

"And whereas there is not at present within the limits of the said proposed separate District any consecrated Church or Chapel in use for the purposes of Divine Worship:

"And whereas we have agreed to make and pay out of the Common Fund created by the firstly herein mentioned Act a grant of £100 per annum to the Minister of the said proposed separate District so soon as a Minister shall have been duly licensed in accordance with the provisions of the secondly herein mentioned Act and to his successors:

"And whereas by Instruments published in the London Gazette on the 30th day of October, 1934, the 29th day of October, 1935, the 30th day of October, 1936, and the 29th day of October, 1937, respectively, we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners in part consideration of benefactions of capital sums amounting to £4,325 10s. 5d. did, in pursuance of the Act of the 29th and 30th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 111, grant out of the Common Fund created by the firstly herein mentioned Act to the Incumbent of the Rectory of the said Parish of Fugglestone with Bemerton yearly sums or stipends amounting to £84, such yearly sums or stipends to be paid only upon the production of certificates that an Assistant Curate had been employed to serve the Conventional District of North Bemerton, and to continue payable so long only as might appear to us to be expedient:

"And whereas it has been made to appear to us to be expedient that such yearly sums or stipends amounting to £84 payable by us as aforesaid should cease to be so payable and that in lieu thereof we should grant a yearly sum of £84 to the Minister of the said proposed District when duly licensed in accordance with the provisions of the secondly herein mentioned Act and to his successors Ministers or Incumbents of the said proposed District or New Parish:

"And whereas the said benefactions of the said capital sums amounting to £4,325 10s. 5d. now held by us are available for the further endowment of the said proposed District and we have agreed to pay to the Minister of the said proposed District, when duly licensed as hereinbefore mentioned, and to his successors Ministers or Incumbents of the said proposed District, a further yearly sum of £148 15s. by equal quarterly payments on the 1st day of February, the 1st day of May, the 1st day of August and the 1st day of November in each and every year, so long as the said capital sum shall remain in our hands:

"And whereas the said grants of the said yearly sums of £100 and £84 respectively will, after the publication in the London Gazette of

an Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this Scheme, be made and secured by Instruments to be executed by us, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, under our Common Seal in accordance with the provisions of the said Act of the 29th and 30th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 111:

"Now, therefore, with the consent of the Right Reverend Ernest Neville, Bishop of Salisbury (in testimony whereof he has signed and sealed this Scheme) we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, humbly recommend and propose that all those portions of the said Parish of Fugglestone with Bemerton and of the said Parish of Fisherton Anger which are described in the Schedule hereunder written, all which portions together with the boundaries thereof are delineated and set forth on the map or plan hereunto annexed, shall, upon and from the day of the date of the publication in the London Gazette of any Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this Scheme as aforesaid, become and be constituted a separate District for spiritual purposes and that the same shall be named 'The District of Saint Michael, Salisbury'.

"And we further recommend and propose that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from recommending and proposing any other measures relating to the matters aforesaid or any of them in accordance with the provisions of the said Acts or of any of them or of any other Act of Parliament.

"THE SCHEDULE to which the foregoing Scheme has reference.

"The District of Saint Michael, Salisbury, comprising:—

"All those contiguous portions of the Parish of Fugglestone with Bemerton and of the Parish of Fisherton Anger, both in the County of Wilts and in the Diocese of Salisbury, which taken together are bounded upon the north-east partly by the District of Saint Francis, Salisbury, and partly by the Parish of Stratford sub Castle, both in the said County and Diocese, and upon the remaining sides, that is to say, upon the north-west, upon the south-west, and upon the south-east, by an imaginary line commencing upon the boundary which divides the said Parish of Stratford sub Castle from the said Parish of Fugglestone with Bemerton at a point in the middle of Devizes Road opposite to the north-eastern end of the wall or fence forming the north-western boundary of the close numbered 56 upon the Ordnance Survey Map of the Civil Parish of Bemerton published in the year 1925 on the scale of 25 inches to a mile and also upon the map or plan annexed to this Scheme, and extending thence south-westward to and along the said wall or fence for a distance of 26 chains or thereabouts to the point where it reaches the eastern side of the footpath leading into Warminster Road, and extending thence first westward to and then southward along the middle of the said footpath for a distance of 51 chains or thereabouts to the centre of the bridge which carries it across the Salisbury Branch Line of the Great Western Railway, and extending thence south-eastward along the middle of the said line of railway for a distance of 60 chains or thereabouts to a point in the middle of Skew Bridge which carries Wilton Road across such

line of railway, and extending thence south-eastward along the middle of Wilton Road (thereby crossing the boundary which divides the said Parish of Fugglestone with Bemerton from the said Parish of Fisherton Anger) for a distance of 32 chains or thereabouts to its junction with Highbury Avenue, and extending thence north-eastward along the middle of Highbury Avenue for a distance of 20½ chains or thereabouts to its junction with Devizes Road, and extending thence first northward to and then north-eastward along the wall or fence forming the eastern boundary of the close numbered 79 upon the above mentioned maps for a distance of 5½ chains or thereabouts to the north-eastern corner of the said close, and extending thence north-eastward in a straight line across the close numbered 76 upon the said maps for a distance of 12½ chains or thereabouts to the north-western corner of the close numbered 75 upon the same maps, and extending thence north-eastward along the wall or fence forming the north-western boundary of the last mentioned close for a distance of 2 chains or thereabouts to the point where it is crossed by the boundary which divides the said Parish of Fisherton Anger from the said Parish of Fugglestone with Bemerton, and extending thence first south-eastward and then eastward along the said boundary for a distance of 7 chains or thereabouts to a point in the middle of the River Avon where the boundaries of the said Parish of Fisherton Anger, of the said Parish of Fugglestone with Bemerton and of the said District, of Saint Francis, Salisbury, all meet."

And whereas drafts of the said Scheme have, in accordance with the provisions of the secondly hereinbefore mentioned Act, been transmitted to the Patrons and to the Incumbents of the Cures out of which it is intended that the District recommended in such Scheme to be constituted shall be taken, and such Patrons and Incumbents have respectively signified their assent to such Scheme:

And whereas the said Scheme has been approved by His Majesty in Council:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His said Council, is pleased hereby to ratify the said Scheme, and to order and direct that the same and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the time when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Acts.

And His Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the said Diocese of Salisbury.

and 20th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 104, duly prepared and laid before His Majesty in Council a Scheme, bearing date the 21st day of July, 1938, in the words and figures following, that is to say:—

“ We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, in pursuance of the Act of the 3rd and 4th years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, Chapter 113, of the Act of the 6th and 7th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 37, and of the Act of the 19th and 20th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 104, have prepared and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council the following Scheme for constituting a separate District for spiritual purposes to be taken out of the Parish of Teddington, in the County of Middlesex and in the Diocese of London:

“ Whereas we are satisfied that the said Parish of Teddington is a Parish wherein or in parts whereof the provision for public worship and for pastoral superintendence is insufficient for the spiritual wants of the inhabitants thereof and it has been made to appear to us that it would promote the interests of religion that the particular part of the said Parish of Teddington which is hereinafter mentioned and described, should be constituted a separate District in the manner which is hereinafter set forth:

“ And whereas there is not at present within the limits of the said proposed separate District any consecrated Church or Chapel in use for the purposes of Divine Worship:

“ And whereas we have agreed to make and pay out of the Common Fund created by the firstly herein mentioned Act a grant of £200 per annum to the Minister of the said proposed separate District so soon as a Minister shall have been duly licensed in accordance with the provisions of the secondly herein mentioned Act and to his successors:

“ And whereas the said grant of the said yearly sum of £200 will after the publication in the London Gazette of an Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this Scheme be made and secured by an Instrument to be executed by us, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, under our Common Seal in accordance with the provisions of the Act of the 29th and 30th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 111:

“ And whereas there has been contributed and paid to the credit of our account at the Bank of England a capital sum of £2,000 towards the cost of erecting a permanent Church within and for the said proposed separate District:

“ And whereas the contributors of the said capital sum of £2,000 have nominated to us the Bishop for the time being of the said Diocese of London as the person to whom they desire that the whole right of patronage of the said proposed District, and, when such District shall have become a New Parish, then of the said New Parish, and the nomination of the Minister or Incumbent thereof should be assigned:

“ Now, therefore, with the consent of the Right Honourable and Right Reverend Arthur Foley, now Bishop of London (in testimony whereof he has signed and sealed this Scheme), we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners humbly recommend and propose that all that part of the said Parish of Teddington which is described in the Schedule hereunder written,

all which part together with the boundaries thereof is delineated and set forth on the map or plan hereunto annexed, shall, upon and from the day of the date of the publication in the London Gazette of any Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this Scheme as aforesaid, become and be constituted a separate District for spiritual purposes, and that the same shall be named ‘ The District of Saint Mark, Teddington.’

District of Saint Chad, Rubery, which are described in the Schedule hereunder written, all which portions, together with the boundaries thereof, are delineated and set forth on the map or plan hereunto annexed, should be united and formed into one Consolidated Chapelry for the said Church of Saint Bartholomew, Allens Cross, situate as aforesaid, and that the same should be named 'The Consolidated Chapelry of Saint Bartholomew, Allens Cross.'

“ THE SCHEDULE to which the foregoing Representation has reference.

“ The Consolidated Chapelry of Saint Bartholomew, Allens Cross, comprising:—

His Majesty The KING has been graciously pleased to award the Edward Medal to Azariah Clarke, Captain of the Rescue Brigade at Holditch Colliery, North Staffordshire, in recognition of his gallantry in the following circumstances:—

On the 2nd July, 1937, at about 5.45 a.m. a fire started in the holing of the Four Feet Seam at Holditch Colliery, North Staffordshire. The fire spread rapidly but of the 55 men employed in the affected area at the time all except two succeeded in withdrawing from the danger zone. As soon as it was found that the two men were missing, unsuccessful search was made for them. At 6.50 a.m. an explosion occurred and one of the search party was afterwards found to be missing.

Meanwhile a call for the Colliery Rescue Brigade had gone out, and by 7.30 a.m. Azariah Clarke had assembled three others at the pithead and proceeded to lead them below ground. The party met the managing director of the colliery in the neighbourhood of the fire, and he instructed them to search for the man who had been lost after the explosion. They accordingly donned their breathing apparatus and started on their search in the direction of the face. The atmosphere was hot, dusty and foul with gas and smoke, and on reaching a fall which blocked the way into the face they retraced their steps, continuing meanwhile their search for the missing man, but without success.

The Rescue Brigade—now increased to five by the arrival of another member—next went to search for the two men who had been lost at the time of the original fire. Still using their breathing apparatus, they stumbled in the smoke up a steep road, parts of which had a gradient of 1 in 2½ to 1 in 3. Soon after 10 a.m., while they were thus engaged, a

severe explosion occurred resulting in the deaths of 27 persons most of whom had been sent down for the purpose of erecting stoppings to seal off the fire. The Rescue Brigade were but slightly affected by this explosion and, having made their way to a telephone, they arranged to come out to secure fresh breathing apparatus since their supplies of oxygen were running low.

During the period of some two hours, during which the Brigade had been searching for the lost men under Clarke's leadership, they had survived two other explosions of lesser intensity (as well as the major explosion to which reference has been made) and had been working throughout in conditions of the greatest difficulty and danger with the realisation, moreover, that further explosions might occur at any moment.

Having secured new apparatus Clarke again led the Brigade into the danger zone. Traveling down the road over falls of ground and derailed tubs, and past other debris produced by the explosion, and extinguishing a fire encountered on the way, they came upon a number of badly injured men and dead bodies. They made the injured as comfortable as possible, and arranged for stretchers to be sent in.

On the arrival of further assistance some members of the Brigade helped in evacuating the injured and the dead, while Clarke and others made a further examination of the workings with a view to ensuring that no living person had been left behind. By 3.35 p.m. all the men known to be alive had been recovered, and as it was thought that there was a considerable risk of a further explosion all the men were withdrawn from the mine. The Rescue Brigade had worked almost continuously in breathing apparatus since 7.30 a.m. Later on doubt arose as to whether there might still be some injured persons alive in the pit, and at 6 p.m. Clarke again led a brigade down the mine. After an exhaustive search they found no live men below, and returned to the surface at 8.30 p.m. In view of the serious nature of the brigade's report on the conditions in the mine it was decided that no more men should be allowed to go down until the fire area had been flooded.

The courage, initiative, endurance, and qualities of leadership displayed by Clarke throughout these lengthy operations were outstanding.

PRESERVATION OF THE CHILTERN HILLS PLANNING SCHEME.
