Notice is hereby given in pursuance of Section 49 (3) of the Diseases of Animals Act, 1894, that the Minister of Agriculture and Fisheries has made the following Orders:—

Order No. 5764.

SUFFOLK SWINE FEVER INFECTED AREA ORDER OF 1938.

SUBJECT.

I. Restricts the movement of swine into, out of, or within the Infected Area described in the Schedule. Prohibits the holding of markets of swine within the Area except as regards fat swine intended for immediate slaughter. Specifies conditions upon which licences for movements of swine may be granted.

II. The Order comes into operation on 7th November, 1938.

SCHEDULE.

Infected Area to which this Order applies.

An Area comprising:—

IN THE COUNTY OF EAST SUFFOLK.

The county borough of Ipswich.
The boroughs of Aldeburgh and Eye.
The petty sessional divisions of Woodbridge, Samford, Bosmere and Claydon, Stow, Hartismere, Hoxne and Framlingham.

In the petty sessional division of Blything.

FOOT-AND-MOUTH DISEASE (INFECTED AREAS) ORDER OF 1938 (No. 103).

SUBJECT.

I. Contracts the Foot-and-Mouth Disease Infected Area around Benenden, Kent, as from the 3rd November, 1938, so as to comprise only the Area described in the Schedule.

II. Releases the Foot-and-Mouth Disease Infected Area around Benenden, Kent, from restrictions, and revokes Orders No. 5763, as from the 10th November, 1938.

SCHEDULE.

Contracted Infected Area.

An Area comprising:—

IN THE COUNTY OF KENT.

The parishes of Cranbrook, Benenden, Rolvenden, Newenden, Sandhurst, Hawkhurst, and so much of the parishes of Goudhurst, Staplehurst, Frittenden, Biddenden and High Halden and of the borough of Tenterden as lies to the east, south and west respectively of the following boundary, namely:—The road running from Hurst Green via Flimwell House, Bedgebury Cross, Goudhurst Church, Jarvis Farm, Worms Hill, Curtisden Green, Hobbs Wood, Cockle Wood, Brattle, Henhurst, Exhurst, Cherry Tree Farm, Balcombe and Pond Farm to Frittenden Road Station and thence in a southerly direction along the Kent and East Sussex Railway Line via High Halden Road Station to the point where the said railway line crosses the road running from Goodshill Farm via Westwell and Broad Tenterden to Small Hythe Church; and thence along the said road via Small Hythe Church to Wittersham.
