

And whereas by Orders in Council bearing dates the 6th February, 1922, the 12th February, 1923, and the 15th May, 1930, sanction was given, inter alia, to certain scales of pensions to Petty Officers, Non-Commissioned Officers and Men who, consequent on wounds, hurts, or disability, are invalided from Your Majesty's Naval Service before completing time for Long Service Pension:

And whereas we are of opinion that the scales of pensions allowable under Orders in Council of the 6th February, 1922, the 12th February, 1923, and the 15th May, 1930, should be revised in certain respects in the case of men who are invalided towards the end of their normal engagements:

We beg leave humbly to recommend that Your Majesty may be graciously pleased, by Your Order in Council, to authorise us to award to Petty Officers, Non-Commissioned Officers and Men who consequent on wounds, hurts, or disability are invalided from Your Majesty's Naval Service on or after the 20th August, 1938, pensions at the revised rates shown in the annexed Schedule, but otherwise subject to the restrictions, conditions and provisions at present in force.

The Lords Commissioners of Your Majesty's Treasury have signified their concurrence in the foregoing proposals.

**DISABILITY PENSIONS.**

*Basic Rate of Service Element, and rate of pension when the cause of invaliding is not attributable to the Service.*

The KING's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

WHEREAS by section 4 of the Air Navigation Act, 1920, as amended by the Air Navigation Act, 1936 (which latter Act is hereinafter referred to as "the Act of 1936") it is enacted that His Majesty may by Order in Council direct that any of the provisions of this Act other than this section shall extend, with such exceptions, adaptations and modifications, if any, as may be specified in the Order, to the Isle of Man, any of the Channel Islands, any colony, any British protectorate or any territory in respect of which a mandate on behalf of the League of Nations has been accepted by His Majesty and is being exercised by His Majesty's Government in the United Kingdom:

And whereas by subsection 1 of section 35 of the Act of 1936 it is provided that that Act shall be construed as one with the Air Navigation Act, 1920, which as amended by the Act of 1936 is hereinafter referred to as "the principal Act":

And whereas it is expedient that the provisions of the principal Act, and the provisions of the Act of 1936 shall extend to the Isle of Man with the exceptions, adaptations and modifications specified in the Schedule hereto:

And whereas by subsection 2 of section 30 of the Act of 1936 it is enacted that an Order in Council made under any of the provisions of the principal Act and that Act may contain such incidental and supplementary provisions as appear to His Majesty in Council to be necessary or expedient for the purposes of the Order:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, in pursuance of the powers conferred upon Him by the Act of 1936, is pleased, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, to direct, and it is hereby directed, as follows:—

1. The provisions of the principal Act other than section 4, and of the Act of 1936, shall extend to the Isle of Man with the exceptions, adaptations and modifications specified in the Schedule hereto.

2. This Order may be cited as the Air Navigation Acts (Extension to the Isle of Man) Order, 1938.
