"Whereas it appears to us to be expedient that a District Chapelry should be assigned to the said Church of Saint George, Chesterton, situate as aforesaid:

"Now, therefore, with the consent of the Right Reverend Bernard Oliver Francis, Bishop of Ely (testified by his having signed and sealed this Representation), we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, humbly represent, that it would, in our opinion, be expedient that all that part of the said Parish of Chesterton which is described in the Schedule hereunder written, all which part, together with the boundaries thereof, is delineated and set forth on the map or plan hereunto annexed, should be assigned as a District Chapelry to the said Church of Saint George, Chesterton, situate as aforesaid, and that the same should be named 'The District Chapelry of Saint George, Chesterton.'

"And with the like consent of the said Bernard Oliver Francis, Bishop of Ely (testified as aforesaid), we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, further represent, that it

appears to us to be expedient that banns of matrimony should be published, and that marriages, baptisms, churchings, and burials should be solemnized or performed at the said Church of Saint George, Chesterton, situate as aforesaid, and that the fees or dues to be received in respect of the publication of banns and of the solemnization or performance of marriages, churchings and burials should be paid and belong to the minister of the same church for the time being:

"Provided always that so long as the Reverend John Alfred Victor Wallace, the present Vicar or Incumbent of the Vicarage of the said Parish of Chesterton, shall continue to be such Vicar or Incumbent, all the fees or dues which may be received in respect of such publication, solemnization or performance at the said Church of Saint George, Chesterton, shall be paid over by the Minister thereof to the said John Alfred Victor Wallace.

"THE SCHEDULE to which the foregoing Representation has reference:—

"The District Chapelry of Saint George, Chesterton, being:—

"All that part of the Parish of Chesterton, in the County of Cambridge and in the Diocese of Ely, which is bounded upon part of the south by the Parish of Saint Andrew the Less, Cambridge, upon the remaining part of the south and upon the east by the Parish of Fen Ditton, upon the north-east by the Parish of Milton, upon the north-west by the Parish of Impington, all in the said County and Diocese, and upon the remaining side, that is to say, upon the south-west, by an imaginary line commencing upon the boundary which divides the said Parish of Impington from the said Parish of Chesterton at the junction of the road called Mere Way with King's Hedges Road, and extending thence south-eastward along the middle of King's Hedges Road for a distance of 29½ chains or thereabouts to a point opposite to the middle of the footpath which leads past Manor Farm into Arbury Road, and extending thence south-westward to and along the said footpath for a distance of 34 chains or thereabouts to its junction with the footpath leading into Milton Road, and extending thence south-eastward along the middle of the last mentioned footpath for a distance of 34½ chains or thereabouts to the point where it reaches the northern side of Milton Road, and extending thence south-eastward to and along the wall or fence forming the boundary between the houses and premises known as Number 282 and Number 284 Milton Road and in a straight line in continuation thereof for a distance in all of 12 chains or thereabouts to a point in the wall or fence forming the northern boundary of the houses and premises situate on the northern side of the road known as Eastfield (being the boundary of the Housing Estate of the Hundred Houses Society Limited) and extending thence first eastward and then south-eastward along the boundary of the said Housing Estate for a distance of 28 chains or thereabouts to the point where it reaches the northern side of Green End Road, and extending thence first south-eastward to and then north-eastward along the middle of Green End Road for a distance of 6½ chains or thereabouts to its junction with Frank's Lane, and extending thence south-eastward along the middle of Frank's Lane for a distance of 11 chains or

WHEREAS the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England have in pursuance of the Union of Benefices Measures, 1923 to 1936, duly prepared and laid before His Majesty in Council a Scheme bearing date the 3rd day of November, 1938, in the words and figures following, that is to say:—

"We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, acting in pursuance of the Union of Benefices Measures, 1923 to 1936, have prepared and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council the following Scheme for altering the boundaries of the Parish of Hart, of the Parish of Saint Hilda, Hartlepool, and of the New Parish of the Holy Trinity, Hartlepool, all in the County of Durham and in the Diocese of Durham:

"Whereas it has been represented to us, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, and it appears to us to be desirable that the boundaries of the said Parishes and New Parish should be altered in the manner which is hereinafter mentioned:

"And whereas the Benefices of Hart, Saint Hilda, Hartlepool, and the Holy Trinity, Hartlepool, are now full, the Reverend Thomas Bertram Weatherell being the present Incumbent of the Benefice of Hart, the Reverend Frederick Thomas Salter being the present Incumbent of the Benefice of Saint Hilda, Hartlepool, and the Reverend Arthur Cyril Hague being the present Incumbent of the Benefice of the Holy Trinity, Hartlepool, and such Incumbents have signified their consents to the proposals hereinafter mentioned by signing this Scheme:

"And whereas the Diocesan Committee of the Diocese of Durham appointed pursuant to the first section of the Union of Benefices Measure, 1923, have by a Resolution passed at a meeting of the said Diocesan Committee held on the 28th day of April, 1938, signified their consent to the alterations of boundaries herein proposed:

"Now, therefore, with the consent of the Right Reverend Herbert Hensley, Bishop of Durham (in testimony whereof he has signed this Scheme), we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, humbly recommend and propose that from and after the day of the date of the publication in the London Gazette of any Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this Scheme and without any assurance in the law other than such duly gazetted Order the boundaries of the said Parish of Hart, of the said Parish of Saint Hilda, Hartlepool, and of the said New Parish of the Holy Trinity, Hartlepool, shall be altered so that (first) all that portion of the said New Parish of the Holy Trinity, Hartlepool, which is described in the First Schedule hereunder written and is delineated and set forth upon the map or plan hereunto annexed and is thereon coloured pink shall be annexed to and shall in future form part of the said Parish of Saint Hilda, Hartlepool, and (secondly) all that portion of the said Parish of Hart which is described in the Second Schedule hereunder written and is delineated and set forth upon the said map or plan hereunto annexed and is thereon coloured green shall be annexed to and shall in future form part of the said New Parish of the Holy Trinity, Hartlepool.

"And we further recommend and propose that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from making any other recommendations and proposals relating to the matters aforesaid, or any of them, in accordance with the provisions of the said Measures, or of any other Measure of the National Assembly of the Church of England, or of any Act of Parliament.

"THE SCHEDULES to which the foregoing Scheme has reference.

"THE FIRST SCHEDULE.

"The territory to be dissevered from the New Parish of the Holy Trinity, Hartlepool, in the County of Durham and in the Diocese of Durham, and to be annexed to the Parish of Saint Hilda, Hartlepool, in the said County and Diocese, being:—

"All that portion of the said New Parish of the Holy Trinity, Hartlepool, which is bounded upon all sides as follows, that is to say, upon part of the west by the New Parish of Christ Church, West Hartlepool, in the said County and Diocese, upon the south by the said Parish of Saint Hilda, Hartlepool, upon the north-east by the sea, and upon the remaining part of the west by an imaginary line commencing at a point at low water mark opposite to the middle of the northern end of Baltic Street, and extending thence south-westward in a straight line for a distance of 11 chains or thereabouts to the junction of Baltic Street with Sea View Terrace, and extending thence south-westward along the middle of Baltic Street and in a straight line in continuation thereof for a distance of $19\frac{1}{2}$ chains or thereabouts to the boundary which divides the said New Parish of the Holy Trinity, Hartlepool, from the said New Parish of Christ Church, West Hartlepool.

"THE SECOND SCHEDULE.

"The territory to be dissevered from the Parish of Hart, in the said County and Diocese, and to be annexed to the said New Parish of the Holy Trinity, Hartlepool, being:—

" All that portion of the said Parish of Hart, which is bounded upon the north-east by the sea, upon the south-east and upon the south by the said New Parish of the Holy Trinity, Hartlepool, and upon the remaining sides, that is to say, upon the west and upon the north, by an imaginary line commencing at the point where the boundary which divides the said New Parish of the Holy Trinity, Hartlepool, from the said Parish of Hart crosses the middle of the new Coast Road from West Hartlepool to Easington, and extending thence north-westward along the middle of the said road for a distance of 33 chains or thereabouts to its junction with Hart Road, and extending thence eastward along the middle of Hart Road for a distance of 54 chains or thereabouts to the place where the boundary of the Parliamentary Borough of The Hartlepoons diverges north-eastward from following the northern side of Hart Road, and extending thence north-eastward to and along such Parliamentary Borough Boundary to the sea."

And whereas drafts of the said Scheme have been duly published in accordance with the provisions of the Union of Benefices Measure, 1923, and Notices have been transmitted to the persons or bodies entitled under the said Measure to receive Notice requiring any objections to such draft Scheme to be stated or transmitted in writing to the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners within the time prescribed in the Statutory Rules applicable to proceedings under the said Union of Benefices Measure, 1923:

And whereas the prescribed time has elapsed and no such objections have been so stated or transmitted to the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners:

And whereas public notice of the certification to His Majesty in Council of the said Scheme and the consent thereto in writing of the Bishop of Durham have been duly given in the manner and within the time prescribed in the Statutory Rules aforesaid:

And whereas the said Scheme has been approved by His Majesty in Council:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His said Council, is pleased hereby to affirm the said Scheme and to order that the Benefices therein recommended to be united shall be united to the extent and for the purposes recommended in the said Scheme and further to order and direct that the said Scheme and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the date when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Measures.

And His Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the said Diocese of Durham.

Queen Victoria, Chapter 113, of the Act of the 6th and 7th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 37, and of the Act of the 19th and 20th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 104, duly prepared and laid before His Majesty in Council a Scheme, bearing date the 3rd day of November, 1938, in the words and figures following, that is to say:—

" We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, in pursuance of the Act of the 3rd and 4th years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, Chapter 113, of the Act of the 6th and 7th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 37, and of the Act of the 19th and 20th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 104, have prepared and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council the following Scheme for constituting a separate District for spiritual purposes to be taken partly out of the Parish of Ecclesfield, partly out of the New Parish (sometime District Chapelry) of Saint Mark, Grenoside, and partly out of the New Parish (sometime District) of Pitsmoor, all in the County of York and in the Diocese of Sheffield:

" Whereas we are satisfied that the said Parish of Ecclesfield, the said New Parish of Saint Mark, Grenoside, and the said New Parish of Pitsmoor are Cures wherein or in parts whereof the provision for public worship and for pastoral superintendence is insufficient for the spiritual wants of the inhabitants thereof and it has been made to appear to us that it would promote the interests of religion that the particular portions of the said Parish of Ecclesfield, of the said New Parish of Saint Mark, Grenoside, and of the said New Parish of Pitsmoor which are hereinafter mentioned and described should be constituted a separate District in the manner which is hereinafter set forth:

" And whereas there is not at present within the limits of the said proposed separate District any consecrated Church or Chapel in use for the purpose of Divine Worship:

" And whereas by a certain Deed bearing date on or about the 3rd day of November, 1938, and made or expressed to be made under the authority of the 'New Parishes Acts, 1843, 1844 and 1856' or some or one of them between the Reverend Thomas Hugh Pyke, Clerk in Holy Orders, Vicar or Incumbent of the Vicarage of the said Parish of Ecclesfield, of the first part, the Parochial Church Council of the said Parish of Ecclesfield, the Patrons of the said Vicarage of Ecclesfield of the second part, the Right Reverend Leonard Hedley, Bishop of Sheffield, the Ordinary of the said Vicarage of Ecclesfield of the third part, and us, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, of the fourth part (which Deed is intended to be registered in the books of the Charity Commissioners) the said Thomas Hugh Pyke did, with the consents of the said Parochial Church Council and of the said Leonard Hedley, Bishop of Sheffield, assign unto us, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners a sum of £1,428 11s. 5d. £3 10s. per centum Conversion Stock now held by us, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners in trust for the said Vicarage of Ecclesfield, to have and to hold for or towards the endowment of the Minister of the District hereinafter recommended to be constituted and his successors, and when such District shall have become a New Parish, then of the Vicar

or Incumbent of such New Parish and his successors, such assignment to take effect as from the date of the cessation of the yearly payment which became charged upon the revenues of the said Vicarage of the Parish of Ecclesfield in favour of the Church of England Pensions Board in trust for the Reverend Arnold Pawson upon his resignation therefrom or as from the date, if later, of the licence of the first Minister of the said proposed District in accordance with the provisions of the secondly herein mentioned Act:

"And whereas we have agreed to make and pay out of the Common Fund created by the firstly herein mentioned Act a grant of £200 per annum to the Minister of the said proposed separate District so soon as a Minister shall have been duly licensed as aforesaid and to his successors:

"And whereas the said grant of the said yearly sum of £200 will, after the publication in the London Gazette of an Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this Scheme, be made and secured by an Instrument to be executed by us, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, under our Common Seal in accordance with the provisions of the Act of the 29th and 30th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter III:

"And whereas there has been contributed and paid to the credit of our account at the Bank of England a capital sum of £2,000 towards the cost of erecting a permanent Church within and for the said proposed separate District:

"And whereas the said capital sum of £2,000 has been contributed and paid as aforesaid upon the understanding and condition that (such arrangement appearing to us to be expedient) the right of patronage of the said proposed District and when such District shall have become a New Parish, then of the said New Parish and the nomination of the Minister or Incumbent thereof should be assigned to the Bishop for the time being of the said Diocese of Sheffield:

"Now, therefore, with the consent of the said Leonard Hedley, Bishop of Sheffield (in testimony whereof he has signed and sealed this Scheme), we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, humbly recommend and propose that all those portions of the said Parish of Ecclesfield, of the said New Parish of Saint Mark, Grenoside, and of the said New Parish of Pitsmoor, which are described in the Schedule hereunder written, all which portions together with the boundaries thereof are delineated and set forth on the map or plan hereunto annexed, shall upon and from the day of the date of the publication in the London Gazette of any Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this Scheme as aforesaid become and be constituted a separate District for spiritual purposes and that the same shall be named 'The District of Saint Cecilia, Parson Cross, Sheffield.'

"And we further recommend and propose that the right of Patronage of the said proposed District and when such District shall have become a New Parish then of such New Parish and the nomination of the Minister or Incumbent thereof shall without any assurance in the law other than this Scheme and any duly gazetted Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying the same and upon and from the day

of the date of the publication of such Order in the London Gazette as aforesaid be assigned to and be absolutely vested in and shall and may from time to time be exercised by the said Leonard Hedley, Bishop of Sheffield, and his successors for ever.

"And we further recommend and propose that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from recommending and proposing any other measures relating to the matters aforesaid or any of them in accordance with the provisions of the said Acts or any of them or any other Act of Parliament.

"THE SCHEDULE to which the foregoing Scheme has reference.

"The District of Saint Cecilia, Parson Cross, Sheffield, comprising:—

"All those contiguous portions of the Parish of Ecclesfield, of the New Parish (sometime District Chapelry) of Saint Mark, Grenoside, and of the New Parish (sometime District) of Pitsmoor, all in the County of York and in the Diocese of Sheffield, which, taken together, are bounded upon the east by the District of Saint James and Saint Christopher, Shiregreen, upon the south partly by the New Parish of Saint Hilda, Shiregreen, partly by the New Parish of Saint Cuthbert, Sheffield, and partly by the District of Saint Leonard, Norwood, Sheffield, all in the said County and Diocese, and upon the remaining sides, that is to say, upon the west and upon the north, by an imaginary line commencing upon the boundary which divides the said District of Saint Leonard, Norwood, Sheffield, from the said Parish of Ecclesfield at the junction of Herries Road with Wordsworth Avenue and extending thence northward along the middle of Wordsworth Avenue for a distance of 30 chains or thereabouts to its junction with Southey Green Road and extending thence westward along the middle of Southey Green Road for a distance of 21½ chains or thereabouts to its junction with Halifax Road, and extending thence northward along the middle of Halifax Road (thereby following in part the boundary which divides the said Parish of Ecclesfield from the said New Parish of Saint Mark, Grenoside) for a distance of 75 chains or thereabouts to its junction with the roadway or footpath leading into Creswick Lane near its junction with Yew Lane, and extending thence eastward along the said roadway or footpath for a distance of 21 chains or thereabouts to its junction with Creswick Lane, and extending thence northward along the middle of Creswick Lane (thereby following the boundary which divides the said New Parish of Saint Mark, Grenoside, from the said Parish of Ecclesfield) for a distance of 2½ chains or thereabouts to its junction with Yew Lane, and extending thence eastward along the middle of Yew Lane for a distance of 26½ chains or thereabouts to a point opposite to the northern end of the fence forming the western boundary of the close numbered 1223 upon the Ordnance Survey Map of the Civil Parish of Ecclesfield published in the year 1934 upon the scale of 25 inches to a mile and also upon the map or plan annexed to this Scheme, and extending thence first southward to such fence and then first southward and then eastward along the fences forming the western boundary of the said close numbered 1223 and the western and southern

boundaries of the close numbered 1615 upon the said maps for a distance in all of 18½ chains or thereabouts to the point where the last mentioned fence crosses the middle of the stream which flows into Sheffield Lane Dike, and extending thence south-eastward along the middle of the said stream for a distance of 39 chains or thereabouts to its junction with Sheffield Lane Dike, and extending thence generally eastward along the middle of Sheffield Lane Dike for a distance of 40 chains or thereabouts to its junction with Hartley Brook Dike, and extending thence first north-eastward and then in various directions along the middle of Hartley Brook Dike for a distance of 59 chains or thereabouts to the boundary which divides the said Parish of Ecclesfield from the said District of Saint James and Saint Christopher, Shiregreen."

And whereas drafts of the said Scheme have, in accordance with the provisions of the secondly herein-before mentioned Act, been transmitted to the Patrons and to the Incumbents of the Cures out of which it is intended that the District recommended in such Scheme to be constituted shall be taken, and such Patrons and Incumbents have respectively signified their assent to such Scheme:

And whereas the said Scheme has been approved by His Majesty in Council:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His said Council, is pleased hereby to ratify the said Scheme, and to order and direct that the same and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the time when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Acts.

And His Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the said Diocese of Sheffield.

"Whereas by an Order of Your Majesty in Council bearing date the 18th day of December, 1936, and published in the London Gazette on the 8th day of January, 1937, the said District of Saint Cedd, Canning Town, was, under the provisions of the hereinbefore mentioned

"And whereas the said capital sum of £2,000 has been so contributed and paid as aforesaid upon the understanding that (such arrangement appearing to us expedient) the whole right of Patronage of the said District of Saint Cedd, Canning Town, and when such District shall have become a New Parish, then of the said New Parish, and the nomination of the Minister or Incumbent thereof should be assigned in the manner which is hereinafter recommended and proposed:

"And whereas the contributors of the said capital sum of £2,000 have nominated to us the Bishop for the time being of the said Diocese of Chelmsford as the person to whom they desire that the Patronage and right of nomination and presentation of and to the said District or New Parish of Saint Cedd, Canning Town, should be assigned, and we are satisfied that the said assignment may properly be effected:

"Now, therefore, we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, humbly recommend and propose that the whole right of Patronage of the said District of Saint Cedd, Canning Town, and when such District shall have become a New Parish as aforesaid, then of the said New Parish, and the nomination of the Minister or Incumbent thereof shall without any conveyance or assurance in the law other than this Scheme and any duly gazetted Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying the same and upon and from the day of the date of the publication of such Order in the London Gazette be assigned to and be absolutely vested in and shall and may from time to time be exercised by the Right Reverend Henry, now Bishop of Chelmsford, and by his successors in the same Bishopric for ever.

"And we further recommend and propose that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from recommending and proposing any other measures relating to the matters aforesaid, or any of them, in conformity with the provisions of the hereinbefore mentioned Act, or of any other Act of Parliament."

And whereas the said Scheme has been approved by His Majesty in Council:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His said Council, is pleased hereby to ratify the said Scheme, and to order and direct that the same and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the time when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Act.

And His Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the said Diocese of Chelmsford.

“ We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, acting in pursuance of the Union of Benefices Measures, 1923 to 1936, have prepared, and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council, the following Scheme for effecting the union of the Benefice (being a Vicarage) of Cratfield, the Benefice (being a Vicarage) of Ubbeston, and the Benefice (being a Rectory) of Heveningham, all of which Benefices are situate in the County of Suffolk and in the Diocese of Saint Edmundsbury and Ipswich:

“ Whereas Commissioners appointed at our request by the Right Reverend Walter Godfrey, Bishop of Saint Edmundsbury and Ipswich, pursuant to the provisions of the said Measures, to inquire into and report upon the union of the said three Benefices of Cratfield, Ubbeston and Heveningham, duly made their Report to the said Bishop of Saint Edmundsbury and Ipswich and therein recommended the union of the said three Benefices and the terms for effecting the union, and the said Bishop of Saint Edmundsbury and Ipswich signified in writing his approval of the said Report:

“ And whereas we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, have prepared this Scheme for the union of the said three Benefices based upon the terms recommended in the said Report:

“ And whereas the said three Benefices are now full, the said Benefices of Cratfield and Ubbeston being held in plurality by the Reverend Victor Frederick Finlay Malley under the authority of a Dispensation and the said Benefice of Heveningham being held by the Reverend Albert Robinson Fowler:

“ And whereas the Patronage of each of the said Benefices of Cratfield and Ubbeston now belongs to one and the same body of Patrons:

“ Now, therefore, we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, with the consents of the said Walter Godfrey, Bishop of Saint Edmundsbury and Ipswich, and of the said Victor Frederick Finlay Malley (testified by their respectively signing this Scheme) do humbly recommend and propose to your Majesty as follows, that is to say:—

“ 1. That upon the day of the date of the publication in the London Gazette of any Order of Your Majesty in Council affirming this Scheme the said Benefice of Cratfield and the said Benefice of Ubbeston shall be permanently united together and form one Benefice with Cure of Souls under the style of ‘ The United Benefice of Cratfield with Ubbeston ’ but the Parishes of the said Benefices shall continue distinct in all respects and the said Victor Frederick Finlay Malley if he is then Incumbent of both of the said Benefices of Cratfield and Ubbeston shall become the first Incumbent of the United

Benefice and his admission thereto shall be without any form or fee of or for presentation or nomination and he shall not be required to pay any fees in respect of his collation, institution, licence or induction to the United Benefice beyond such fees as he would have been liable to pay if his admission to the United Benefice had been an admission solely to that one of the said two Benefices for the holding of which in plurality with the other a Dispensation was heretofore granted to him, and for the purpose of the 5th Section of the Incumbents' Resignation Act, 1871, and of Schedule A thereto, his tenure of the said Benefices of Cratfield and Ubbeston shall be deemed to continue notwithstanding his admission to the United Benefice; and upon the said union taking effect the Parsonage House at present belonging to the said Benefice of Cratfield shall become and be the house of residence for the Incumbent of the United Benefice.

“ 2. That the said Benefice of Heveningham and the United Benefice of Cratfield, with Ubbeston referred to in Clause 1 of this Scheme shall be permanently united together and form one Benefice with Cure of Souls under the style of ‘ The United Benefice of Cratfield, with Heveningham and Ubbeston ’ but the Parishes of the said Benefices shall continue distinct in all respects.

“ 3. That the union referred to in Clause 2 of this Scheme shall take effect after the date of the publication in the London Gazette of any Order of Your Majesty in Council affirming this Scheme either upon the first vacation after that date of the said Benefice of Heveningham or upon the first vacation after that date of the United Benefice of Cratfield with Ubbeston whichever shall the later happen.

“ 4. That upon the union referred to in Clause 2 of this Scheme taking effect the Parsonage House at present belonging to the said Benefice of Cratfield shall become and be the house of residence for the Incumbent of the United Benefice and so soon as conveniently may be the Parsonage House at present belonging to the said Benefice of Heveningham and the site and appurtenances thereof and the grounds heretofore usually occupied and enjoyed therewith shall be sold and disposed of by us the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners at such time or times and in such manner in all respects as to us shall seem expedient and that the net proceeds of such sale shall be held and invested by us, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, for the benefit of the United Benefice.

“ 5. That upon the union referred to in Clause 2 of this Scheme taking effect provision shall be made by the Incumbent of the United Benefice for obtaining the services of a Curate or occasional clerical or lay assistance and a portion of the endowments of the United Benefice namely a part producing £250 per annum of the sum of money appropriated or to be appropriated by Queen Anne's Bounty to the said Benefices of Cratfield, Ubbeston and Heveningham pursuant to the provisions of Part II paragraph 2 of the Third Schedule to the Tithe Act, 1936, and paragraph 1 of the Eighth Schedule to the same Act shall be appropriated as a fund to meet the expenses of providing for the services of a Curate or for occasional clerical or lay assistance as aforesaid, which said fund shall be paid by Queen

Anne's Bounty to the Diocesan Board of Finance of the Diocese wherein the said United Benefice shall be situate as trustees to apply the same for the purpose of paying the stipend of a Curate or the expense of occasional clerical or lay assistance as aforesaid.

"6. That after the union referred to in Clause 2 of this Scheme has taken effect the course and succession in which the respective Patrons shall present or nominate to the United Benefice from time to time as the same shall become vacant shall be as follows, that is to say, the right of presentation shall be exercised by the Patrons of the said Benefice of Heveningham and of the said Benefices of Cratfield and Ubbeston alternately, the Patron of the said Benefice of Heveningham having the right upon the first presentation to the United Benefice to be made after the union and every alternate right of presentation and the Patrons of the said Benefices of Cratfield and Ubbeston having the right of presentation upon the second presentation to the United Benefice to be made after the union and every alternate turn thereafter.

"Provided always that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from making any other recommendations and proposals relating to the matters aforesaid, or any of them, in accordance with the provisions of the said Measures, or of any other Measure of the National Assembly of the Church of England, or of any Act of Parliament."

And whereas drafts of the said Scheme have been duly published in accordance with the provisions of the said Measures and Notices have been transmitted to the persons or bodies entitled under the said Measures to receive Notice requiring any objections to such draft Scheme to be stated or transmitted in writing to the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners within the time prescribed in the Statutory Rules applicable to proceedings under the said Measures:

And whereas certain objections have been so stated or transmitted to the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners within the time prescribed in the same Rules:

And whereas the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners after giving full consideration to such objections have deemed right to make no alterations in such draft Scheme:

And whereas public notice of the certification to His Majesty in Council of the said Scheme and the consent thereto in writing of the Bishop of Saint Edmundsbury and Ipswich has been duly given in the manner and within the time prescribed in the Statutory Rules aforesaid:

And whereas no appeal has been made to His Majesty in Council within the period of one month after the date of the said public notice in accordance with the provisions of the said Measures against the said Scheme or any part thereof by any person who has made objection as aforesaid to the said draft Scheme:

And whereas the said Scheme has been approved by His Majesty in Council:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His said Council, is pleased hereby to affirm the said Scheme and to order that the Benefices therein recommended to be united shall be united to the extent and for the purposes recommended in the said Scheme and further to order and direct that the said Scheme and every part thereof

shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the date when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Measures.

And His Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the said Diocese of Saint Edmundsbury and Ipswich.
