RULES PUBLICATION ACT, 1893.

IN THE MATTER OF THE LONDON TRAFFIC ACT, 1924.

The Minister of Transport hereby gives notice under the Rules Publication Act, 1893, that he proposes after the expiration of at least 40 days from this date in pursuance of the powers conferred upon him by Section 10 of the London Traffic Act, 1924, to make regulations in regard to the undermentioned schemes of roundabout traffic working

1. At the junction of Mickleham By-pass and the Dorking-Leatherhead Road (A.24), Dorking.
2. At the junction of Mickleham By-pass, Church Street (A.243) and Leatherhead By-pass (A.24), Leatherhead.

The short titles of the draft Regulations are respectively:—

- (1) The London Traffic (Prescribed Routes) (No.) (Mickleham By-pass, Dorking) Regulations, 1938.
- (2) The London Traffic (Prescribed Routes) (No.) (Mickleham By-pass, Leatherhead) Regulations, 1938.
