Notice is hereby given in pursuance of Section 49 (3) of the Diseases of Animals Act, 1894, that the Minister of Agriculture and Fisheries has made the following Orders:—

FOOT-AND-MOUTH DISEASE (INFECTED AREAS) SPECIAL ORDER No. 8 OF 1938.

SUBJECT.

I. Contracts the Foot-and-Mouth Disease Infected Area around Stalbridge, Dorset, as from the 22nd December, 1938, so as to comprise only the Area described in the Schedule.

II. Releases the Foot-and-Mouth Disease Infected Area around Stalbridge, Dorset, from restrictions, and revokes Order No. 5778 as from the 29th December, 1938.

SCHEDULE.

IN THE COUNTY OF DORSET.

An Area comprising:—

In the petty sessional division of Sturminster.

The parishes of Fifehead Magdalen, Marnhull, Stalbridge, Stourton Caundle, Lydlinch, Sturminster Newton, Hinton St. Mary, Manston and Hammoon; and so much of the parishes of Fifehead Neville and Okeford Fitzpaine as lies to the north of the road running from Kingston via Woodrow, Fifehead Neville Church, Common Gate, and Okeford Fitzpaine to Shillingstone.

In the petty sessional division of Shaftesbury.

The parishes of Buckhorn Weston, Kington Magna, West Stour, East Stour, Stour Provost, Todber, Margaret Marsh, East Orchard and West Orchard; so much of the parish of Gillingham as lies to the south-west of the road running from Cucklington via Woodhouse Cross, Stock Hill, Wyke March, Gillingham and Ham Common to Shaftesbury; and so much of the parish of Fontmell Magna as lies to the west of the road running from Vale Farm via Pen Hill and Woodbridge to Twyford.

In the petty sessional division of Sherborne.

The parishes of Purse Caundle and Bishop's Caundle; and so much of the parish of Holwell as lies to the north of the road running from Bishop's Caundle via Higher Wood Bridge and Woodbridge to Lydlinch.

IN THE COUNTY OF SOMERSET.

In the petty sessional division of Wincanton.

The parishes of Henstridge and Abbas and Temple Combe; and so much of the parishes of Milborne Port, Charlton Horethorne, Horsington, Wincanton, and Cucklington as lies to the east and south-east of the road running from Goathill via Milborne Port, Milborne Wick Church, Stowell, Horsington, Gould's Farm, Marsh Court, Shanks House, Cucklington Rectory and Woodhouse Cross to Gillingham.
