And whereas it is expedient that the Court of Passage of the City of Liverpool and the Salford Hundred Court of Record should exercise the jurisdiction conferred by the Act upon county courts:

Now, therefore, His Majesty is pleased, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, to order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:—

1. The jurisdiction conferred by the Act on the county courts may be exercised by the Court of Passage of the City of Liverpool and by the Salford Hundred Court of Record.

2. The authority empowered to make rules of procedure for each of the said Courts may, if it thinks fit, adopt and apply to that Court any County Court Rules made for the purpose of giving effect to the Act.

3. The Interpretation Act, 1889, shall apply to this Order as if it were an Act of Parliament.

4. This Order may be cited as the Hire-Purchase (Inferior Courts) Order, 1938, and shall come into operation on the 1st day of January, 1939.

"Whereas it has been represented to us, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, and it appears to us to be desirable that the boundaries of the said Parishes should be altered in the manner which is hereinafter mentioned:

"And whereas the Benefices of Meppershall and Shefford are now full, the Reverend Selwyn Edward Sears being the present Incumbent of the Benefice of Meppershall and the Reverend Eric Charles Whitworth being the present Incumbent of the Benefice of Shefford, and such Incumbents have signified their consents to the proposals hereinafter mentioned by signing this Scheme:

"And whereas the Diocesan Committee of the Diocese of Saint Albans appointed pursuant to the first section of the Union of Benefices Measure, 1923, have by a Resolution passed at a meeting of the said Diocesan Committee held on the 13th day of October, 1937, signified their consent to the alterations of boundaries herein proposed:

"Now, therefore, with the consent of the Right Reverend Michael, Bishop of Saint Albans (in testimony whereof he has signed this Scheme), we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, humbly recommend and propose that from and after the date of the date of the publication in the London Gazette of any Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this Scheme and without any assurance in the law other than such duly gazetted Order the boundaries of the said Parish of Meppershall and of the said Parish of Shefford shall be altered so that all that portion of the said Parish of Meppershall which is described in the Schedule hereunder written and is delineated and set forth upon the map or plan hereunto annexed and is thereon coloured pink shall be annexed to and shall in future form part of the said Parish of Shefford.

"And we further recommend and propose that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from making any other recommendations and proposals relating to the matters aforesaid, or any of them, in accordance with the provisions of the said Measures, or of any other Measure of the National Assembly of the Church of England, or of any Act of Parliament.

"THE SCHEDULE to which the foregoing Scheme has reference.

"The territory to be dis severed from the Parish of Meppershall, in the County of Bedford and in the Diocese of Saint Albans, and to be annexed to the Parish of Shefford, in the same County and Diocese, being:—

"All that portion of the said Parish of Meppershall which is bounded upon the north-west and upon the north-east by the said Parish of Shefford, and upon the remaining sides, that is to say, upon the south and upon the south-west, by an imaginary line commencing upon the boundary which divides the said Parish of Shefford from the said Parish of Meppershall at the point where the boundary of the Civil Parish of Shefford diverges westward from following the middle of Hitchin Road, and extending thence first westward, then north-westward and then south-westward along such Civil Parish boundary for a distance of 46 chains or thereabouts, to the boundary which divides the said Parish of Meppershall from the said Parish of Shefford."

And whereas drafts of the said Scheme have been duly published in accordance with the provisions of the Union of Benefices Measure, 1923, and Notices have been transmitted to the persons or bodies entitled under the same Measure to receive Notice requiring any objections to such draft Scheme to be stated or transmitted in writing to the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners within the time prescribed in the Statutory Rules applicable to proceedings under the said Union of Benefices Measure, 1923:

And whereas an objection has been so stated or transmitted to the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners:

And whereas the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners after giving full consideration to such objection have deemed right to make no alterations in such draft Scheme:

And whereas public notice of the certification to His Majesty in Council of the said Scheme and the consent thereto in writing of the Bishop of Saint Albans have been duly given in the manner and within the time prescribed in the Statutory Rules aforesaid:

And whereas no appeal has been made to His Majesty in Council within the period of one month after the date of the said public notice in accordance with the provisions of the said Measure against the said Scheme or any part thereof by the person who has made objection as aforesaid to the said draft Scheme:

And whereas the said Scheme has been approved by His Majesty in Council:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His said Council, is pleased hereby to affirm the said Scheme and to order and direct that the said Scheme and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the date when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Measure.

And His Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the said Diocese of Saint Albans.

“ We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, acting under the provisions of the Act of the 7th and 8th years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, Chapter 94, the Act of the 13th and 14th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 94, and the Act of the 32nd and 33rd years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 94, have prepared, and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council, the following Scheme or Representation for altering the boundaries of the New Parish of the Holy Trinity, South Crosland, the New Parish of Saint James, Meltham Mills, the New Parish of Helme, the New Parish of Saint Bartholomew, Meltham, and the New Parish of Saint Mary, Honley, all in the County of York and in the Diocese of Wakefield:

“ Whereas by the authority of an Order of Her said late Majesty in Council bearing date the 10th day of December, 1842, and published in the London Gazette on the 7th day of March, 1843, a Chapelry District was assigned to the consecrated Church of the Holy Trinity, South Crosland, and the said Chapelry District was named ‘ The Chapelry District of the Holy Trinity, South Crosland ’:

“ And whereas by the authority of an Instrument bearing date the 11th day of November, 1845, and being under the hand and seal of the Right Reverend Charles Thomas, then Bishop of Ripon, a Particular District was assigned to the consecrated Church of Saint James, Meltham Mills, and the said Particular District was known as ‘ The Particular District of Saint James, Meltham Mills ’:

“ And whereas by the authority of another Order of Her said late Majesty in Council bearing date the 31st day of July, 1858, and published in the London Gazette on the 13th day of the following month, a separate District for spiritual purposes was constituted and the said District was named ‘ The District of Helme ’:

“ And whereas by the authority of another Order of Her said late Majesty in Council bearing date the 7th day of July, 1874, and published in the London Gazette on the 17th day of the same month, a District Chapelry was assigned to the consecrated Church of Saint Bartholomew, Meltham, and the said District Chapelry was named ‘ The District Chapelry of Saint Bartholomew, Meltham ’:

“ And whereas by the authority of another Order of Her said late Majesty in Council bearing date the 23rd day of October, 1876, and published in the London Gazette on the 27th day of the same month, a District Chapelry was assigned to the consecrated

Church of Saint Mary, Honley, and the said District Chapelry was named ‘ The District Chapelry of Saint Mary, Honley ’:

“ And whereas the said Chapelry District of the Holy Trinity, South Crosland, the said Particular District of Saint James, Meltham Mills, the said District of Helme, the said District Chapelry of Saint Bartholomew, Meltham, and the said District Chapelry of Saint Mary, Honley, have become New Parishes of the character contemplated by the Act of the 6th and 7th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 37, by the Act of the 19th and 20th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 104, and by the above mentioned Act of the 32nd and 33rd years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 94:

“ And whereas it has been represented to us, and it appears to be expedient that the boundaries of the said New Parish of the Holy Trinity, South Crosland, the said New Parish of Saint James, Meltham Mills, the said New Parish of Helme, the said New Parish of Saint Bartholomew, Meltham Mills, and the said New Parish of Saint Mary, Honley, should be altered in the manner which is hereinafter mentioned:

“ Now, therefore, with the consent of the Right Reverend Campbell Richard, Bishop of Wakefield (in testimony whereof he has signed and sealed this Scheme or Representation), we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, humbly represent, recommend and propose that from and after the day of the date of the publication in the London Gazette of an Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this Scheme or Representation and without any assurance in the law other than such duly gazetted Order the boundaries of the said New Parish of the Holy Trinity, South Crosland, the said New Parish of Saint James, Meltham Mills, the said New Parish of Helme, the said New Parish of Saint Bartholomew, Meltham, and the said New Parish of Saint Mary, Honley, shall be altered so that (first) all those portions of the said New Parish of the Holy Trinity, South Crosland, and of the said New Parish of Helme, which are described in the First Schedule hereunder written and are delineated and set forth upon the map or plan hereunto annexed and are thereon coloured pink shall be dissevered from such New Parishes and shall be annexed to and shall in future form part of the said New Parish of Saint James, Meltham Mills; (secondly) all that portion of the said New Parish of Helme, which is described in the Second Schedule hereunder written and is delineated and set forth upon the said map or plan hereunto annexed and is thereon coloured green shall be dissevered from such New Parish and shall be annexed to and shall in future form part of the said New Parish of Saint Bartholomew, Meltham; (thirdly) all that portion of the said New Parish of Saint Bartholomew, Meltham, which is described in the Third Schedule hereunder written and is delineated and set forth upon the said map or plan hereunto annexed and is thereon coloured purple shall be dissevered from such New Parish and shall be annexed to and shall in future form part of the said New Parish of Helme, and (fourthly) all that portion of the said New Parish of the Holy Trinity, South Crosland, which is described in the Fourth Schedule hereunder written and is delineated and set forth upon the said map or plan

hereunto annexed and is thereon coloured blue shall be dissevered from such New Parish and shall be annexed to and shall in future form part of the said New Parish of Saint Mary, Honley.

" And we further represent, recommend and propose that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from representing, recommending and proposing any other measures relating to the matters aforesaid or any of them in accordance with the provisions of the hereinbefore mentioned Acts or any of them or any other Act of Parliament.

" THE SCHEDULES to which the foregoing Scheme or Representation has reference.

" THE FIRST SCHEDULE.

" The territory to be annexed to the New Parish of Saint James, Meltham Mills, in the County of York and in the Diocese of Wakefield, comprising:—

" All those contiguous portions of the New Parish of the Holy Trinity, South Crosland, and of the New Parish of Helme, both in the said County and Diocese, which taken together are bounded upon part of the east and upon part of the south by the said New Parish of Saint James, Meltham Mills, upon the remaining part of the south by the New Parish of Saint Bartholomew, Meltham, in the said County and Diocese, and upon the remaining sides, that is to say, upon the north-west and upon the remaining part of the east by an imaginary line commencing at the point where the boundary which divides the said New Parish of Saint Bartholomew, Meltham, from the said New Parish of Helme crosses the middle of the Meltham Branch Line of the London, Midland and Scottish Railway, and extending thence north-eastward along the middle of the said line of railway (thereby crossing the boundary which divides the said New Parish of Helme from the said New Parish of the Holy Trinity, South Crosland) for a distance of 52 chains or thereabouts to the centre of the bridge which carries it across Huddersfield Road, and extending thence southward along the middle of Huddersfield Road (thereby following in part the boundary which divides the said New Parish of the Holy Trinity, South Crosland, from the said New Parish of Helme) for a distance of 12 chains or thereabouts to the point where the boundaries of the said New Parish of Helme, of the said New Parish of the Holy Trinity, South Crosland, and of the said New Parish of Saint James, Meltham Mills, all meet.

" THE SECOND SCHEDULE.

" The territory to be dissevered from the said New Parish of Helme, and to be annexed to the said New Parish of Saint Bartholomew, Meltham, being:—

" All that portion of the said New Parish of Helme which is bounded upon the south by the said New Parish of Saint Bartholomew, Meltham, and upon the remaining sides, that is to say, upon the north-east and upon the north-west, by an imaginary line commencing at the point where the boundary which divides the said New Parish of Saint Bartholomew, Meltham, from the said New Parish of Helme crosses the middle of Broadlands Road from east to west, and extending thence north-westward along the middle of Broadlands

Road for a distance of 2½ chains or thereabouts to its junction with the roadway or footpath leading to Pick Hill Farm and extending thence south-westward along the middle of such roadway or footpath for a distance of 2 chains or thereabouts to the boundary which divides the said New Parish of Helme from the said New Parish of Saint Bartholomew, Meltham.

" THE THIRD SCHEDULE.

" The territory to be dissevered from the said New Parish of Saint Bartholomew, Meltham, and to be annexed to the said New Parish of Helme, being:—

" All that portion of the said New Parish of Saint Bartholomew, Meltham, which lies to the north and east of the middle of Broadlands Road.

" THE FOURTH SCHEDULE.

pink shall be annexed to and shall in future form part of the said Parish of Bromley (secondly) all that portion of the said Parish of Bromley which is described in the Second Schedule hereunder written and is delineated and set forth upon the said map or plan hereunto annexed and is thereon coloured green shall be annexed to and shall in future form part of the said New Parish of Saint John the Evangelist, Bromley, and (thirdly) all that portion of the said Parish of Bromley which is described in the Third Schedule hereunder written and is delineated and set forth upon the said map or plan hereunto annexed and is thereon coloured purple shall be annexed to and shall in future form part of the said New Parish of Saint Mary, Shortlands.

" Whereas it has been represented to us, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, and it appears to us to be desirable that the boundaries of the said Parishes and New Parish should be altered in the manner which is hereinafter mentioned:

" And whereas the Benefices of Chislehurst, Foots Cray, Saint Mary Cray, Saint Paul's Cray, and Saint John, Sidcup, are now full, the Reverend John Reginald Bertrand Bradley Lumb being the present Incumbent of the Benefice of Chislehurst, the Reverend Rupert Johnstone being the present Incumbent of the Benefice of Foots Cray, the Reverend Ralph Fry Galer being the present Incumbent of the Benefice of Saint Mary Cray, the Reverend Hugh Caiger being the present Incumbent of the Benefice of Saint Paul's Cray, and the Reverend Canon Charles Edward Webb being the present Incumbent of the Benefice of Saint John, Sidcup, and such Incumbents have signified their consents to the proposals hereinafter mentioned by signing this Scheme:

“ Whereas Commissioners appointed at our request by the Right Reverend Henry Herbert, Bishop of Carlisle, pursuant to the provisions of the said Measures to inquire into and report upon the union of the said Benefice of Dufton with a part of the said Benefice of Long Marton duly made their Report to the said Bishop of Carlisle and therein recommended such union and the terms for effecting the same, and the said Bishop of Carlisle signified in writing his approval of the said Report:

“ And whereas we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, have prepared this Scheme for the said union which Scheme is based upon the terms recommended in the said Report:

“ And whereas both of the said Benefices of Dufton and Long Marton are now full the Reverend Victor Frederick Lindsay being the present Incumbent of the said Benefice of Dufton and the Reverend Canon Robert William Harris being the present Incumbent of the said Benefice of Long Marton:

“ And whereas the patronage of each of the said Benefices of Dufton and Long Marton now belongs to one and the same Patron:

And whereas the prescribed time has elapsed and no such objections have been so stated or

transmitted to the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners:

And whereas public notice of the certification to His Majesty in Council of the said Scheme and the consent thereto in writing of the Bishop of Carlisle has been duly given in the manner and within the time prescribed in the Statutory Rules aforesaid:

And whereas the said Scheme has been approved by His Majesty in Council:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His said Council, is pleased hereby to affirm the said Scheme and to order and direct that the said Scheme and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the date when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Measures.

And His Majesty by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the said Diocese of Carlisle.

" We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, acting under the provisions of the Act of the 7th and 8th years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, Chapter 94, of the Act of the 13th and 14th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 94, and of the Act of the 32nd and 33rd years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 94, have prepared, and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council, the following Scheme or Representation for altering the boundaries of the New Parish of Christ Church, Linthwaite, of the New Parish of the Holy Trinity, South Crosland, of the New Parish of Emmanuel, Lockwood, of the New Parish of Saint Luke, Milns Bridge, of the New Parish of Saint Paul, Armitage Bridge, of the New Parish of Rashcliffe, of the New Parish of Saint John the Evangelist, Newsome, and of the New Parish of Saint Barnabas, Crosland Moor, all in the County of York and in the Diocese of Wakefield:

" Whereas Chapelry Districts have been assigned to the Church called Christ Church, Linthwaite, and to each of the Churches of the Holy Trinity, South Crosland; Emmanuel, Lockwood; Saint Luke, Milns Bridge, and Saint Paul, Armitage Bridge, District Chapelries have been assigned to each of the Churches of Saint Stephen, Rashcliffe, and Saint John the

Evangelist, Newsome, and a separate District for spiritual purposes has been constituted by the name of Saint Barnabas, Crosland Moor,

by the Orders in Council, the dates of which are stated in the 3rd Column of the following Table:—

“ And whereas the said Chapelry District of Christ Church, Linthwaite, the said Chapelry District of the Holy Trinity, South Crosland, the said Chapelry District of Emmanuel, Lockwood, the said Chapelry District of Saint Luke, Milns Bridge, the said Chapelry District of Saint Paul, Armitage Bridge, the said District Chapelry of Rashcliffe, the said District Chapelry of Saint John the Evangelist, Newsome, and the said District of Saint Barnabas, Crosland Moor, have become New Parishes of the character contemplated by the Act of the 6th and 7th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 37, by the Act of the 10th and 20th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 104, and by the above-mentioned Act of the 32nd and 33rd years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 94:

described in the Second Schedule hereunder written and is delineated and set forth upon the said map or plan hereunto annexed and is thereon coloured blue shall be dissevered from such New Parish and shall be annexed to and shall in future form part of the said New Parish of Saint Luke, Milns Bridge; (thirdly) all those portions of the said New Parish of Saint Luke, Milns Bridge, and of the said New Parish of Emmanuel, Lockwood, which are described in the Third Schedule hereunder written and are delineated and set forth upon the said map or plan hereunto annexed and are thereon coloured pink shall be dissevered from such New Parishes and shall be annexed to and shall in future form part of the said New Parish of Saint Barnabas, Crosland Moor; (fourthly) all those portions of the said New Parish of the Holy Trinity, South Crosland, and of the said New Parish of Rashcliffe which are described in the Fourth Schedule hereunder written and are delineated and set forth upon the said map or plan hereunto annexed and are thereon coloured purple shall be dissevered from such New Parishes and shall be annexed to and shall in future form part of the said New Parish of Emmanuel, Lockwood; (fifthly) all that portion of the said New Parish of Emmanuel, Lockwood, which is described in the Fifth Schedule hereunder written and is delineated and set forth upon the said map or plan hereunto annexed and is thereon coloured yellow shall be dissevered from such new Parish and shall be annexed to and shall in future form part of the said New Parish of Rashcliffe; (sixthly) all that portion of the said New Parish of the Holy Trinity, South Crosland, which is described in the Sixth Schedule hereunder written and is delineated and set forth upon the said map or plan hereunto annexed and is thereon coloured orange shall be dissevered from such New Parish and shall be annexed to and shall in future form part of the said New Parish of Saint Paul, Armitage Bridge, and (seventhly) all those portions of the Parish of Almondbury, in the said County and Diocese, and of the said New Parish of Saint Paul, Armitage Bridge, which are described in the Seventh Schedule hereunder written and are delineated and set forth upon the said map or plan hereunto annexed and are thereon coloured green shall be dissevered from such Parish and New Parish respectively and shall be annexed to and shall in future form part of the said New Parish of Saint John the Evangelist, Newsome.

" And we further represent, recommend and propose that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from representing recommending or proposing any other measures relating to the matters aforesaid or any of them in accordance with the provisions of the hereinbefore mentioned Acts or of any of them or of any other Act of Parliament.

" THE SCHEDULES to which the foregoing Scheme or Representation has reference.

" The First Schedule.

" The territory to be dissevered from the New Parish of Saint Luke, Milns Bridge, in the County of York and in the Diocese of Wakefield, and to be annexed to the New Parish of Christ Church, Linthwaite, in the said County and Diocese, being:—

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His said Council, is pleased hereby to ratify the said Scheme or Representation, and to order and direct that the same and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the time when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Acts.

And His Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the said Diocese of Wakefield.

Majesty Queen Victoria, Chapter 94, of the Act of the 13th and 14th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 94, and of the Act of the 32nd and 33rd years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 94, have prepared, and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council, the following Scheme or Representation for altering the boundaries of the New Parish of Saint Mary, Hunslet, of the New Parish of Saint Peter, Hunslet Moor, and of the New Parish of the Holy Spirit, Beeston Hill, all in the County of York and in the Diocese of Ripon:

"Whereas a separate District for spiritual purposes has been constituted and annexed to the Church of Saint Mary, Hunslet, a District Chapelry has been assigned to the Church of Saint Peter, Hunslet Moor, and a Consolidated Chapelry has been assigned to the Church of the Holy Spirit, Beeston Hill, by the Orders in Council, the dates of which are stated in the third column of the following Table:—

"And whereas it has been represented to us and it appears to us to be expedient that the boundaries of the said New Parishes should be altered in the manner which is hereinafter mentioned:

"Now, therefore, with the consent of the Right Reverend Geoffrey, Bishop of Ripon (in testimony whereof he has signed and sealed this Scheme or Representation), we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, humbly represent recommend and propose that from and after the day of the date of the publication in the London Gazette of any Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this Scheme or Representation and without any assurance in the law other than such duly gazetted Order the boundaries of the said New Parish of Saint Mary, Hunslet, of the said New Parish of Saint Peter, Hunslet Moor, and of the said New Parish of the Holy Spirit, Beeston Hill, shall be altered so that (first) all those portions of the said New Parish of Saint Mary, Hunslet, and of the said New Parish of the Holy Spirit, Beeston Hill, which are described in the First Schedule hereunder written and are delineated and set forth upon the map or plan hereunto annexed and are thereon coloured pink shall be dissevered from such New Parishes and shall be annexed to and shall in future form part of the said New Parish of Saint Peter, Hunslet Moor, and

(secondly) all that portion of the said New Parish of Saint Peter, Hunslet Moor, which is described in the Second Schedule hereunder written and is delineated and set forth upon the said map or plan hereunto annexed and is thereon coloured green shall be dissevered from such New Parish and shall be annexed to and shall in future form part of the said New Parish of Saint Mary, Hunslet.

"And we further represent, recommend and propose that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from representing, recommending or proposing any other measures relating to the matters aforesaid or any of them in accordance with the provisions of the hereinbefore mentioned Acts or of any of them or of any other Act of Parliament.

"THE SCHEDULES to which the foregoing Scheme or Representation has reference.

" THE FIRST SCHEDULE.

"The territory to be annexed to the New Parish of Saint Peter, Hunslet Moor, in the County of York and in the Diocese of Ripon, comprising:—

"I. All that portion of the New Parish of Saint Mary, Hunslet, in the said County and Diocese, which is bounded upon the north by the said New Parish of Saint Peter, Hunslet Moor, upon the west by the New Parish of the Holy Spirit, Beeston Hill, in the said County and Diocese, and upon the remaining side, that is to say, upon the south-east, by an imaginary line commencing upon the boundary which divides the said New Parish of the Holy Spirit, Beeston Hill, from the said New Parish of Saint Mary, Hunslet, at the junction of Dewsbury Road and Garnet Road, and extending thence north-eastward along the middle of Garnet Road for a distance of 18 chains or thereabouts to the boundary which divides the said New

Parish of Saint Mary, Hunslet, from the said New Parish of Saint Peter, Hunslet Moor.

" II. And also all that portion of the said New Parish of the Holy Spirit, Beeston Hill, which is bounded upon the east and upon the north by the said New Parish of Saint Peter, Hunslet Moor, and upon the remaining sides, that is to say, upon the west and upon the south, by an imaginary line commencing upon the boundary which divides the said New Parish of Saint Peter, Hunslet Moor, from the said New Parish of the Holy Spirit, Beeston Hill, at the junction of Rowland Road with Lady Pit Lane, and extending thence southward along the middle of Lady Pit Lane for a distance of 11 chains or thereabouts to its junction with Trentham Street, and extending thence north-eastward along the middle of Trentham Street for a distance of 2 chains or thereabouts to its junction with Rowland Place upon the boundary which divides the said New Parish of the Holy Spirit, Beeston Hill, from the said New Parish of Saint Peter, Hunslet Moor.

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His said Council, is pleased hereby to ratify the said Scheme or Representation, and to order and direct that the same and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the time when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Acts.

And His Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the said Diocese of Ripon.

" Whereas we are satisfied that the said Parish of Acomb is a Cure wherein or in part whereof the provision for public worship and for pastoral superintendence is insufficient for the spiritual wants of the inhabitants thereof and it has been made to appear to us that it would promote the interests of religion that the particular part of the said Parish of Acomb which is hereinafter mentioned and described should be constituted a separate District in the manner which is hereinafter set forth:

" And whereas there is not at present within the limits of the said proposed separate District any consecrated Church or Chapel in use for the purposes of Divine Worship:

" And whereas we have agreed to make and pay out of the Common Fund created by the firstly herein mentioned Act a grant of £270 per annum to the Minister of the said proposed separate District so soon as a Minister shall have been duly licensed in accordance with the provisions of the secondly herein mentioned Act and to his successors:

" Now, therefore, with the consent of the Right Honourable and Most Reverend William, Archbishop of York (in testimony whereof he has signed and sealed this Scheme), we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, humbly recommend and propose that all that part of the said Parish of Acomb, which is described in the Schedule hereunder written, all which part together with the boundaries thereof is delineated and set forth on the map or plan hereunto annexed, shall, upon and from the day of the date of the publication in the London Gazette of any Order of Your Majesty

in Council ratifying this Scheme as aforesaid, become and be constituted a separate District for spiritual purposes and that the same shall be named 'The District of the Holy Redeemer, Acomb'.

"And we further recommend and propose that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from recommending and proposing any other measures relating to the matters aforesaid or any of them in accordance with the provisions of the said Acts or of any of them or of any other Act of Parliament.

"THE SCHEDULE to which the foregoing Scheme has reference,

"The District of the Holy Redeemer, Acomb, being:—

"All that part of the Parish of Acomb, in the County of York and in the Diocese of York, which is bounded upon the south-east partly by the New Parish of Saint Paul, York, and partly by the New Parish of Saint Barnabas, York, upon the north-east by the New Parish of Saint Philip and Saint James, Clifton, upon the north-west partly by the Parish of Nether Poppleton, partly by the Parish of Saint Mary Bishophill Junior, and partly by a detached portion of the Parish of Trinity Micklegate, upon the west partly by the said detached portion of the Parish of Trinity Micklegate, and partly by the Parish of Knapton, all in the said County and Diocese, and upon the remaining side, that is to say, upon the south, by an imaginary line commencing upon the boundary which divides the said Parish of Knapton from the said Parish of Acomb at a point opposite to the western end of the wall or fence forming the southern boundary of the premises attached to the Beckfield Lane Infectious Diseases Hospital, and extending thence eastward to and along the said wall or fence for a distance of $12\frac{1}{4}$ chains or thereabouts to the point where it reaches the western side of Beckfield Lane, and extending thence first eastward to and then southward along the middle of Beckfield Lane for a distance of $2\frac{1}{4}$ chains or thereabouts to a point opposite to the western end of the wall or fence forming the southern boundary of the close numbered 80 upon the Ordnance Survey Map of the Civil Parish of Acomb published in the year 1931 on the scale of 25 inches to a mile and also upon the map or plan annexed to this Scheme, and extending thence first eastward to the said wall or fence and then first eastward and then south-eastward along such wall or fence and along the walls or fences forming the southern boundary of the closes numbered 81, 82 and 98 upon the said maps for a distance of $39\frac{1}{2}$ chains or thereabouts to the point where the wall or fence forming the southern boundary of the said close numbered 98 reaches the north-western side of Carr Lane, and extending thence first south-eastward to and then north-eastward along the middle of Carr Lane for a distance of $6\frac{1}{4}$ chains or thereabouts to a point opposite to the north-western end of the wall or fence forming the northern boundary of the house and premises known as Number 121 Carr Lane, and extending thence south-eastward to and along such wall or fence and along the walls or fences forming the northern boundary of the houses and premises situate on the northern side of Inman Terrace and at the northern end of Severus Avenue for

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His said Council, is pleased hereby to ratify the said Scheme, and to order and direct that the same and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the time when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Acts.

And His Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the said Diocese of York.

"We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, acting in pursuance of the Union of Benefices Measures, 1923 to 1936, have prepared, and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council, the following Scheme for effecting the union of the Benefice (being a Rectory) of Clippesby and the Benefice (being an United Benefice) of Ashby with Oby and Thurne, both of which Benefices are situate in the County of Norfolk and in the Diocese of Norwich:

"Whereas Commissioners appointed at our request by the Right Reverend Bertram, Bishop of Norwich, pursuant to the provisions of the Union of Benefices Measure, 1923, to inquire into and report upon the union of the said two

Benefices of Clippesby and Ashby with Oby and Thurne duly made their Report to the said Bishop of Norwich and therein recommended the union of the said two Benefices and the terms for effecting the union, and the said Bishop of Norwich signified in writing his approval of the said Report:

"And whereas we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, have prepared this Scheme for the union of the said two Benefices based upon the terms recommended in the said Report:

"And whereas both of the said two Benefices of Clippesby and Ashby with Oby and Thurne are now full being held together in plurality by the Reverend William James Hughes Sinnott Davies under the authority of a Dispensation:

"Now, therefore, we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, with the consent of the said Bertram, Bishop of Norwich (in testimony whereof he has signed this Scheme), do humbly recommend and propose to Your Majesty as follows, that is to say:—

"1. That the said Benefice of Clippesby and the said Benefice of Ashby with Oby and Thurne shall be permanently united together and form one Benefice with Cure of Souls under the style of 'The United Benefice of Ashby and Oby with Thurne and Clippesby' but the Parishes of the said Benefices shall continue distinct in all respects.

"2. That if upon the day when any Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this Scheme shall be published in the London Gazette both of the said two Benefices shall be vacant the union of the same two Benefices shall take effect forthwith; and if one only of the said two Benefices shall be then vacant the said union shall take effect upon the next avoidance of the other of the said two Benefices; and if neither of the said two Benefices be then vacant the said union shall take effect upon the next avoidance of that one of the said two Benefices which shall last be avoided after the date of the publication in the London Gazette of any Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this Scheme.

"3. That upon the said union taking effect the Parsonage House at present belonging to the said Benefice of Ashby with Oby and Thurne shall become and be the house of residence for the Incumbent of the United Benefice.

"4. That after the said union has taken effect the course and succession in which the respective Patrons shall present or nominate to the United Benefice from time to time as the same shall become vacant shall be as follows, that is to say, that in every series of three successive turns of presentation or nomination to be made to the United Benefice after the union the Patron of the said Benefice of Ashby with Oby and Thurne shall have the first and the second turns and the Patrons of the said Benefice of Clippesby shall have the third turn.

"5. That subject as hereinafter provided, upon the union taking effect, a part of the total endowments of the Benefices hereinbefore recommended and proposed to be constituted an United Benefice, that is to say a part, now producing £100 per annum, of the sum of money appropriated by Queen Anne's Bounty

to the said Benefices of Clippesby and Ashby with Oby and Thurne pursuant to the provisions of Part II paragraph 2 of the Third Schedule to the Tithe Act, 1936, and of paragraph 1 of the Eighth Schedule to the same Act shall be severed or diverted from the said Benefices of Clippesby and Ashby with Oby and Thurne and from the United Benefice and shall be appropriated by Queen Anne's Bounty as to £67 per annum for the augmentation of the Benefice of Claxton with Carleton and as to the remaining £33 per annum for the augmentation of the Benefice of Coston with Runhall, both in the said Diocese of Norwich.

"Provided always that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from making any other recommendations and proposals relating to the matters aforesaid, or any of them, in accordance with the provisions of the said Measures, or of any other Measure of the National Assembly of the Church of England, or of any Act of Parliament."

And whereas drafts of the said Scheme have been duly published in accordance with the provisions of the said Measures, and Notices have been transmitted to the persons or bodies entitled under the said Measure to receive Notice requiring any objections to such draft Scheme to be stated or transmitted in writing to the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners within the time prescribed in the Statutory Rules applicable to proceedings under the said Measures:

And whereas public notice of the certification to His Majesty in Council of the said Scheme and the consent thereto in writing of the Bishop of Norwich has been duly given in the manner and within the time prescribed in the Statutory Rules aforesaid:

And whereas no appeal has been proceeded with to His Majesty in Council within the period of one month after the date of the said public notice in accordance with the provisions of the said Measures against the said Scheme or any part thereof by any person who has made objection as aforesaid to the said draft Scheme:

And whereas the said Scheme has been approved by His Majesty in Council:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His said Council, is pleased hereby to affirm the said Scheme and to order that the Benefices therein recommended to be united shall be united to the extent and for the purposes recommended in the said Scheme and further to order and direct that the said Scheme and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the date when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Measures.

And His Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the said Diocese of Norwich.

"Whereas by the authority of an Order of Her said late Majesty in Council bearing date the 19th day of July, 1870, and published in the London Gazette on the 22nd day of the same month, a District Chapelry was assigned to the consecrated Church of Saint John the Evangelist situate in the Parish of Hollington, in the said County and Diocese, and the said District Chapelry was named 'The District Chapelry of Saint John the Evangelist, Hollington':

"And whereas by the authority of an Instrument bearing date the 21st day of July, 1881, and being under our Common Seal and under the hand and seal of the Right Reverend Richard, then Bishop of Chichester, which Instrument was published in the London Gazette on the 2nd day of August, 1881, a part of the Parish of Saint Mary-in-the-Castle, in the said County and Diocese, was assigned as a Particular District to the consecrated Church called Christ Church, Blacklands, and the said Particular District was called 'The Particular District of Christ Church, Blacklands':

"And whereas it has been represented to us, and it appears to us to be expedient that the boundaries of the said New Parish of Saint John the Evangelist, Hollington, and of the said New Parish of Christ Church, Blacklands, should be altered in the manner which is hereinafter mentioned:

"Now, therefore, with the consent of the Right Reverend George, Bishop of Chichester (in testimony whereof he has signed and sealed this Scheme or Representation), we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, humbly represent, recommend and propose that from and after the day of the date of the publication in the London Gazette of an Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this Scheme or Representation and without any assurance in the law other than such duly gazetted Order the boundaries of the said New Parish of Saint John the Evangelist, Hollington, and of the said New Parish of Christ Church, Blacklands, shall be altered so that all those portions of the Parish of Ore, in the said County and Diocese and of the said New Parish of Saint John the Evangelist, Hollington, which are described in the Schedule hereunder written and are delineated and set forth upon the map or plan hereunto annexed and are thereon coloured pink shall be dissevered from such Parish and New Parish respectively and shall be annexed to and shall in future form part of the said New Parish of Christ Church, Blacklands.

"And we further represent, recommend and propose that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from representing, recommending and proposing any other measures relating to the matters aforesaid or any of them in accordance with the provisions of the hereinbefore mentioned Acts or of any of them or of any other Act of Parliament.

"THE SCHEDULE to which the foregoing Scheme or Representation has reference.

"The territory to be annexed to the New Parish of Christ Church, Blacklands, in the County of Sussex and in the Diocese of Chichester, comprising:—

"I. And also all those contiguous portions of the New Parish of Saint John the Evangelist, Hollington, in the said County and Diocese, and of the said Parish of Ore which, taken together, are bounded upon the east and upon the south-east by the said New Parish of Christ Church, Blacklands, upon the south-west by the Parish of Saint Matthew (Silverhill) in the said County and Diocese and upon the remaining side, that is to say, upon the north, by an imaginary line commencing at the point south of Buckshole Reservoir where the boundary which divides the said Parish of Saint Matthew (Silverhill) from the said New Parish of Saint John the Evangelist, Hollington, diverges northward from following the middle of Old Roar Stream, and extending thence north-eastward in a straight line for a distance of $3\frac{1}{2}$ chains or thereabouts to a point in the middle of Saint Helen's Road opposite to the western end of the wall or fence forming the boundary

between the houses and premises known as Number 153 and Number 152 Saint Helen's Road and extending thence eastward to and along the said wall or fence for a distance of $3\frac{1}{4}$ chains or thereabouts to the point where it meets the wall or fence forming the western boundary of the house and premises known as Number 75 Park View, and extending thence first northward and then eastward along the walls or fences forming the western and northern boundaries of the last mentioned house and premises for a distance of $2\frac{1}{4}$ chains or thereabouts to the point where the last mentioned wall or fence reaches the western side of Park View, and extending thence north-eastward across Park View to and along the wall or fence forming the northern boundary of the houses and premises situate on the northern side of Park Crescent for a distance in all of $8\frac{1}{2}$ chains to the north-eastern corner of the house and premises known as Number 14, Park Crescent, and extending thence first north-eastward and then south-eastward along the walls or fences forming the southern boundary of the closes numbered 492, 493 and 501 upon the said maps for a distance of $15\frac{1}{2}$ chains or thereabouts to the south-eastern corner of the said close numbered 501, and extending thence in a straight line due east for a distance of 17 yards or thereabouts to a point in the middle of the stream which runs past the western side of the closes numbered 503, 505 and 506 upon the said maps, and extending thence first northward and then north-eastward along the middle of the said stream for a distance of $13\frac{1}{2}$ chains or thereabouts to a point opposite to the western end of the wall or fence forming the northern boundary of the said close numbered 506, and extending thence south-eastward to and along such wall or fence (thereby crossing the boundary which divides the said New Parish of Saint John the Evangelist, Hollington, from the said Parish of Ore) for a distance of $5\frac{1}{4}$ chains or thereabouts to the point where it meets the wall or fence forming the north-western boundary of an occupation road leading into Hillside Road, and extending thence first south-eastward to and then north-eastward along the middle of the said occupation road for a distance of $1\frac{1}{2}$ chains or thereabouts to its junction with Hillside Road, and extending thence southward along the middle of Hillside Road for a distance of $1\frac{1}{4}$ chains or thereabouts to the boundary which divides the said Parish of Ore from the said New Parish of Christ Church, Blacklands."

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His said Council, is pleased hereby to ratify the said Scheme or Representation, and to order and direct that the same and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the time when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Acts.

And His Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the said Diocese of Chichester.

" The territory to be annexed to the Parish of Stivichall, in the County of Warwick and in the Diocese of Coventry, comprising:—

" I. Now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His said Council, is pleased hereby to affirm the said Scheme and to order that the Benefices therein recommended to be united shall be united to the extent and for the purposes recommended in the said Scheme and further to order and direct that the said Scheme and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the date when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Measures.

And His Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the said Diocese of Coventry.

“ All that portion of the said New Parish of Saint John the Evangelist, Bromley, which is bounded upon the north by the New Parish of Saint Augustine, Grove Park, Lee, in the said County of Kent and in the Diocese of Southwark, upon the west by the said New
