WHEREAS the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England have, in pursuance of the Union of Benefices Measures, 1923 to 1936, duly prepared, and laid before His Majesty in Council a Scheme bearing date the 24th day of November, 1938, in the words and figures following, that is to say:—

“ We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, acting in pursuance of the Union of Benefices Measures, 1923 to 1936, have prepared, and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council, the following Scheme for effecting the union of the Benefice (being a Vicarage) of Everton and the Benefice (being a Vicarage) of Mattersey, both of which Benefices are situate in the County of Nottingham and in the Diocese of Southwell:

“ Whereas Commissioners appointed at our request by the Right Reverend Henry, Bishop of Southwell, pursuant to the provisions of the said Measures to inquire into and report upon the union of the said two Benefices of Everton and Mattersey duly made their Report to the said Bishop of Southwell and therein recommended the union of the said two Benefices and the terms for effecting the union, and the said Bishop of Southwell signified in writing his approval of the said Report:

“ And whereas we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, have prepared this Scheme for the union of the said two Benefices which Scheme is based upon the terms recommended in the said Report but with the assent of the said Bishop of Southwell embodies certain modifications thereof:

“ And whereas both of the said Benefices of Everton and Mattersey are now full the Reverend Frederick Bray Wardle being the present Incumbent of the said Benefice of Everton and the Reverend Robert John Andrew Simmons being the present Incumbent of the said Benefice of Mattersey:

“ Now, therefore, we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, with the consent of the said Henry, Bishop of Southwell (in testimony whereof he has signed this Scheme), do humbly recommend and propose to Your Majesty as follows, that is to say:—

“ 1. That the said Benefice of Everton and the said Benefice of Mattersey shall be permanently united together and form one Benefice with Cure of Souls under the style of ‘ The United Benefice of Everton with Mattersey ’ and that such United Benefice shall be included in and form part of the Rural Deanery of Bawtry but the Parishes of the said Benefices shall continue distinct in all respects.

“ 2. That if upon the day when any Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this Scheme shall be published in the London Gazette both of the said two Benefices shall be vacant the union of the same two Benefices shall take effect forthwith; and if one only of the said two Benefices shall be then vacant the said union shall take effect upon the next avoidance of the other of the said two Benefices; and if neither of the said two Benefices be then vacant the said union shall take effect upon the next avoidance of that one of the said two Benefices which shall last be avoided after the date of the

publication in the London Gazette of any Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this Scheme.

“ 3. That upon the said union taking effect the Parsonage House at present belonging to the said Benefice of Everton shall become and be the house of residence for the Incumbent of the United Benefice and so soon as conveniently may be the Parsonage House at present belonging to the said Benefice of Mattersey and the site and appurtenances thereof and the grounds heretofore usually occupied and enjoyed therewith shall be sold and disposed of by us the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners at such time or times and in such manner in all respects as to us shall seem expedient and that out of the net proceeds of the said sale such a sum as shall be approved by us, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners and the Bishop of Southwell shall be applied towards the cost of improving the Parsonage House of the United Benefice, and the residue of such net proceeds shall constitute and form part of the Expenses Fund established pursuant to the 32nd Section of the Union of Benefices Measure, 1923.

“ 4. That after the said union has taken effect the course and succession in which the respective Patrons shall present or nominate to the United Benefice from time to time as the same shall become vacant shall be as follows, that is to say, the right of presentation shall be exercised by the Patrons of the said two Benefices alternately, and if under any of the provisions of Clause 2 of this Scheme an Incumbent of the said Benefice of Everton shall become the first Incumbent of the United Benefice then the Patron of the said Benefice of Mattersey shall have the first turn of presentation or nomination to the United Benefice after the union but otherwise the first turn shall belong to the Patron of the said Benefice of Everton.

“ Provided always that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from making any other recommendations and proposals relating to the matters aforesaid, or any of them, in accordance with the provisions of the said Measures, or of any other Measure of the National Assembly of the Church of England, or of any Act of Parliament.”

And whereas drafts of the said Scheme have been duly published in accordance with the provisions of the said Measures and Notices have been transmitted to the persons or bodies entitled under the said Measures to receive Notice requiring any objections to such draft Scheme to be stated or transmitted in writing to the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners within the time prescribed in the Statutory Rules applicable to proceedings under the said Measures:

And whereas certain objections have been so stated or transmitted to the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners within the time prescribed in the same Rules:

And whereas the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners after giving full consideration to such objections have deemed right to make certain alterations in such draft Scheme:

And whereas public notice of the certification to His Majesty in Council of the said Scheme and the consent thereto in writing of the Bishop of Southwell has been duly given in the manner and within the time prescribed in the Statutory Rules aforesaid:

And whereas no appeal has been made to His Majesty in Council within the period of one month after the date of the said public notice in accordance with the provisions of the said Measures against the said Scheme or any part thereof by any person who has made objection as aforesaid to the said draft Scheme:

And whereas the said Scheme has been approved by His Majesty in Council:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His said Council, is pleased hereby to affirm the said Scheme and to order that the Benefices therein recommended to be united shall be united to the extent and for the purposes recommended in the said Scheme and further to order and direct that the said Scheme and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the date when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Measures.

And His Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the said Diocese of Southwell.

“ We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, acting under the provisions of the Act of the 7th and 8th years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, Chapter 94, of the Act of the 13th and 14th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 94, and of the Act of the 32nd and 33rd years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 94, have prepared, and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council, the following Scheme or Representation for altering the boundaries of the New Parish of Lindley, of the New Parish of Longwood, of the New Parish of the Holy Trinity, Huddersfield, of the New Parish of Saint John the Evangelist, Bay Hall, and of the New Parish of Saint Philip the Apostle, Birchencliffe, all in the County of York and in the Diocese of Wakefield:

“ Whereas a Chapelry District has been assigned to each of the Churches of Saint Stephen, Lindley; Saint Mark, Longwood; All Saints, Paddock; and the Holy Trinity, Huddersfield, and a Consolidated Chapelry has been assigned to the Church of Saint Philip the Apostle, Birchencliffe, by the Orders in Council, the dates of which are stated in the 3rd Column of the following Table:—

“And whereas by the authority of an Instrument bearing date the 19th day of February, 1855, and being under the Common Seal of the late Church Building Commissioners and under the hand and seal of the Right Reverend Charles Thomas, then Bishop of Ripon, a Particular District was assigned to the consecrated Church of Saint John the Evangelist, Bay Hall, and such Particular District was known as the Particular District of Saint John the Evangelist, Bay Hall:

“ And whereas the said Chapelry District of Lindley, the said Chapelry District of Longwood, the said Chapelry District of Paddock, the said Chapelry District of the Holy Trinity, Huddersfield, the said Consolidated Chapelry of Saint Philip the Apostle, Birchencliffe, and the said Particular District of Saint John the Evangelist, Bay Hall, have become New Parishes of the character contemplated by the Act of the 6th and 7th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 37, by the Act of the 19th and 20th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 104, and by the above-mentioned Act of the 32nd and 33rd years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 94:

“ And whereas it has been represented to us and it appears to us to be expedient that the boundaries of the said New Parishes should be altered in the manner which is hereinafter mentioned:

“ Now, therefore, with the consent of the Right Reverend Campbell Richard, Bishop of Wakefield (in testimony whereof he has signed and sealed this Scheme or Representation), we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, humbly represent recommend and propose that from and after the day of the date of the publication in the London Gazette of any Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this Scheme or Representation and without any assurance in the law other than such duly gazetted Order the boundaries of the said New Parish of Lindley, of the said New Parish of Longwood, of the said New Parish of Paddock, of the said new Parish of the Holy Trinity, Huddersfield, of the said New Parish of Saint Philip the Apostle, Birchencliffe, and of the said New Parish of Saint John the Evangelist, Bay Hall, shall be altered so that (first) all those portions of the Parish of Elland, in the said County and Diocese, and of the said New Parish of the Holy

Trinity, Huddersfield, which are described in the First Schedule hereunder written and are delineated and set forth upon the map or plan hereunto annexed and are thereon coloured green shall be dissevered from such Parish and New Parish respectively and shall be annexed to and shall in future form part of the said New Parish of Saint John the Evangelist, Bay Hall; (secondly) all that portion of the said New Parish of Paddock, which is described in the Second Schedule hereunder written and is delineated and set forth upon the said map or plan hereunto annexed and is thereon coloured purple shall be dissevered from such New Parish and shall be annexed to and shall in future form part of the said New Parish of the Holy Trinity, Huddersfield; (thirdly) all that portion of the said New Parish of Lindley which is described in the Third Schedule hereunder written and is delineated and set forth upon the said map or plan hereunto annexed and is thereon coloured blue shall be dissevered from such New Parish and shall be annexed to and shall in future form part of the said New Parish of Paddock; (fourthly) all that portion of the said New Parish of Lindley which is described in the Fourth Schedule hereunder written and is delineated and set forth upon the said map or plan hereunto annexed and is thereon coloured brown shall be dissevered from such New Parish and shall be annexed to and shall in future form part of the said New Parish of Longwood; (fifthly) all that portion of the said New Parish of Saint Philip the Apostle, Birchencliffe, which is described in the Fifth Schedule hereunder written and is delineated and set forth upon the said map or plan hereunto annexed and is thereon coloured pink shall be dissevered from such New Parish and shall be annexed to and shall in future form part of the said New Parish of Lindley; and (sixthly) all that portion of the said Parish of Elland which is described in the Sixth Schedule hereunder written and is delineated and set forth upon the said map or plan hereunto annexed and is thereon coloured yellow shall be dissevered from such Parish and shall be annexed to and shall in future form part of the said New Parish of Saint Philip the Apostle, Birchencliffe.

“ And we further represent, recommend and propose that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from representing, recommending or proposing any other measures relating to the matters aforesaid or any of them in accordance with the provisions of the hereinbefore mentioned Acts or of any of them or of any other Act of Parliament.

“ THE SCHEDULES to which the foregoing Scheme or Representation has reference.

“ The First Schedule.

“ The territory to be annexed to the New Parish of Saint John the Evangelist, Bay Hall, in the County of York and in the Diocese of Wakefield, being:—

“ I. All that portion of the Parish of Elland, in the said County and Diocese, which is bounded upon all sides as follows, that is to say, upon the south and upon the east by the said New Parish of Saint John the Evangelist, Bay Hall, upon the north-east by the New Parish of Saint Thomas, Bradley, upon the north and upon part of the west by the

New Parish of Rastrick, both in the said County and Diocese, and upon the remaining part of the west by an imaginary line commencing at the point where the boundary which divides the said New Parish of Rastrick from the said Parish of Elland diverges westward from following the western side of Cowcliffe Road, and extending thence generally southward along the western side of Cowcliffe Road for a distance of 41 chains or thereabouts to the boundary which divides the said Parish of Elland from the said New Parish of Saint John the Evangelist, Bay Hall.

“ II. And also all that portion of the New Parish of the Holy Trinity, Huddersfield, in the said County and Diocese, which is bounded upon the north and upon the east by the said New Parish of Saint John the Evangelist, Bay Hall, upon the south by the Parish of Huddersfield, in the said County and Diocese, and upon the remaining side, that is to say, upon the west, by an imaginary line commencing upon the boundary which divides the said Parish of Huddersfield from the said New Parish of the Holy Trinity, Huddersfield, at the junction of Fitzwilliam Street and Claremont Street, and extending thence northward along the middle of Claremont Street and in a straight line in continuation thereof for a distance of 22½ chains or thereabouts to the boundary which divides the said New Parish of the Holy Trinity, Huddersfield, from the said New Parish of Saint John the Evangelist, Bay Hall.

“ III. And also all that other portion of the said New Parish of the Holy Trinity, Huddersfield, which is bounded upon the north, upon the north-east, and upon part of the south-east by the said New Parish of Saint John the Evangelist, Bay Hall, and upon the remaining sides, that is to say, upon the remaining part of the south-east and upon the south-west, by an imaginary line commencing at the point where the boundary which divides the said New Parish of Saint John the Evangelist, Bay Hall, from the said New Parish of the Holy Trinity, Huddersfield, diverges south-eastward from following the middle of Blacker Road, and extending thence south-westward along the middle of Blacker Road for a distance of 5½ chains or thereabouts to a point opposite to the south-eastern end of the wall or fence forming the south-western boundary of the houses and premises situate on the western side of Spinkfield Road, and extending thence north-westward to and along such wall or fence for a distance of 8 chains or thereabouts to the boundary which divides the said New Parish of the Holy Trinity, Huddersfield, from the said New Parish of Saint John the Evangelist, Bay Hall.

“ The Second Schedule.

“ The territory to be dissevered from the New Parish of Paddock, in the said County and Diocese, and to be annexed to the said New Parish of the Holy Trinity, Huddersfield, being:—

“ All that portion of the said New Parish of Paddock which is bounded upon the south by the New Parish of Saint Thomas, Huddersfield, in the said County and Diocese, upon the east by the said Parish of Huddersfield, upon the north by the said New Parish of the Holy Trinity, Huddersfield, and upon the remaining side, that is to say, upon the west, by an imaginary line commencing upon the boundary

which divides the said New Parish of the Holy Trinity, Huddersfield, from the said New Parish of Paddock at a point in the middle of Greenhead Road opposite to the northern end of the wall or fence forming the eastern boundary of the premises attached to Springwood Hall, and extending thence southward to and along such wall or fence for a distance of $15\frac{1}{2}$ chains or thereabouts to the point where it reaches the northern side of the footpath leading across the Huddersfield and Penistone Branch Line of the London Midland and Scottish Railway and extending thence first southward to and then eastward along the middle of such footpath for a distance of 2 chains or thereabouts to the boundary which divides the said New Parish of Paddock from the said New Parish of Saint Thomas, Huddersfield.

“ All that portion of the said New Parish of Lindley, which is bounded upon the east by the said New Parish of Paddock, upon the south by the New Parish of Longwood, in the said County and Diocese, and upon the remaining sides, that is to say, upon the south-west, upon the west and upon the north, by an imaginary line commencing upon the boundary which divides the said New Parish of Longwood from the said New Parish of Lindley at the junction of Longwood Road with Quarmby Road, and extending thence north-westward along the middle of Quarmby Road for a distance of 31 chains or thereabouts to its junction with Reinwood Road, and extending thence first north-eastward and then eastward along the middle of Reinwood Road for a distance of 15 chains or thereabouts to a point opposite to the north-western end of the wall or fence forming the southern boundary of the premises attached to the house known as Rein Wood, and extending thence first south-eastward to and then first south-eastward, then north-eastward and then again south-eastward along such wall or fence and along the wall or fence in continuation thereof for a distance in all of $34\frac{1}{2}$ chains or thereabouts to the boundary which divides the said New Parish of Lindley from the said New Parish of Paddock.

south-westward along the middle of Haughs Lane for a distance of $34\frac{1}{2}$ chains or thereabouts to its junction with the road called Longwood Edge, and extending thence south-westward for a distance of 6 yards or thereabouts to the boundary which divides the said New Parish of Lindley from the said New Parish of Longwood.

“ The Sixth Schedule.

“ The territory to be annexed to the New Parish of Saint Philip the Apostle, Birchencliffe, being:—

“ All that portion of the said Parish of Elland, which is bounded upon the south by the said New Parish of Saint Philip the Apostle, Birchencliffe, and upon the remaining sides, that is to say, upon the north-west and upon the north, by an imaginary line commencing at the point where the boundary which divides the said New Parish of Saint Philip the Apostle, Birchencliffe, diverges south-eastward from following the middle of Ainley Lane, and extending thence north-eastward along the middle of Ainley Lane for a distance of $10\frac{1}{2}$ chains or thereabouts to its junction with the roadway and footpath leading to Johns Lane, and extending thence north-eastward in a straight line for a distance of 14 chains or thereabouts to the junction of Huddersfield Road and Branch Road, and extending thence south-eastward in a straight line for a distance of 33 chains or thereabouts to the junction of New Hey Road and Bryan Lane upon the boundary which divides the said Parish of Elland from the said New Parish of Saint Philip the Apostle, Birchencliffe.”

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His said Council, is pleased hereby to ratify the said Scheme or Representation, and to order and direct that the same and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the time when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Acts.

And His Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the said Diocese of Wakefield.

“ And whereas the said District of Little Holbeck, the said District of Pottery Field, the said District of Brewery Field, and the said District Chapelry of Christ Church, Leeds, are New Parishes of the character contemplated by the Act of the 6th and 7th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 37, by the Act of the 19th and 20th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 104, and by the above mentioned Act of the 32nd and 33rd years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 94:

“ And whereas under the provisions of the Leeds Churches Act, 1901, the said New Parish of Little Holbeck and the said New Parish of Brewery Field were united into one ecclesiastical Parish by the name of ‘ The United Parish of Saint John the Evangelist and Saint Barnabas, Leeds ’:

“ And whereas by the authority of an Order of Your Majesty in Council bearing date the 13th day of April, 1937, and published in the London Gazette on the 16th day of the same month the said New Parish of Christ Church, Leeds, and the said United Parish of Saint John the Evangelist with Saint Barnabas, Leeds, were united into one Parish for ecclesiastical purposes and the same is now called the United Parish of Christ Church, Leeds, with Saint John and Saint Barnabas, Holbeck:

“ And whereas it has been represented to us, and it appears to us to be expedient that the boundaries of the said New Parish of Christ Church, Leeds, with Saint John and Saint Barnabas, Holbeck, and the said New Parish

of Pottery Field (or Saint Jude, Hunslet) should be altered in the manner which is hereinafter mentioned:

“ Now, therefore, with the consent of the Right Reverend Geoffrey, Bishop of Ripon (in testimony whereof he has signed and sealed this Scheme or Representation), we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, humbly represent recommend and propose that from and after the day of the date of the publication in the London Gazette of an Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this Scheme or Representation and without any assurance in the law other than such duly gazetted Order the boundaries of the said New Parish of Christ Church, Leeds, with Saint John and Saint Barnabas, Holbeck, and the said New Parish of Pottery Field (or Saint Jude, Hunslet) shall be altered so that (first) all those portions of the said New Parish of Christ Church, Leeds, with Saint John and Saint Barnabas, Holbeck, which are described in the First Schedule hereunder written and are delineated and set forth upon the map or plan hereunto annexed and are thereon coloured pink shall be dis severed from such New Parish and shall be annexed to and shall in future form part of the said New Parish of Pottery Field (or Saint Jude, Hunslet) and (secondly) all those portions of the said New Parish of Pottery Field (or Saint Jude, Hunslet) which are described in the Second Schedule hereunder written and are delineated and set forth upon the said map or plan hereunto annexed and are thereon coloured green shall be dis severed from such New Parish and shall be annexed to

and shall in future form part of the said New Parish of Christ Church, Leeds, with Saint John and Saint Barnabas, Holbeck.

" And we further represent, recommend and propose that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from representing recommending and proposing any other measures relating to the matters aforesaid or any of them in accordance with the provisions of the hereinbefore mentioned Acts or of any of them or of any other Act of Parliament.

" THE SCHEDULES to which the foregoing Scheme or Representation has reference.

" THE FIRST SCHEDULE.

" The territory to be dissevered from the New Parish of Christ Church, Leeds, with Saint John and Saint Barnabas, Holbeck, in the County of York and in the Diocese of Ripon, and to be annexed to the New Parish of Pottery Field (or Saint Jude, Hunslet) in the same County and Diocese, comprising:—

" I. All that portion of the said New Parish of Christ Church, Leeds, with Saint John and Saint Barnabas, Holbeck, which is bounded upon the west and upon the south by the said New Parish of Pottery Field (or Saint Jude, Hunslet), upon the north-east partly by the New Parish of Saint Saviour, Leeds, and partly by the Parish of Saint Peter, Leeds, both in the said County and Diocese, and upon the remaining sides, that is to say, upon the north-west, by an imaginary line commencing upon the boundary which divides the said Parish of Saint Peter, Leeds, from the said New Parish of Christ Church, Leeds, with Saint John and Saint Barnabas, Holbeck, at the centre of Crown Point Bridge which carries Crown Point Road across the River Aire, and extending thence south-westward along the middle of Crown Point Road for a distance of $13\frac{1}{2}$ chains or thereabouts to its junction with South Brook Street upon the boundary which divides the said New Parish of Christ Church, Leeds, with Saint John and Saint Barnabas, Holbeck, from the said New Parish of Pottery Field (or Saint Jude, Hunslet).

" II. And also all that other portion of the said New Parish of Christ Church, Leeds, with Saint John and Saint Barnabas, Holbeck, which lies to the south of the middle of Junction Street.

" THE SECOND SCHEDULE.

" The territory to be dissevered from the said New Parish of Pottery Field (or Saint Jude, Hunslet) and to be annexed to the said New Parish of Christ Church, Leeds, with Saint John and Saint Barnabas, Holbeck, comprising:—

" I. All that portion of the said New Parish of Pottery Field (or Saint Jude, Hunslet) which is bounded upon the north and upon the west by the said New Parish of Christ Church, Leeds, with Saint John and Saint Barnabas, Holbeck, upon the south by the New Parish of Saint Peter, Hunslet Moor, in the said County and Diocese, and upon the remaining side, that is to say, upon the east by an imaginary line commencing at the point where the boundaries of the said New Parish of Pottery Field (or Saint Jude, Hunslet) of the said New Parish of Saint Peter, Hunslet Moor, and of the New Parish of Saint Mary, Hunslet, in the said County and Diocese, all meet where the Middleton Colliery Railway line crosses the

middle of Jack Lane, and extending thence northward along the middle of the said line of railway for a distance of 28 chains or thereabouts to the boundary which divides the said New Parish of Pottery Field (or Saint Jude, Hunslet) from the said New Parish of Christ Church, Leeds, with Saint John and Saint Barnabas, Holbeck.

" II. And also all that other portion of the said New Parish of Pottery Field (or Saint Jude, Hunslet) which is bounded upon the north by the said New Parish of Christ Church, Leeds, with Saint John and Saint Barnabas, Holbeck, and upon the remaining sides, that is to say, upon the south-west and upon the south-east by an imaginary line commencing at the point where the boundary which divides the said New Parish of Christ Church, Leeds, with Saint John and Saint Barnabas, Holbeck, crosses the middle of Hunslet Lane, and extending thence first southward and then south-eastward along the middle of Hunslet Lane for a distance of $4\frac{1}{2}$ chains or thereabouts to a point opposite to the south-eastern side of Crown Point Road, and extending thence north-eastward to and along the south-eastern side of Crown Point Road for a distance of $11\frac{1}{2}$ chains or thereabouts to a point near its junction with South Brook Street upon the boundary which divides the said New Parish of Pottery Field from the said New Parish of Christ Church, Leeds, with Saint John and Saint Barnabas, Holbeck."

" We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, acting in pursuance of the Union of Benefices Measures, 1923 to 1936, have prepared, and now humbly lay before Your

Majesty in Council, the following Scheme for effecting the union of the Benefice (being a Rectory) of Bittadon and the Benefice (being a Vicarage) of West Down, both of which Benefices are situate in the County of Devon and in the Diocese of Exeter:

"Whereas Commissioners appointed at our request by the late Right Reverend William, Bishop of Exeter, pursuant to the provisions of the Union of Benefices Measure, 1923, to inquire into and report upon the union of the said two Benefices of Bittadon and West Down duly made their Report to the said Bishop of Exeter and therein recommended the union of the said two Benefices and the terms for effecting the union:

"And whereas the Right Reverend Charles, now Bishop of Exeter, has signified in writing his approval of the said Report:

"And whereas we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, have prepared this Scheme for the union of the said two Benefices based upon the terms recommended in the said Report:

"And whereas the said Benefices of Bittadon and West Down are now full the Reverend Dudley William Dunning Phillips being the present Incumbent of the said Benefice of Bittadon and the Reverend Frank Harcourt Germon being the present Incumbent of the said Benefice of West Down:

"And whereas the Patronage of each of the said Benefices of Bittadon and West Down now belongs to one and the same Patron:

"Now, therefore, we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, with the consent of the said Charles, Bishop of Exeter (in testimony whereof he has signed this Scheme), do humbly recommend and propose to Your Majesty as follows, that is to say:—

"1. That the said Benefice of Bittadon and the said Benefice of West Down shall be permanently united together and form one Benefice with Cure of Souls under the style of 'The United Benefice of Bittadon with West Down' but the Parishes of the said Benefices shall continue distinct in all respects.

"2. That if upon the day when any Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this Scheme shall be published in the London Gazette both of the said two Benefices shall be vacant, the union of the same two Benefices shall take effect forthwith; and if one only of the said two Benefices shall be then vacant the said union shall also take effect forthwith if the Incumbent of the other of the said two Benefices shall with the approval of the Bishop consent to become the first Incumbent of the United Benefice, but, if he shall not so consent, or if the Bishop shall not approve then the said union shall take effect upon the next avoidance of his Benefice and the then Incumbent (if any) of the other of the said two Benefices shall be the first Incumbent of the United Benefice; and if neither of the said two Benefices be then vacant then the said union shall take effect on the next avoidance of either of the said two Benefices if the Incumbent at that time of the other of the said two Benefices shall with the approval of the Bishop consent to become the first Incumbent of the United Benefice, but if he shall not so consent or if the Bishop shall not approve then the said union shall take effect immediately upon the next vacancy of his Benefice and the then

Incumbent (if any) of the other of the said two Benefices shall become the first Incumbent of the United Benefice.

"3. That upon the said union taking effect the Parsonage House at present belonging to the said Benefice of West Down shall become and be the house of residence for the Incumbent of the United Benefice.

"Provided always that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from making any other recommendations and proposals relating to the matters aforesaid, or any of them, in accordance with the provisions of the said Measures, or of any other Measure of the National Assembly of the Church of England, or of any Act of Parliament."

And whereas drafts of the said Scheme have been duly published in accordance with the provisions of the said Measures, and Notices have been transmitted to the persons or bodies entitled under the same Measures to receive Notice requiring any objections to such draft Scheme to be stated or transmitted in writing to the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners within the time prescribed in the Statutory Rules applicable to proceedings under the said Measures:

And whereas certain objections have been so stated or transmitted to the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners within the time prescribed in the same Rules:

And whereas the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners after giving full consideration to such objections have deemed right to make no alterations in such draft Scheme:

And whereas public notice of the certification to His Majesty in Council of the said Scheme and the consent thereto in writing of the Bishop of Exeter has been duly given in the manner and within the time prescribed in the Statutory Rules aforesaid:

And whereas an appeal against the said Scheme has been made to His Majesty in Council by Mr. A. M. Gladwell, on behalf of the Churchwardens and Parishioners of Bittadon and West Down, and such appeal was referred to the Judicial Committee of the Privy Council on the 24th day of February, 1938:

And whereas the Lords of the said Committee, having taken the said appeal into consideration, reported to His Majesty in Council that the appeal ought to be dismissed and the said Scheme be approved:

And whereas His Majesty was pleased, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, by Order of the 20th day of December, 1938, to approve the said Report:

And whereas the said Scheme has been approved by His Majesty in Council:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His said Council, is pleased hereby to affirm the said Scheme and to order that the Benefices therein recommended to be united shall be united to the extent and for the purposes recommended in the said Scheme and further to order and direct that the said Scheme and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the date when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Measures.

And His Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the said Diocese of Exeter.

" Whereas by the original Order provision was made for the union of the said three Benefices of Everton, Saint Peter, Everton, Saint Ambrose, and Liverpool, All Saints, upon the first vacation after the day of the date of the publication of such original Order in the London Gazette of that one of the said three Benefices which should last be vacated after that day but since that day only one of such Benefices has been vacated, namely the said Benefice of Liverpool, All Saints, which Benefice is still vacant:

" And whereas under the provisions of the original Order the Church of All Saints, Liverpool, would have become a Chapel of Ease to the Church of Saint Peter, Everton, but the said Church of All Saints, Liverpool, is now no longer required for purposes of Divine Service:

" And whereas it has been represented to us, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, and it appears to us to be desirable (a) that the union of the said three Benefices should take effect upon the next vacation of the said Benefice of Everton, Saint Peter, (b) that in the meantime the said two Benefices of Everton, Saint Ambrose, and Liverpool, All Saints, should forthwith be united, (c) that the said Church of All Saints, Liverpool, should be taken down and the site and materials thereof sold and disposed of, and (d) that certain other alterations should be made in the original Order as hereinafter recommended and proposed:

" Now, therefore, we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, with the consents of the Right Reverend Albert Augustus, Bishop of Liverpool, and of the Reverend Alfred Mortimer Pocock, Incumbent of the said Benefice of Everton, Saint Ambrose (testified by their respectively signing this Supplementary Scheme) do humbly recommend and propose to Your Majesty as follows, that is to say:—

" 1. That the union of the said three Benefices of Everton, Saint Peter, Everton, Saint Ambrose, and Liverpool, All Saints, recommended and proposed by the original

Order, shall take effect upon the next vacation of the said Benefice of Everton, Saint Peter, after the date of the publication in the London Gazette of any Order of Your Majesty in Council affirming this Supplementary Scheme and in the meantime the said two Benefices of Everton, Saint Ambrose, and Liverpool, All Saints, shall upon the date aforesaid, be united together and form one Benefice with Cure of Souls and one Parish for ecclesiastical purposes under the style of 'The United Benefice of Everton, Saint Ambrose with All Saints', and the said Alfred Mortimer Pocock, if he is then Incumbent of the said Benefice of Everton, Saint Ambrose, shall be the first Incumbent of such United Benefice.

" 2. That upon the union of the said two Benefices of Everton, Saint Ambrose and Liverpool, All Saints, taking effect the register books of baptisms, marriages and burials and other the records and muniments deposited in the Church of All Saints, Liverpool, shall be transferred to the Church of Saint Ambrose, Everton, but the marriage registers in duplicate current at the Church of All Saints, Liverpool, shall first be sent by the Incumbent of the United Benefice to the Registrar General to be closed officially.

" 3. That the following provisions relating to the employment of Curates and lay assistants shall be substituted for the provisions in Clauses 10 and 11 of the original Order that is to say (a) that upon the union of the said two Benefices of Everton, Saint Ambrose, and Liverpool, All Saints, taking effect the Incumbent of the United Benefice shall pending the union of all of the said three Benefices obtain the services of a Curate or occasional clerical or lay assistance and a portion of the endowments of the United Benefice namely an annual payment of £185 being part of a larger annual payment at present made by us the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners to the Incumbent for the time being of the said Benefice of Liverpool, All Saints, shall be constituted a fund to meet the expenses of providing for the services of a Curate or for occasional clerical or lay assistance as aforesaid which said fund of £185 per annum shall be paid by us, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners to the Diocesan Board of Finance of the Diocese as trustees to apply the same for the purpose of paying the stipend of a Curate or the expense of occasional clerical or lay assistance as aforesaid; and (b) that upon the union of all of the three said Benefices taking effect the Incumbent of the United Benefice shall obtain the services of two Curates and also the services of a Lay Reader and two Women Workers or such other clerical or lay assistance in the performance of the duties of the United Benefice as the Bishop may require and a portion of the endowments of the United Benefice namely the whole of the annual payment of £373 3s. 4d. at present made by us the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners to the Incumbent for the time being of the said Benefice of Liverpool, All Saints, and an annual payment of £158 16s. 8d. being part of a larger annual payment at present made by us to the Incumbent for the time being of the said Benefice of Everton, Saint Peter, shall be constituted a fund to meet the expenses of providing for the services of such Curates and such other clerical or lay assistance as aforesaid, which said fund (amounting in all to

(£532 per annum) shall be paid by us, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, to the Diocesan Board of Finance for the Diocese as trustees to apply the same for the purpose of paying the stipends of the said Curates and the expense of the said clerical or lay assistance as aforesaid.

" 4.—(a) That so soon as conveniently may be after the union has taken effect the Church of All Saints, Liverpool, shall be taken down and the materials and site thereof, together with any ground annexed thereto and necessary for the use and enjoyment thereof shall be sold and disposed of by us the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners at such time or times and in such manner in all respects as to us shall seem expedient subject to the conditions and restrictions imposed by the said Measures.

" (b) That the font, communion table, and plate used for the purpose of the Holy Communion in the said Church of All Saints, Liverpool, shall in accordance with the provisions of the said Measures and as the Bishop of the Diocese may direct be transferred to the Church of Saint Ambrose, Everton, being the Parish Church of the said United Benefice of Everton, Saint Ambrose with All Saints or to some other Church or Churches within the said Diocese of Liverpool and the bells, organ and other furniture and fittings of the said Church of All Saints, Liverpool, or such of them as the Bishop of Liverpool shall select shall be removed to the Parish Church of the United Benefice, and any of such articles not so removed shall be removed to any other Church or Chapel or Churches or Chapels within the Diocese of Liverpool which the Bishop may select or shall be sold and in such case the proceeds shall be added to the fund arising from the sale of the site and materials of the said Church of All Saints, Liverpool, as aforesaid.

" (c) That the net proceeds (if any) arising from such sale or sales after the payment thereof of all costs and expenses of and in relation to such sale or sales and to the carrying into effect of this Supplementary Scheme shall constitute and form part of the Expenses Fund established pursuant to the 32nd Section of the said Union of Benefices Measure, 1923.

" Provided always that the provisions herein contained relating to the sale and disposal of the Church of All Saints, Liverpool, shall not take effect until the consents and approval which by the said Measures are made requisite to the sale under the powers conferred by those Measures of the site of any Church shall be obtained to the sale and disposal hereby proposed of the said Church of All Saints, Liverpool, and of the site thereof together with any ground annexed or belonging thereto.

" And provided further that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from making any other recommendations and proposals relating to the matters aforesaid, or any of them, in accordance with the provisions of the said Measures, or of any other Measure of the National Assembly of the Church of England, or of any Act of Parliament."

And whereas drafts of the said Supplementary Scheme have been duly published in accordance with the provisions of the Measures, and Notices have been transmitted to the persons or bodies entitled under the said Measures to receive Notice requiring any objections to such draft Supplementary

Scheme to be stated or transmitted in writing to the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners within the time prescribed in the Statutory Rules applicable to proceedings under the said Measures:

And whereas certain objections have been so stated or transmitted to the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners within the time prescribed in the same Rules:

And whereas the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners after giving full consideration to such objections have deemed right to make no alterations in such draft Supplementary Scheme:

And whereas public notice of the certification to His Majesty in Council of the said Supplementary Scheme and the consent thereto in writing of the Bishop of Liverpool has been duly given in the manner and within the time prescribed in the Statutory Rules aforesaid:

And whereas an appeal against the said Supplementary Scheme has been made to His Majesty in Council by the Parochial Church Council of Everton, St. Peter, and such appeal was referred to the Judicial Committee of the Privy Council by Order in Council of the 23rd day of June, 1938:

And whereas the Lords of the said Committee, having taken the said appeal into consideration, reported to His Majesty in Council their opinion that the appeal ought to be dismissed and the said Supplementary Scheme be approved:

And whereas His Majesty was pleased, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, by Order of the 20th day of December, 1938, to approve the said Report:

And whereas the said Supplementary Scheme has been laid before both Houses of Parliament for the space of two calendar months:

And whereas the said Supplementary Scheme has been approved by His Majesty in Council:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His said Council, is pleased hereby to affirm the said Supplementary Scheme and to order and direct that the said Supplementary Scheme and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the date when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Measures.

" 5. That upon the said union taking effect the Parsonage House at present belonging to the said Benefice of Birmingham, Bishop Ryder, shall become and be the house of residence for the Incumbent of the United Benefice.

" 6. Communion in the said Church of Saint Bartholomew, Birmingham, shall in accordance with the provisions of the said Measures and as the Bishop of the Diocese may direct be removed to the Church of the United Benefice or to some other Church or Churches within the said Diocese of Birmingham and the bells, organ and other furniture and fittings of the said Church of Saint Bartholomew, Birmingham, or such of them as the Bishop of Birmingham shall select, shall also be removed to the Parish Church of the United Benefice, and any of such articles not so removed shall be appropriated by the Bishop of Birmingham for use in the proposed Church or Churches of the said District or Districts or be removed to any other Church or Chapel or Churches or Chapels within the Diocese of Birmingham which the Bishop may select or shall be sold and in such case the proceeds shall be added to the fund arising from the sale of the site and materials of the said Church of Saint Bartholomew, Birmingham, as aforesaid.

(d) That in the event of the services of any Church Officers and Servants of the said Church of Saint Bartholomew, Birmingham, being dispensed with by reason of the union taking effect such Church Officers and Servants shall out of any moneys to be received by us, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, under the provisions of this Clause receive such reasonable compensation as having regard to age, length of service and other circumstances of the case shall seem to us and to the Bishop of Birmingham equitable and proper. Provided always that it shall be lawful for us if we shall see fit so to do in all or any of these cases to advance the compensation money or any part thereof out of the said Expenses Fund.

" 8. That with the consent of the said Ernest William, Bishop of Birmingham, as Patron of the said Benefice of Birmingham, Saint Bartholomew (which consent is testified as aforesaid), upon the union taking effect a part of the total endowments of the Benefices hereinbefore recommended and proposed to be constituted an United Benefice, that is to say, a sum of £22,733 6s. 8d. "We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, in pursuance of the Ecclesiastical Commissioners (Powers) Measure, 1938, have prepared, and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council, the following Scheme for providing for quarterly payments to incumbents of benefices in accordance with section 7 of the said Measure:

"Now, therefore, we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, humbly recommend and propose as follows:—

"1. In this Scheme

(a) 'Benefice' shall mean or include any benefice as defined by the Ecclesiastical Commissioners (Powers) Measure, 1938.

(b) 'Incumbent' shall in relation to any benefice mean or include not only the holder of the benefice but also any other person who by reason of any sequestration or other

event is or becomes for the time being entitled to receive the income of the benefice.

(c) The expression 'income of the benefice' or any reference to the income of a benefice shall mean or be read as a reference to that portion of the income of the benefice to which this Scheme is hereinafter stated to be applicable, save such part thereof (if any) as may either permanently or for the time being be excluded from the operation of the Scheme under the provision in that behalf hereinafter contained.

"2.—(1) The Scheme shall be applicable to all income of any benefice payable to the Incumbent thereof in right of his benefice by the Ecclesiastical Commissioners and being either

(a) an annual sum charged on the Common Fund of the Ecclesiastical Commissioners in favour of the benefice whether permanently or temporarily so charged;

(b) the dividends on any stock or other investments held by the Ecclesiastical Commissioners upon trust for the benefice;

(c) an annual sum payable to the Incumbent charged upon or payable out of the income of any trust fund under the control of the Ecclesiastical Commissioners, or

(d) any other sum periodically payable by the Ecclesiastical Commissioners to any incumbent in right of his benefice as part of the income thereof.

(2) Except in any case where the Ecclesiastical Commissioners may otherwise direct the Scheme shall not be applicable to any annual or other sum or dividends payable to the Incumbent of a Benefice for or towards providing the stipend of a curate or other clerical or lay assistant.

(3) Provided always that the Ecclesiastical Commissioners may at any time and from time to time, either permanently or temporarily, exclude from the operation of this Scheme any income of such nature or description as in their opinion renders its inclusion or continued inclusion undesirable or inconvenient.

(4) The total amount of the annual income of any benefice to be brought into account for the purposes of this Scheme is hereinafter referred to as 'the gross income' of the benefice.

"3. The Scheme shall come into operation on the 1st day of April, 1939, and the financial year of the Scheme shall be the year commencing on the 1st day of April and ending on the next ensuing 31st day of March.

"4. The yearly sum to be paid to the Incumbent of any benefice by quarterly instalments as hereinafter mentioned in respect of the income of the benefice for any financial year shall be the balance which remains after deducting from the gross income of the benefice for that year any sums chargeable against or payable out of such gross income which may lawfully or properly be so deducted by the Ecclesiastical Commissioners under any Statute or Measure, and such other sums (if any) as may with the consent of the Incumbent be so deducted in respect of any annual sum payable to the Ecclesiastical Commissioners by the Incumbent, or payable by them on behalf of the Incumbent to any other person.

Such yearly sum as aforesaid is hereinafter referred to as the 'net income' of the benefice.

" 5. The Ecclesiastical Commissioners shall on the 1st day of April, 1939, pay to every Incumbent affected by this scheme a sum equivalent to such part of the income of his benefice as shall be accruing or have accrued and remain unpaid down to that date (including income payable on that date) subject to a proper allowance or deduction being made thereout in respect of all outgoings of the like description as those to be brought into account as deductions in ascertaining the net income of the benefice for the first financial year, and accordingly all income as aforesaid which on the first day of April, 1939, shall be accruing in respect of any period then current, and all outgoings in respect of which an apportionment is required for the purposes of this present clause shall be apportioned down to the date aforesaid.

" 6. In the case of every benefice affected by this Scheme the net income of the benefice for each financial year shall be paid to the Incumbent by four quarterly instalments as nearly as reasonably practicable of equal amounts payable on the 1st day of July the 1st day of October the 1st day of January and the 1st day of April in every year in respect of the three months last preceding each of the said quarterly days, the first such instalment to be paid on the 1st day of July, 1939.

" 7. In any case where the net income of a benefice shall be increased by any addition having been made to the gross income thereof, or shall be reduced by the withdrawal or cesser of any part of the former gross income, or for any other reason the net income of the benefice shall be increased or reduced, the amount of the quarterly instalments to be paid to the Incumbent shall be recalculated and adjusted so as to bring into account such increase or reduction (as the case may be) as from the date when the increase or reduction became operative, and so that the quarterly instalment payable next thereafter shall so far as reasonably practicable be increased or reduced (as the case may be) by such part of one-fourth of the yearly amount of the increase or reduction as shall be proportionate to the period commencing on such date as aforesaid and ending at the expiration of the then current quarter of the financial year.

" 8. In the event of any change of incumbent whether by reason of death, resignation, preferment, exchange or otherwise, or any sequestration, or on the happening of any other event by reason whereof an apportionment of the income of a benefice shall become necessary or proper, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners shall have power, upon being furnished with all such information, certificates or other evidence as they may require for this purpose, to apportion down to the date of such event as between all parties interested the quarterly instalment to become payable under this scheme in respect of the quarter then current, and payment of the part of the said instalment so apportioned to the Incumbent or other person entitled to receive the income of the benefice prior to the date aforesaid shall be and be accepted as in full satisfaction of all claims by him in respect of the income of the benefice down to that date, subject only as provided by the next succeeding paragraph hereof.

" 9. When and so often as any recalculation shall be made under the provisions of para-

graph 7 hereof of the amount of the quarterly instalments payable to the Incumbent of any benefice, or any change of Incumbent or other event as contemplated by paragraph 8 hereof shall occur in respect of any benefice, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners shall cause the quarterly payments previously made to the Incumbent or outgoing or deceased Incumbent concerned to be examined and reviewed so far as may be requisite for the purpose of ascertaining whether such Incumbent has been paid the full net sum, and not more than the full net sum, which he ought to have received in respect of the income of the benefice for the period covered by the instalments paid to him under this Scheme And if at any time, whether on any recalculation or apportionment as aforesaid or otherwise, it shall appear that any Incumbent has been underpaid, the amount of the underpayment shall forthwith be paid by the Ecclesiastical Commissioners to the Incumbent concerned or to the personal representatives of the deceased Incumbent (as the case may be), and if at any time as aforesaid it shall appear that any Incumbent has been overpaid, the amount of the overpayment shall be recoverable as a debt owing to the Ecclesiastical Commissioners by the Incumbent concerned or the personal representatives of the deceased Incumbent (as the case may be) and the amount so owing by any Incumbent may, without prejudice to any other remedy, be deducted either in one sum or by instalments as the Ecclesiastical Commissioners may think fit from any quarterly payment or payments thereafter becoming due to him either in respect of the income of the same benefice or the income of any other benefice to which he may have been instituted.

"Whereas by an Order of His late Majesty King George the Fifth in Council bearing date the 29th day of June, 1934, and published in the London Gazette on the 6th day of July, 1934, the said District of Saint Laurence, Barkingside, was, under the provisions of the hereinbefore mentioned Act, constituted, partly out of the New Parish of Trinity, Barkingside, partly out of the Parish of Great Ilford and partly out of the New Parish of Saint Peter, Aldborough Hatch, all in the said County and Diocese:

"Now, therefore, we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, humbly recommend and propose that the whole right of Patronage of the said District of Saint Laurence, Barkingside, and when such District shall have become a New Parish as aforesaid, then of the said New Parish, and the nomination of the Minister or Incumbent thereof shall without any conveyance or assurance in the law other than this Scheme and any duly gazetted Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying the same and upon and from the day of the date of the publication of such Order in the London Gazette be assigned to and be absolutely vested in and shall and may from time to time be exercised by the Right Reverend Henry, now Bishop of Chelmsford, and by his successors in the same Bishopric for ever.

"And we further recommend and propose that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from recommending and proposing any other measures relating to the matters aforesaid, or any of them, in conformity with the provisions of the hereinbefore mentioned Act, or of any other Act of Parliament."

And whereas the said Scheme has been approved by His Majesty in Council:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His said Council, is pleased hereby to ratify the said Scheme, and to order and direct that the same and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the time when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Acts.

And His Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the said Diocese of Chelmsford.

"We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, acting in pursuance of the Union of Benefices Measures, 1923 to 1936, have prepared, and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council, the following Scheme for effecting the union of the Benefice (being a Rectory) of Rearsby and the Benefice (being a Rectory) of Ratcliffe on the Wreake, both of which Benefices are situate in the County of Leicester and in the Diocese of Leicester:

"Whereas Commissioners appointed at our request by the Right Reverend Cyril, Bishop of Leicester, pursuant to the provisions of the said Measures to inquire into and report upon the union of the said two Benefices of Rearsby and Ratcliffe on the Wreake duly made their Report to the said Bishop of Leicester and therein recommended the union of the said

two Benefices and the terms for effecting the union, and the said Bishop of Leicester signified in writing his approval of the said Report:

"And whereas we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, have prepared this Scheme for the union of the said two Benefices which Scheme is based upon the terms recommended in the said Report but with the assent of the said Bishop of Leicester embodies certain modifications thereof:

"And whereas the said Benefice of Ratcliffe on the Wreake is now full the Reverend Charles Ellison Young being the present Incumbent thereof and the said Benefice of Rearsby is at present vacant:

"Now, therefore, we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, with the consents of the said Cyril, Bishop of Leicester, and the said Charles Ellison Young (testified by their respectively signing this Scheme) do humbly recommend and propose to Your Majesty as follows, that is to say:—

"1. That the said Benefice of Rearsby and the said Benefice of Ratcliffe on the Wreake shall be permanently united together and form one Benefice with Cure of Souls under the style of 'The United Benefice of Rearsby with Ratcliffe' but the Parishes of the said Benefices shall continue distinct in all respects.

"2. That upon the day when any Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this Scheme shall be published in the London Gazette the union shall forthwith take effect and the said Charles Ellison Young if he is then Incumbent of the said Benefice of Ratcliffe on the Wreake shall be the first Incumbent of the United Benefice.

"3. That upon the said union taking effect and pending the provision of a new Parsonage House at Rearsby the Parsonage House at present belonging to the said Benefice of Ratcliffe on the Wreake shall become and be the house of residence for the Incumbent of the United Benefice.

"4. That upon the union taking effect and so long as the said Charles Ellison Young shall continue to be Incumbent of the United Benefice provision shall be made by the Incumbent of the United Benefice for obtaining the services of an assistant Curate who shall reside at Rearsby and the endowments of the United Benefice other than glebe shall be charged with a sum of £250 per annum as a fund to meet the expenses of providing for the services of such Curate which said fund of £250 per annum shall be held and administered by the Incumbent of the United Benefice but shall be applicable only to the purposes aforesaid, provided that it shall be lawful for the Bishop of the Diocese if he thinks proper at any time and from time to time to direct that the said charge of £250 per annum shall be paid by the Incumbent of the United Benefice to the Diocesan Board of Finance of the Diocese as Trustees to apply the same for the purpose of paying the stipend of the said Curate as aforesaid.

That with the consent of the said Charles Ellison Young, being the Patron of the said Benefice of Ratcliffe on the Wreake (which consent is testified as aforesaid) upon the vacation by the said Charles Ellison Young of the United Benefice a part of the endowments and property of the United Benefice, that is to say, an annual sum of £50 being part

of a larger annual sum at present payable by us, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, to the Incumbent of the said Benefice of Ratcliffe on the Wreake, shall be severed or diverted from the United Benefice and shall thereupon and thenceforth be payable by us, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, to the Incumbent for the time being of the Benefice of Braunstone, Saint Peter, in the said Diocese of Leicester. And whereas certain objections have been so stated or transmitted to the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners within the time prescribed in the same Rules:

And whereas the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners after giving full consideration to such objections have deemed right to make no alterations in such draft Scheme:
