

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His said Council, is pleased hereby to affirm the said Scheme and to order that the Benefices therein recommended to be united shall be united to the extent and for the purposes recommended in the said Scheme and further to order and direct that the said Scheme and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the date when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Measures.

And His Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the said Diocese of Leicester.

The KING's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

WHEREAS the Minister of Health, after giving 10 days' previous notice of his intention in that behalf, has, under the provisions of the Burial Act, 1853, as amended by subsequent enactments, made a Representation to His Majesty in Council that for the protection of the Public Health, the opening of any new burial ground in the City of Leeds, in the County of York, save with the previous approval of the Minister of Health, should be prohibited, and that burials should be discontinued therein as hereinafter directed:

And whereas by an Order in Council of the 20th December, 1938, Notice of such Representation was given, and it was ordered that the same should be taken into consideration by a Committee of the Privy Council on the 31st day of January next, and such Order has been published in the London Gazette, and copies thereof have been affixed, as required by the said Act:

Now, therefore, His Majesty is pleased, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, to order, as it is hereby ordered, that no new burial ground shall be opened in the said City of Leeds save with the previous approval of the Minister of Health, and that burials shall be discontinued therein as follows, viz.:—

Leeds.—Forthwith and entirely in the Church of Saint John the Evangelist, Wortley-de-Leeds, and in the Churchyard attached thereto.

Provided that—

In earthen graves now existing in the said Churchyard the burials may be allowed at their decease of the following relations of those already interred therein:—

Isabella Alderson, Samuel Broughton, Minnie Child, Helena Hartley, Jane Hartley, John Lee, Annie Caine Myers, Charles Naylor, Annie Jane Rowe, Margaret Agnes Rowe, Mary Sheard, Benjamin Greaves Whittaker, Edward Wilcox:

Subject in each case to the condition that no part of the coffin containing the body shall be at a less depth than three feet below the level of the surface of the ground adjoining the grave.

AIR NAVIGATION ACTS, 1920 AND 1936.

Navy. Officers, R.N., R.N.R., and R.N.V.R.—No. 1 Dress (Full Dress).

Officers not in possession of Full Dress Uniform, and who are not required by the Regulations to provide it—No. 3 Dress (Frock Coat with Epaulettes).

Army. Officers in possession of Full Dress of their rank—Levée Dress.

Officers not in possession of Full Dress Uniform of their rank—Service Dress.

Air Force. Officers in possession of Full Dress Uniform—Full Dress.

Officers not in possession of Full Dress Uniform—Service Dress.

Civilians. Levée Dress.

The following are the Regulations to be observed:—

1. Peers, Bishops, His Majesty's Lieutenants of Counties, Deputy Lieutenants of Counties, Members of Parliament, Officials connected with the Houses of Parliament, Clergy of all Denominations, and all gentlemen other than those mentioned in the following Regulations, should communicate with the Comptroller, Lord Chamberlain's Office, St. James's Palace. No applications can be received from gentlemen in the foregoing categories wishing to be presented. Their names must be forwarded by the gentleman making the presentation.

2. A gentleman presented for the first time may present only his son on the occasion when he himself is presented.

3. All gentlemen referred to in the following Regulations, wishing to attend or be presented at a Levée, should make a written application as directed below.
