

the middle of the last mentioned footpath for a distance of 10½ chains or thereabouts to a point opposite to the western end of the wall or fence forming the northern boundary of the said house and premises known as Foldrings, and extending thence eastward to and along such wall or fence for a distance of 6 chains or thereabouts to the point where it reaches the northern side of Raynor Sike Lane, and extending thence first southward to and then eastward along the middle of Raynor Sike Lane for a distance of 1 chain or thereabouts to its junction with Acre Lane, and extending thence first south-eastward, then southward, and then again south-eastward along the middle of Acre Lane for a distance of 12½ chains or thereabouts to its junction with Lumb Lane, and extending thence eastward along the middle of Lumb Lane for a distance of 9½ chains or thereabouts to its junction with Green Lane upon the boundary which divides the said Parish of Bradfield from the said New Parish of Oughtibridge."

And whereas drafts of the said Scheme or Representation have been transmitted to the Patrons and to the Incumbents of the Cures affected by the arrangements which are contemplated by such Scheme or Representation and such Patrons and Incumbents have respectively signified their assent thereto:

And whereas the said Scheme or Representation has been approved by His Majesty in Council:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His said Council, is pleased hereby to ratify the said Scheme or Representation, and to order and direct that the same and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the time when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Acts.

And His Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the said Diocese of Sheffield.
