Your Majesty in Council the following Representation as to the assignment of a Consolidated Chapelry to the consecrated Church of Saint Richard, Haywards Heath, situate Saint Richard, Haywards Heath, situate within the New Parish (sometime District Chapelry) of Saint Wilfrid, Cuckfield, in the Saint County of Sussex and in the Diocese of Chichester:

"Whereas at certain extremities of the said New Parish of Saint Wilfrid, Cuckfield, and of the Parish of Lindfield, in the said County and Diocese, which said extremities lie contiguous one to another, and are described in the Schedule hereunder written, there is collected together a population which is situate at a distance from the several churches of such New Parish and Parish:

And whereas it appears to us to be expedient that certain contiguous portions (being the portions containing the population aforesaid) of the said New Parish of Saint Wilfrid, Cuckfield, and of the said Parish of Lindfield should be formed into a Consolidated Chapelry for all ecclesiastical purposes, and that the same should be assigned to the said Church of Saint Richard, Haywards Heath, situate as aforesaid :

"Now, therefore, with the consent of the Right Reverend George, Bishop of Chichester, as Diocesan, and also as the Patron, in right ot his See, of the Vicarage of the said New Parish of Saint Wilfrid, Cuckfield (in testimony whereof he has signed and sealed this Representation) and with the consent of the Church Association Trust, Incorporated, as the Patrons of the Vicarage of the said Parish of Lindfield (in testimony whereof they have caused their Common or Corporate Seal to be affixed to this Representation), we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, humbly represent, that it would, in our opinion, be expedient that all those contiguous portions of the said New Parish of Saint Wilfrid, Cuckfield, and of the said Parish of Lindfield, which are described in the Schedule hereunder written, all which portions, together with the boundaries thereof, are delineated and set forth on the map or plan hereunto annexed, should be united and formed into one Con-solidated Chapelry for the said Church of Saint Richard, Haywards Heath, situate as aforesaid, and that the same should be named The Consolidated Chapelry of Saint Richard, Haywards Heath '.

"THE SCHEDULE to which the foregoing Representation has reference.

" The Consolidated Chapelry of Saint Richard, Haywards Heath, comprising :-

"I. All that portion of the New Parish (sometime District Chapelry) of Saint Wilfrid, Cuckfield, in the County of Sussex and in the Diocese of Chichester, which is bounded upon the west by the Parish of Cuckfield, upon the north by the Parish of Ardingly, upon the north-east and upon the east by the Parish of Lindfield, all in the said County and Diocese, and upon the remaining side, that is to say, upon the south, by an imaginary line commencing at the point where the boundary which divides the said Parish of Lindfield from the said New Parish of Saint Wilfrid, Cuckfield, crosses the middle of America Lane, and extending thence first north-westward and then westward along the middle of America Lane for a distance of 15 chains or thereabouts to

a point opposite to the middle of the footpath which leads through Bent's Wood into Oathall Road, and extending thence westward to and along the middle of the said footpath for a distance of 40 chains or thereabouts to the point where it reaches the eastern side of Oathall Road, and extending thence first westward to and then south-westward along the middle of Oathall Road for a distance of 4 chains or thereabouts to a point opposite to the middle of the footpath which leads across The Heath Recreation Ground into Perrymount Road, and extending thence westward to and along the middle of the last mentioned footpath for a distance of 18 chains or thereabouts to the point where it reaches the eastern side of Perrymount Road opposite to the eastern end of Station Road, and extending thence westward to and along the middle of Station Road and in a straight line in continuation thereof thereby crossing the main line of the Central Section of the Southern Railway) for a distance in all of 9¹/₂ chains or thereabouts to a point in the middle of the road called Market Place, and extending thence southward along the middle of Market Place for a distance of 4 chains or thereabouts to its junction with Paddock-hall Road, and extending thence first westward and then south-westward along the middle of Paddockhall Road for a distance of 9 chains or thereabouts to its junction with Lucastes Avenue, and extending thence first westward and then north-westward along the middle of Lucastes Avenue for a distance of 23 chains or thereabouts to a point opposite to the eastern end of the fence forming the northern boundary of the close numbered I upon the map or plan annexed to this Representation, and extending thence generally south-westward to and along the said fence and along the fence forming the northern boundary of the close numbered 2 upon the said map or plan for a distance in all of 28 chains or thereabouts to the boundary which divides the said New Parish of Saint Wilfrid, Cuckfield, from the said Parish of Cuckfield.

" II. And also all that contiguous portion of the said Parish of Lindfield which is bounded upon the south-east and upon the west by the above described portion of the said New Parish of Saint Wilfrid, Cuckfield, and upon the remaining sides, that is to say, upon the north and upon the east, by an imaginary line commencing upon the boundary which divides the said New Parish of Saint Wilfrid, Cuckfield, from the said Parish of Lindfield at the centre of the bridge which carries Bordehill Lane across the said main line of the Central Section of the Southern Railway, and extending thence eastward along the middle of Bordehill Lane and along the middle of the footpath leading into Portsmouth Lane for a distance in all of 33 chains or thereabouts to the point where such footpath reaches the western side of Portsmouth Lane, and extending thence first eastward to and then southward along the middle of Portsmouth Lane for a distance in all of 2 chains or thereabouts to its junction with the road called Gander Hill upon the boundary which divides the said Parish of Lindfield from the said New Parish of Saint Wilfrid, Cuckfield."

And whereas the said Representation has
