Notice is hereby given in pursuance of Section 5 of the Destructive Insects Acts, 1877, that the Minister of Agriculture and Fisheries has made the following Order:—

Order No. D.I.P. 603 (dated 2nd March, 1939) The Narcissus Pests (Norfolk) Order of 1939.

This Order empowers Officers appointed by the Local Authorities for the County of Norfolk and the County Borough of Great Yarmouth to examine narcissus plants or bulbs, and enable the Local Authorities to take action to prevent
