

4. Each Tender must be for an amount not less than £50,000, and must specify the date on which the Bills required are to be dated, and the net amount per cent. (being an even multiple of one penny) which will be given for the amount applied for. Separate Tenders must be lodged for Bills of different dates.

5. Tenders must be made through a London Banker, Discount House or Broker.

6. The person whose Tenders are accepted will be informed of the same not later than the following day, and payment in full of the amounts of the accepted Tenders must be made to the Bank of England by means of Cash or a Banker's Draft on the Bank of England not later than 2 o'clock (Saturday 12 o'clock) on the day on which the relative Bills are to be dated.

7. In virtue of the provisions of Section 1 (4) of the War Loan Act, 1919, Members of the House of Commons are not precluded from tendering for these Bills.

8. Tenders must be made on the printed forms which may be obtained from the Chief Cashier's Office, Bank of England.

DANGEROUS DRUGS ACTS, 1920 TO 1932.

WITHDRAWAL OF AUTHORITIES.

(NORMAN WEBSTER LAING.)

Whereas Norman Webster Laing, L.R.C.P., L.R.C.S. Edin., L.R.F.P.S. Glasg., whose registered address is 23, Sheepburn Road, Uddingston, Lanarkshire, has been convicted of offences against the Dangerous Drugs Acts, 1920 to 1932:

And whereas the said Norman Webster Laing cannot, in my opinion, properly be allowed to be in possession of or to supply any drug or preparation to which the Dangerous Drugs Regulations, 1937, or any drug to which the Raw Opium, etc. Regulations, 1937, apply:

Now therefore, in pursuance of the powers conferred on me by Regulation 7 of the Dangerous Drugs Regulations, 1937, and by Regulation 5 of the Raw Opium, etc. Regulations, 1937, I hereby withdraw from the said Norman Webster Laing the authorities conferred by the said Regulations upon him to be in possession of and to supply the drugs or preparations to which the Dangerous Drugs Regulations, 1937, and the drugs to which the Raw Opium, etc. Regulations, 1937, apply:

And I hereby direct that it shall not be lawful for the said Norman Webster Laing to give prescriptions for the purposes of the Dangerous Drugs Regulations, 1937.
