side of Nevill Avenue and extending thence north-westward along the said wall or fence for a distance of 30 chains or thereabouts to the point where it meets the wall or fence forming the eastern boundary of the houses and premises situate on the eastern side of Holmes Avenue, and extending thence north-eastward along the last mentioned wall or fence for a distance of 7 chains or thereabouts to the point where it meets the wall or fence forming the northern boundary of the house and premises known as 'Shirley,' and extending thence north-westward along the last mentioned wall or fence for a distance of 2 chains or thereabouts to the point where it reaches the eastern side of Holmes Avenue opposite to the eastern end of Meadway Crescent, and extending thence westward to and along the middle of Meadway Crescent for a distance of 9 chains or thereabouts to a point opposite to the middle of the footpath leading into Hangleton Road, and extending thence north-westward to and along the middle of the said footpath for a distance of 7 chains or thereabouts to a point opposite to the north-eastern end of the wall or fence forming the boundary between the houses and premises situate on the southern side of Hangleton Road and the houses and premises situate on the northern side of Fallowfield Crescent, and extending thence south-westward to and along the said wall or fence for a distance of 11 chains or thereabouts to the point where it meets the wall or fence forming the northern boundary of the houses and premises situate on the northern side of Nevill Avenue, and extending thence north-westward along the last mentioned wall or fence for a distance of 3 chains or thereabouts to the point where it reaches the southern side of Hangleton Road, and extending thence first north-westward to and then south-westward along the middle of Hangleton Road for a distance of 3 chains or thereabouts to the point where the boundaries of the said Parish of West Blatchington, of the said Parish of Aldrington, and of the said Parish of Hangleton, all meet, and extending thence northward along the boundary which divides the said Parish of West Blatchington from the said Parish of Hangleton for a distance of 39 chains or thereabouts to the point where it reaches the fence forming the southern boundary of the Brighton and Hove Golf Course, and extending thence north-westward along such fence for a distance of 20 chains or thereabouts to the point where it reaches the south-eastern side of the roadway leading to Saint Helen's Church, and extending thence first north-westward to and then south-westward along the middle of the said roadway for a distance of $5\frac{1}{2}$ chains or thereabouts to a point in the middle of the Dyke Branch Line of the Southern Railway, and extending thence first southward and then south-eastward along the middle of the said line of railway (thereby crossing the boundary which divides the said Parish of Hangleton from the said Parish of Aldrington) for a distance of 1 mile and 37 chains or thereabouts to its junction with the main Brighton and Portsmouth Line of the same Railway, and extending thence eastward along the middle of the last mentioned line of railway (thereby following the boundary which divides the said Parish of Aldrington from the New Parish of Saint Philip, Aldrington, in the said County and Diocese) for a distance of 12

chains or thereabouts to the point where the boundaries of the said Parish of Aldrington, of the said New Parish of Saint Philip, Aldrington, and of the said New Parish of Saint Barnabas, Hove, all meet, and extending thence northward along the boundary which divides the said Parish of Aldrington from the said New Parish of Saint Barnabas, Hove (thereby following the backs of the houses and premises situate on the western side of Leighton Road) for a distance of 15 chains or thereabouts to the point where it reaches the middle of Old Shoreham Road, and extending thence eastward along the middle of Old Shoreham Road (thereby following in part the boundary which divides the said New Parish of Saint Barnabas, Hove, from the said Parish of West Blatchington and in part the boundary which divides the said New Parish of Saint Barnabas, Hove, from the said Consolidated Chapelry of Saint Agnes, Hove) for a distance of 54 chains or thereabouts to its junction with Sackville Road, at which point the said imaginary line commenced."

And whereas drafts of the said Scheme have, in accordance with the provisions of the secondly hereinbefore mentioned Act, been transmitted to the Patrons and to the Incumbments of the Cures out of which it is intended that the District recommended in such Scheme to be constituted shall be taken, and such Patrons and Incumbents have respectively signified their assent to such Scheme:

And whereas the said Scheme has been approved by His Majesty in Council:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His said Council, is pleased hereby to ratify the said Scheme, and to order and direct that the same and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the time when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Acts.

And His Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the said Diocese of Chichester.
