WHEREAS there was this day read at the Board a Memorial from the Right Honourable the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty, dated the 18th day of April, 1939, (C.W. 9721/38) in the words following, viz. :—

“ Whereas by Section 3 of the Naval and Marine Pay and Pensions Act, 1865, it is enacted, *inter alia*, that all pay, pensions or other allowances in the nature thereof payable in respect of services in Your Majesty's Naval or Marine Force to a person being or having been an Officer, Seaman or Marine therein, shall be paid in such manner and subject to such restrictions, conditions and provisions as are from time to time directed by Order in Council :

“ And whereas by Orders in Council dated the 19th day of May, 1898, the 4th day of July, 1908, the 19th day of July, 1918, the 7th day of February, 1921 and the 7th day of November, 1924, provision is made for the grant to Officers of Your Majesty's Navy and Royal Marines, subject to certain conditions, and during certain limited periods of sick leave on full pay :

“ And whereas we are of opinion that it is desirable to make certain alterations in the Regulations governing the grant of full pay sick leave to Officers of Your Majesty's Navy and Royal Marines :

“ We beg leave humbly to recommend that Your Majesty may be graciously pleased, by Your Order in Council, to sanction a revision

of the regulations contained in the Schedule to Order in Council dated the 7th November, 1924, as shown in the accompanying Schedule, with effect from the dates shown therein.

“ The Lords Commissioners of Your Majesty's Treasury have signified their concurrence in these proposals.

“ SCHEDULE.

“ *Full Pay Sick Leave.*

“ 1. As from the 10th August, 1938 the regulations in Clause 3 of the Schedule to Order in Council dated the 7th November, 1924 to be replaced by the following :—

‘ Officers found permanently unfit for general service to be placed forthwith on the Retired List, provided that, in special cases, a grant or an extension of full pay sick leave from the date of the medical report certifying that a reasonable probability of ultimate fitness for duty no longer exists may be made at Admiralty discretion, each case being considered on its merits; the period to be limited to a Maximum of three months and by the date on which the Officer would normally have ceased to be entitled to full pay by reason of having :—

(i) reached the limit of full pay sick leave admissible under the ordinary Regulations :

(ii) completed the full period of his Active Service engagement (for an Officer entered for Short Service) :

(iii) reached the age limit for compulsory retirement (for a permanent Officer) :

(iv) completed the period of entitlement to full pay whilst unemployed.’

" 2. As from the 1st August, 1938, the regulation in Clause 9 of the Schedule to Order in Council dated the 7th November, 1924, to be replaced by the following:—

' Officers who contract disabilities whilst on full pay whilst unemployed to be eligible, at Admiralty discretion, for the grant of full pay sick leave.

' Officers who contract disabilities whilst on Unemployed Pay at the intermediate rate or on half pay, to be ineligible for full pay sick leave.' "

His Majesty, having taken the said Memorial into consideration, was pleased, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, to approve of what is therein proposed.

" And whereas the regulations for the government of Your Majesty's Naval Service provide for the sub-division of the ratings of Chief Artificer in the Air, Electrical, Engine Room and Ordnance Branches, Chief Shipwright and Chief Mechanician into two classes, advancement to the higher (first) class being conditional upon six years' approved service in the lower (second) class and carrying an increase in substantive pay of one shilling a day:

" And whereas we consider it desirable to combine these two classes into one class of Chief Artificer, Chief Shipwright or Chief Mechanician with the basic rate of pay of the present second class and two triennial increments of sixpence a day in place of the existing increase of one shilling a day on advancement from second to first class:

" We beg leave humbly to recommend that Your Majesty may be graciously pleased by Your Order in Council to sanction the establishment of the new ratings of Chief Artificer (Air, Electrical, Engine-Room and Ordnance),

Chief Shipwright and Chief Mechanician with the rates of pay set forth in the subjoined Schedule.

" The Lords Commissioners of Your Majesty's Treasury have signified their concurrence in this proposal.

1. In the year 1939—

(i) the Trinity Sittings of the Court of Appeal and of the High Court of Justice shall end on the 28th day of July; and

(ii) the Michaelmas Sittings of the Court of Appeal and of the High Court of Justice shall begin on the 3rd day of October; and

(iii) the Long Vacation of the several Courts and offices of the Supreme Court shall for all purposes begin on the 29th day of July and end on the 2nd day of October.

2. This Order may be cited as the Long Vacation (1939) Order, 1939.

And whereas by the Merchant Shipping (Colonies) Order, 1927 (hereinafter referred to as "the principal Order"), the provisions of the Act, subject to the modifications and adaptations specified in the principal Order, were applied to ships registered in the Colonies mentioned in the principal Order:

And whereas it is expedient that the provisions of the Act should, subject to the modifications and adaptations specified in the principal Order, apply to ships registered in the Gambia and the British Solomon Islands Protectorate:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, is pleased to direct, and it is hereby directed, as follows:—

1. The principal Order shall have effect as if in Section 1 there were substituted for the word "Colonies" the word "territories", and for the word "Colony" the word "territory", and as if there were added to the Schedule "The Gambia" and "British Solomon Islands Protectorate".

2. This Order may be cited as the Merchant Shipping (Colonies) (Amendment) Order, 1939.

"We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, in pursuance of the Act of the 5th and 6th years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, Chapter 108, and of the Act of the 21st and 22nd years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 57, which Acts are known as 'The Ecclesiastical Leasing Acts,' and of the Ecclesiastical Commissioners (Powers) Measure, 1936, have prepared, and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council, the following Scheme relating to the Benefice of North Stoneham, in the County of Southampton and in the Diocese of Winchester:

"Whereas the annual value of the said Benefice of North Stoneham has been improved under and by virtue of a sale of glebe lands belonging to the said Benefice which sale was carried out under the authority of the said Acts, with the concurrence of us, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, by the present Rector or Incumbent of the said Benefice of North Stoneham:

"And whereas the proceeds of the said sale have been invested by us, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, in accordance with the provisions in that behalf contained in the said Acts, in a sum of £5,000 $\frac{1}{2}$ per centum per annum Conversion Stock and a sum of £5,614 os. 8d. $\frac{1}{2}$ per centum per annum Redemption Stock 1986-96 which sums of Stock are now held by us in trust to pay to the Rector or Incumbent for the time being of the said Benefice the annual interest or dividends from time to time arising or accruing therefrom or thereupon, but subject nevertheless to the provisions contained in the said Acts and Measure with respect to making a certain portion of the improved value arising to the said Benefice from the said sale payable to us for the benefit of our Common Fund to be applied as in the said Acts mentioned:

"And whereas the improvement in the annual value of the said Benefice arising from or by means of the said sale exceeds the annual sum of £300, and after the appropriation hereinafter recommended to us, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, for the benefit of our Common Fund, the average annual income of the said Benefice will still be in excess of £600:

"And whereas the Reverend Harold Gordon Peile is the present Rector or Incumbent of the said Benefice of North Stoneham:

" Now, therefore, we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, humbly recommend and propose that as from the day of the date at which the said Benefice of North Stoneham shall from whatsoever cause be next avoided the aforesaid sum of £5,000 £3½ per centum per annum Conversion Stock and a sum of £2,500 £3 per centum per annum Redemption Stock 1986-96 (being a portion of the aforesaid sum of such Stock) or any securities or investments then representing the same shall cease to be held by us for the benefit of the Rector or Incumbent of the said Benefice of North Stoneham, and shall be held by us for the benefit of our Common Fund to be applied as in the said Acts mentioned. Provided that in the event of any yearly payment becoming charged upon the revenues of the said Benefice in favour of the Church of England Pensions Board upon the resignation therefrom of the said Harold Gordon Peile the said sums of stock (or any securities or investments representing the same) or such portion thereof as shall produce annual interest or dividends amounting to such yearly payment shall be deemed to be held by us for the benefit of the said Benefice so long as the yearly payment shall continue.

" And we further recommend and propose that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from making any other recommendation and proposal relating to the matters aforesaid or any of them in accordance with the provisions of the said Acts or Measure or of any of them or of any other Act of Parliament or of any other Measure of the National Assembly of the Church of England."

And whereas the Notice of the foregoing Scheme, which is required by the hereinbefore mentioned Acts, has been given by the said Commissioners to the Patron of the said Benefice of North Stoneham, and the said Patron has not made any objection to the said Scheme:

And whereas the said Scheme has been approved by His Majesty in Council:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His said Council, is pleased hereby to ratify the said Scheme, and to order and direct that the same and every part thereof

shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the time when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Acts.

And His Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the said Diocese of Winchester.

WHEREAS the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England have, in pursuance of the Union of Benefices Measures, 1923 to 1936, duly prepared, and laid before His Majesty in Council, a Scheme bearing date the 27th day of April, 1939, in the words and figures following, that is to say:—

“ We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, acting in pursuance of the Union of Benefices Measures, 1923 to 1936, have prepared, and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council, the following Scheme for effecting the union of the Benefice (being a Vicarage) of Pyrton and the Benefice (being a Vicarage) of Shirburn, both of which Benefices are situate in the County of Oxford and in the Diocese of Oxford:

“ Whereas Commissioners appointed at our request by the Right Reverend Thomas Banks, late Bishop of Oxford, pursuant to the provisions of the said Measures to inquire into and report upon the union of the said two Benefices of Pyrton and Shirburn duly made their Report to the said Bishop of Oxford and therein recommended the union of the said two Benefices and the terms for effecting the union, including inter alia certain alterations of boundaries affecting also the Parishes of the Benefices of Great Haseley and Watlington both in the same County and Diocese and the said Bishop of Oxford signified in writing his approval of the said Report:

“ And whereas we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, have prepared this Scheme for the union of the said two Benefices of Pyrton and Shirburn based upon the terms recommended in the said Report:

“ And whereas the said Benefices of Pyrton and Shirburn are both now full the Reverend William Edward Careless being the present Incumbent of the said Benefice of Pyrton and the Reverend Herbert William Booth being the present Incumbent of the said Benefice of Shirburn:

“ Now, therefore, we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, with the consent of the Right Reverend Kenneth Escott, now Bishop of Oxford (in testimony whereof he has signed this Scheme), do humbly recommend

and propose to Your Majesty as follows, that is to say:—

“ 1. That the said Benefice of Pyrton and the said Benefice of Shirburn shall be permanently united together and form one Benefice with Cure of Souls under the style of ‘ The United Benefice of Shirburn with Pyrton ’ but the Parishes of the said Benefices shall continue distinct in all respects.

“ 2. That if upon the day when any Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this Scheme shall be published in the London Gazette both of the said two Benefices shall be vacant, the union of the same two Benefices shall take effect forthwith; and if the said Benefice of Pyrton only shall be then vacant the said union shall also take effect forthwith if the Incumbent of the other of the said two Benefices shall with the approval of the Bishop consent to become the first Incumbent of the United Benefice, but if he shall not so consent or if the Bishop shall not approve, then the said union shall take effect upon the then next avoidance of the said Benefice of Shirburn and the then Incumbent of Pyrton shall be the first Incumbent of the United Benefice, and if the said Benefice of Shirburn only shall be then vacant the said union shall take effect upon the next avoidance of the said Benefice of Pyrton and if neither of the said two Benefices be then vacant, then the said union shall take effect on the next avoidance of the said Benefice of Pyrton if the Incumbent at that time of the said Benefice of Shirburn shall have been instituted to Shirburn subsequently to the date of the publication in the London Gazette of any Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this Scheme or if instituted before that date shall with the approval of the Bishop consent to become the Incumbent of the United Benefice, but if he shall have been instituted to the said Benefice of Shirburn before that date and shall not so consent or if the Bishop shall not approve, then the said union shall take effect immediately upon the next vacancy of the said Benefice of Shirburn following such avoidance of the said Benefice of Pyrton and the then Incumbent of the said Benefice of Pyrton shall become the first Incumbent of the United Benefice.

“ 3. That after the said union has taken effect the course and succession in which the respective Patrons shall present or nominate to the United Benefice from time to time as the same shall become vacant shall be as follows, that is to say, the right of presentation shall be exercised by the Patrons of the said two Benefices alternately, the first turn belonging to the Patron or Patrons of that one of the said two Benefices of Pyrton and Shirburn an Incumbent of which does not become the first Incumbent of the United Benefice under any of the provisions of Clause 2 of this Scheme.

“ 4. That with the consent of the Dean and Canons of Your Majesty's Free Chapel of Saint George within the Castle of Windsor as the Patrons of the said Benefice of Great Haseley (in testimony whereof they have caused their Common or Corporate Seal to be affixed to this Scheme) and with the consent of the said Kenneth Escott, Bishop of Oxford, as Patron of the said Benefice of Watlington (testified as aforesaid), and with the consents also of the Reverend Percy Henry Bown, now Incumbent

of the said Benefice of Great Haseley, and the Reverend Albert Ernest Snow, now Incumbent of the said Benefice of Watlington (testified by their respectively signing this Scheme) upon the union taking effect (a) there shall be transferred and annexed for all ecclesiastical purposes to the Parish of the said Benefice of Great Haseley all that part of the Parish of the said Benefice of Pyrton containing Upper Standhill and Lower Standhill, and lying to the west of an imaginary line commencing upon the boundary which divides the Parish of the said Benefice of Great Haseley from the Parish of the said Benefice of Pyrton at the northern end of the wall or fence which divides the close numbered 307 from the close numbered 308 upon the Ordnance Map (1921 Edition) of the Parish of Pyrton upon the scale of twenty-five inches to a mile and extending thence first southward, then south-westward, then south-eastward and then again south-westward along the said wall or fence and along the walls or fences which divide the closes numbered 305, 297, 270B, 269, 251, 249, 248, 246, and 274, from the said close numbered 308 and the closes numbered 304, 300, 265, 268, 254, 253, 252, 245, 229 and 228, all upon the same Ordnance Map to a point upon the western boundary of the Parish of the said Benefice of Pyrton at the south-western end of the wall or fence which divides the said close numbered 274 from the said close numbered 228, which said imaginary line is set forth upon the Map or Plan hereto annexed and is thereon coloured red; and (b) there shall be transferred and annexed for all ecclesiastical purposes to the Parish of the said Benefice of Watlington all that further part of the Parish of the said Benefice of Pyrton including the northern side of Love Lane, and being the close numbered 41 upon the said Ordnance Map.

“ Provided always that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from making any other recommendations and proposals relating to the matters aforesaid, or any of them, in accordance with the provisions of the said Measures, or of any other Measure of the National Assembly of the Church of England, or of any Act of Parliament.”

And whereas drafts of the said Scheme have been duly published in accordance with the provisions of the said Measures, and Notices have been transmitted to the persons or bodies entitled under the said Measures to receive Notice requiring any objections to such draft Scheme to be stated or transmitted in writing to the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners within the time prescribed in the Statutory Rules applicable to proceedings under the said Measures:

And whereas the prescribed time has elapsed and no such objections have been so stated or

transmitted to the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners:

And whereas public notice of the certification to His Majesty in Council of the said Scheme and the consent thereto in writing of the Bishop of Oxford has been duly given in the manner and within the time prescribed in the Statutory Rules aforesaid:

And whereas the said Scheme has been approved by His Majesty in Council:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His said Council, is pleased hereby to affirm the said Scheme and to order that the Benefices therein recommended to be united shall be united to the extent and for the purposes recommended in the said Scheme and further to order and direct that the said Scheme and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the date when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Measures.

And His Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the said Diocese of Oxford.

The Northumberland District (Coal Mines) Scheme, 1930, shall be amended in the following manner:—

1. Clause 2 shall have effect as if the definitions of "Independent Chairman" and "Deputy Independent Chairman" were omitted.

2. Clause 16 shall have effect as if for the words "Independent Chairman and Deputy Independent Chairman" there were substituted the words "Chairman of the Sales Committee."

3. For Clauses 34 to 42 inclusive there shall be substituted the following Clauses, that is to say:—

" 34. The Sales Committee shall consist of a Chairman and not more than seven other members.

35. The Chairman shall be appointed by a resolution passed by a majority of not less than three-fourths of the members of the Board present and voting.

36. The Chairman of the Sales Committee shall hold office on such terms and conditions as shall be determined by the Board.

37. The Chairman of the Sales Committee shall within three months after his appointment sell or dispose of any interest or shares or securities which he may hold in his own name or in the name of a nominee for his own benefit, in any undertaking carrying

on in Great Britain the business of coal mining, or supplying coal, or the manufacture or sale of by-products of coal or machinery or plant for coal mining. He shall not acquire for his own benefit any interest or shares or securities in any such undertaking, and if under any will or succession or otherwise he becomes entitled for his own benefit to any interest or shares or securities in any such undertaking, he shall sell or dispose of it or them within three months after he has become entitled thereto.

38. The Chairman of the Sales Committee shall forthwith vacate office if he shall be disqualified by reason of any of the matters referred to in Clause 45, or if he shall fail to comply with the provisions of Clause 37.

39. The Chairman of the Sales Committee shall sit with and preside over all meetings of the Sales Committee unless given leave of absence by the Board or prevented by illness from doing so.

40. On any question for decision of the Sales Committee at a Meeting at which the Chairman is present his decision if he disagrees with all or any of the other members of the Sales Committee shall prevail and shall be the decision of the Sales Committee."

4. Clause 43 shall have effect as if

(a) for the words "Chairman, Vice-Chairman and five other members of the Sales Committee" there were substituted the words "members of the Sales Committee other than the Chairman";

(b) for the word "shall," where that word appears for the last time, there were substituted the word "may"; and

(c) at the end thereof there were added the words "The Sales Committee may act notwithstanding any vacancy therein."

5. Clause 44 shall have effect as if for the words "Independent Chairman and Deputy Independent Chairman" there were substituted the word "Chairman."

6. Clause 45 shall have effect as if in paragraph (c) thereof for the words "Independent Chairman or Deputy Independent Chairman" there were substituted the word "Chairman."

7. Clause 47 shall have effect as if

(a) for the words "Three members present shall be a quorum at any meeting" there were substituted the words "Three members present (of whom the Chairman shall, unless given leave of absence by the Board or prevented from attending by illness, be one) shall be a quorum at any meeting"; and

(b) the word "Independent" were omitted.

8. For Clauses 48 and 49 there shall be substituted the following Clause, that is to say:—

" 48.
