

" Now, therefore, we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, humbly recommend and propose that as from the day of the date at which the said Benefice of North Stoneham shall from whatsoever cause be next avoided the aforesaid sum of £5,000 £3½ per centum per annum Conversion Stock and a sum of £2,500 £3 per centum per annum Redemption Stock 1986-96 (being a portion of the aforesaid sum of such Stock) or any securities or investments then representing the same shall cease to be held by us for the benefit of the Rector or Incumbent of the said Benefice of North Stoneham, and shall be held by us for the benefit of our Common Fund to be applied as in the said Acts mentioned. Provided that in the event of any yearly payment becoming charged upon the revenues of the said Benefice in favour of the Church of England Pensions Board upon the resignation therefrom of the said Harold Gordon Peile the said sums of stock (or any securities or investments representing the same) or such portion thereof as shall produce annual interest or dividends amounting to such yearly payment shall be deemed to be held by us for the benefit of the said Benefice so long as the yearly payment shall continue.

" And we further recommend and propose that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from making any other recommendation and proposal relating to the matters aforesaid or any of them in accordance with the provisions of the said Acts or Measure or of any of them or of any other Act of Parliament or of any other Measure of the National Assembly of the Church of England."

And whereas the Notice of the foregoing Scheme, which is required by the hereinbefore mentioned Acts, has been given by the said Commissioners to the Patron of the said Benefice of North Stoneham, and the said Patron has not made any objection to the said Scheme:

And whereas the said Scheme has been approved by His Majesty in Council:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His said Council, is pleased hereby to ratify the said Scheme, and to order and direct that the same and every part thereof

shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the time when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Acts.

And His Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the said Diocese of Winchester.

WHEREAS the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England have, in pursuance of the Act of the 6th and 7th years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, Chapter 37, duly prepared, and laid before His Majesty in Council, a Scheme bearing date the 27th day of April, 1939, in the words and figures following, that is to say:—

" We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, in pursuance of the Act of the 6th and 7th years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, Chapter 37, have prepared, and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council, the following Scheme for authorising the sale and disposal of certain property situate in the County of Somerset now vested in us:

" Whereas the property, particulars whereof are set forth in the Schedule hereunder written, is now vested in us not subject to any outstanding beneficial lease or grant but in possession and we are desirous of selling the same or some portion thereof for the improvement of our Common Fund:

" Now, therefore, we humbly recommend and propose to Your Majesty that we may be authorised and empowered to sell or dispose of and duly to transfer or convey from time to time all or part of the said property described in the said Schedule for such consideration as shall appear to us to be just and reasonable.
