THE Accommodation between the Parties of *Sapieha*. and *Oginsky*, which had been for some time Negotiating, was at length concluded on the 20th Instant, when 'twas least expected. The Forces on both sides being drawn out into the Field with a design to Engage, Major-General *Fleming*, the Bishop of *Wilna*, and the Castellain *Witepsky*, with a Body of the King's *German* Forces marched in between them, and through their Mediation an Agreement was concluded and signed, by which, among other things, it was stipulated, That part of Prince *Sapieha's* Forces should be immediately Disbanded, and the rest taken into the Service of the Republick; that a Regiment of 1600 Men should be given to the *Sieur Oginsky*: and that at the same time, those who sided with *Oginsky* should separate and march home; Which was performed accordingly, to the great Joy of all the People of this Country, who had suffer'd very much by the Disorders to which an End is now put; And the *Lithuanians*, by a particular Compliment to General *Fleming*, have acknowledged his acceptable Services on this Occasion. General *Sapieha* is come hither to wait upon the King, and the *Sieur Oginsky* is expected to-morrow. The King has ratifi'd the said Agreement, and having so happily finished this great Work, will in few days return to *Warsaw*.

Vienna, Jan. 10. Yesterday the Emperor gave a solemn Audience to the Deputies of the Elector of *Hanover*. His Imperial Majesty was seated on his Throne, the High Steward being placed on his right hand, and the Vice-Chancellor of the Empire on his left, and the other Great Officers, the Foreign Ministers, and other Persons of principal Quality at Court, being likewise present. The *Sieurs Oberch* and *Erasmi*, the Elector's Deputies, approach'd the Throne with the usual Reverences, and being come to a convenient distance, they kneeled down, and Monsieur *Oberch*, the first in Commission, made a Speech, desiring in his Master's Name, that the Emperor would be pleased to give him the Investiture of the Electorate; which his Imperial Majesty granted, and the Vice-Chancellor administered to them the usual Oath, which they took on their Knees; after which, the Emperor received a Sword from the hands of the High Steward, and delivered the same to the Deputies, who in the name of his Electoral Highness returned Thanks to the Emperor; The whole being performed with the Ceremonies usual on such Occasions. Last night arrived here 2 Expresses from *Carlowitz* with Letters of the 6th Instant, by which we have an Account, that the Turkish Ambassadors have consented that the *Venetians* shall keep *Lepanto*, and the other Places in the *Morcia* which they demanded the Restitution of, provi-

ded the Fortifications be demolished; But the *Venetians* insisting to keep those Fortresses in the Condition they are at present, the *Turks* have thereupon sent an Express to *Andrinople*, as the *Venetians* have likewise done to *Venice*, for further Orders. The Ambassador of *Muscovy* having no Orders to comply with the Demands of the Port concerning the Forts on the *Boresthemes*, he has likewise sent an Express to *Moscow* for more particular Directions in this Point, and that the Conclusion of the General Treaty may not be delayed thereby; he has offered to agree to a Cessation of Arms between the Czar his Master and the Sultan for two years, during which time Matters may be farther adjusted between them; And he contents, that at present the rest of the Allies may enter into the Truce of 25 years. The States of *Lower Austria* are to assemble here to-morrow, to consider of a Supply to be given to the Emperor. An Envoy is arrived here from the Duke of *Modena*, to Compliment the Emperor on the Marriage of the King of the *Romans* with the Princess of *Hanouer*, to whom that Duke is related. It's said, the Ceremony of her Publick Entry here will be deferred till the 22d of *February*, because the Preparations that are making here cannot be ready before that time.

Berlin, Jan. 13. A Marriage is lately agreed upon between the Margrave *Philip* of *Brandenburg*, Brother to the Elector, and the Princess *Charlot*, youngest Daughter to the Princess Dowager of *Hanait*, which is to be celebrated in a short time at *Dessaw*. The Elector intends about a week hence to go to *Magdebourg*, where he is to have an Interview with the Landtgrave of *Hesse-Cassel*.

Frankfort, Jan. 19. Our Letters from *Wurtzburg* say, the Funeral of the late Bishop of that Place was to be performed this day, and that on the 26th Instant the Chapter will proceed to the Election of a new Bishop; and that the Elector of *Mentz*, who is one of the Candidates, having sent an Express to the Pope to desire his Recommendation, the same was returned with a favourable Answer.

Hague, Jan. 27. An Express arrived here last Wednesday from *Madrid* with Letters for Don *Quiros* the Spanish Ambassador, who dispatched the said Courier yesterday to *Vienna*, and went himself this morning to *Brussels*. Monsieur *Dyckvelt* intends to follow him to-morrow, and is to continue at the Court of the Elector of *Bavaria* till the latter end of the next Month, when he will proceed on his Journey to *Madrid*. Monsieur *d'Odyke* is gone to his House at *Zeyst*, and will go from thence in a few days for *Zeland*, to preside at the Assembly of the States of that Province. The Count de *Frize*, Envoy from the King of *Denmark*, is preparing for his Publick Audience, which he is to have in few days.

Paris, Jan. 21. N. S. The King went yesterday to *Marly*, and the Dauphin to his House at *Maudon*.

London. It's said, that the Duke de Chartres will go in the Spring to Nancy to make a Visit to the Dutchess of Lorraine, his Sister. The Edicts against the Exportation of Corn, are executed here with a great deal of Severity. There having been a Suit at Law between the Prince of Conti and the Dutchess of Nemours concerning the Estate of the late Duke of Longville, which was decided by the Parliament of Paris in favour of the former, that Prince is preparing to go and take Possession of the Principality of Neuf-Chatel in Switzerland, which is part of the said Estate, but the Dutchess refuses to submit to the Sentence of the Parliament, as not being within their Jurisdiction, and has writ to the Magistrates of Neuf-Chatel about it.

Falmouth, Jan. 14. Last night put into this Port the *Delamar*, Capt. *Walton* Commander, bound for *Smyrna*, which failed again this evening. The *New Africa*, and divers other Merchant-ships, are preparing to sail from hence for the *Streights*.

Plymouth, Jan. 13. On the 11th Instant came in here from the Eastward His Majesty's Ship the *Germone*, bound for the *West-Indies*. Yesterday came into this Port the *Elizabeth* of *London*, *Roger Heath* Master, for the *Barbadoes*; And this day the *Laurel* of *London*, *William Binkiss* Master, for *Leghorn*.

Portsmouth, Jan. 17. On Sunday last failed from *Spithead* His Majesty's Ship the *Monmouth* for *Plymouth*. Yesterday His Majesty's Ships the *Tork*, the *Resolution*, the *Greenwich*, the *Swiftsure*, and the *Hobuck*, came to *Spithead* from the *Downes*.

Kensington, Jan. 16. This day Monsieur *Hoffman*, the Emperor's Resident, notified to His Majesty the intended Marriage of the King of the *Romans* with the Princess *Wilhelmina Amelia* of *Hannover*.
