WHEREAS His Majesty, in pursuance of the Regency Act, 1937, was pleased, by Letters Patent dated the 5th day of May, 1939 to delegate and grant unto Her Majesty The Queen, His Royal Highness The Duke of Gloucester, K.G., K.T., K.P., G.C.M.G., G.C.V.O., His Royal Highness The Duke of Kent, K.G., K.T., G.C.M.G., G.C.V.O., Her Royal Highness The Princess Royal, C.I., G.C.V.O.,

G.B.E., and Her Royal Highness Princess Arthur of Connaught, or any two of them, as Counsellors of State, full power and authority during the period of His Majesty's absence from the United Kingdom to summon and hold on His Majesty's behalf His Privy Council and to signify thereat His Majesty's approval of any matter or thing to which His Majesty's approval in Council is required:

And whereas the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England have, in pursuance of the Union of Benefices Measures, 1923 to 1936, duly prepared and laid before His Majesty in Council a Scheme bearing date the 24th day of November, 1938, in the words and figures following, that is to say:—

" We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, acting in pursuance of the Union of Benefices Measures, 1923 to 1936, have prepared and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council the following Scheme for effecting the union of the Benefice (being a Vicarage) of Ashford and the Benefice (being a Vicarage) of Pilton, both of which Benefices are situate in the County of Devon and in the Diocese of Exeter:

" Whereas Commissioners appointed at our request by the Right Reverend Charles, Bishop of Exeter, pursuant to the provisions of the said Measures to inquire into and report upon the union of the said two Benefices of Ashford and Pilton duly made their Report to the said Bishop of Exeter and therein recommended the union of the said two Benefices and the terms for effecting the union, and the said Bishop of Exeter signified in writing his approval of the said Report:

" And whereas we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, have prepared this Scheme for the union of the said two Benefices based upon the terms recommended in the said Report:

" And whereas both of the said Benefices of Ashford and Pilton are now full the Reverend Prebendary Frank Maxwell Wallington being the present Incumbent of the said Benefice of Ashford and the Reverend John Harrison being the present Incumbent of the said Benefice of Pilton:
