WHEREAS His Majesty, in pursuance of the Regency Act, 1937, was pleased, by Letters Patent dated the 5th day of May, 1939, to delegate and grant unto Her Majesty The Queen, His Royal Highness The Duke of Gloucester, K.G., K.T., K.P., G.C.M.G., G.C.V.O., His Royal Highness The Duke of Kent, K.G., K.T., G.C.M.G., G.C.V.O., Her Royal Highness The Princess Royal, C.I., G.C.V.O., G.B.E., and Her Royal Highness Princess Arthur of Connaught, or any two of them, as Counsellors of State, full power and authority during the period of His Majesty's absence from the United Kingdom to summon and hold on His Majesty's behalf His Privy Council and to signify thereat His Majesty's approval of any matter or thing to which His Majesty's approval in Council is required:

And whereas by the Cyprus Maritime Order in Council 1913 (S.R. & O. 1913, No. 896), the port of Larnaca in the Island of Cyprus was declared a Port of Registry for British ships and provision was made for regulating the registry of British ships at such port:

And whereas it is expedient that the said Order, save in so far as is hereinafter expressly provided, should be revoked:

And whereas the provisions of Section I of the Rules Publication Act, 1893, have been complied with:

Now, therefore, His Royal Highness The Duke of Gloucester, His Royal Highness The Duke of Kent, Her Royal Highness The Princess Royal and Her Royal Highness Princess Arthur of Connaught, being authorised thereto by the said Letters Patent, in pursuance of the powers in this behalf by Section 738 of the Merchant Shipping Act, 1894 (57 & 58 Vict. c. 60), and of all other powers enabling them in this behalf, by and with the advice of His Majesty's Privy Council, are pleased, on His Majesty's behalf to order, and do hereby order, as follows:—

- 1. This Order may be cited as the Cyprus Maritime Revocation Order, 1939.
- 2. The Cyprus Maritime Order in Council, 1913, save in so far as it revokes the Cyprus Maritime Order in Council, 1900 (S.R. & O. 1900, No. 501), shall cease to have effect, without prejudice, however, to the validity of anything done thereunder.

And whereas the Minister of Health, after giving 10 days' previous notice of his intention in that behalf, has, under the provisions of the Burial Act, 1853, as amended by subsequent enactments, made a Representation to His Majesty in Council that for the protection of the Public Health, the opening of any new burial ground in the City of Rochester, in the County of Kent, save with the previous approval of the Minister of Health, should be prohibited, and that burials should be discontinued therein as follows, viz.:—

Rochester.—Forthwith and entirely in the Church of Saint Nicholas in Strood, in the said City, and in the Churchyard attached thereto.

Now, therefore, His Royal Highness The Duke of Gloucester, His Royal Highness The Duke of Kent, Her Royal Highness The Princess Royal and Her Royal Highness Princess Arthur of Connaught, being authorised thereto by the said Letters Patent, are pleased hereby, on His Majesty's behalf, to give Notice of such Representation and to order that the same be taken into consideration by a Committee of the Privy Council on the 10th day of July next.

And are further pleased to direct that this Order be forthwith published in the London Gazette, and that copies thereof be affixed on the doors of the Churches or Chapels of, or on some conspicuous places within, the Parish affected by such Representation one month before the said 10th day of July.
