Electricity Commission—1939.

STANLEY ELECTRICITY.

NOTICE is hereby given that the Urban District Council of Stanley (hereinafter called "the Council") whose address is at The Council Offices, Stanley in the County of Durham, intend to apply to the Electricity Commissioners for a Special Order (hereinafter called "the Order") under the Electricity (Supply) Acts 1882 to 1936 for all or some of the following amongst other purposes (that is to say):—

1. To extend the area of supply of the Council under the Stanley Electricity Special Order 1925 so as to include therein so much of the Urban District of Stanley (hereinafter called "the District") as prior to the commencement of the County of Durham Review Order 1937 formed part of the Parish of Craghead in the Lanchester Rural District (hereinafter called "the Craghead area") and to authorise the Council to supply and distribute electricity for all public and private purposes as defined by the Electricity (Supply) Acts 1882 to 1936 within the Craghead area, and to prescribe and limit the prices to be charged for electricity supplied therein.

2. To extend the area of supply of the Council under the Annfield Plain Electric Lighting Order 1901 (hereinafter called "the Annfield Plain Order") confirmed by the Electric Lighting Orders Confirmation (No. 9) Act 1901 so as to include therein so much of the district as prior to the commencement of the County of Durham Review Order 1937 formed part of the Parish of Iveston in the Leadgate Urban District (hereinafter called "the East Castle area") and to authorise the Council to supply and distribute electricity for all public and private purposes as defined by the Electricity (Supply) Acts 1882 to 1936 within the East Castle area and to repeal Section 7 and the Fourth Schedule to the Annfield Plain Order and to prescribe a new maximum price to be charged by the Council in the area authorised by the Annfield Plain Order as proposed to be extended by the Order and to enable the Council to charge minimum prices for supply in any quarter of a year.

3. To provide for the laying down of electric lines in a certain street in the Craghead area within a period to be specified in the Order.

4. To authorise the Council to break up and open streets and parts of streets in the Craghead area which are not repairable by the local authority.

5. To extend and make applicable (a) to the Craghead area and to the purposes of the Order or some of them all or some of the powers and provisions of the Stanley Electricity Special Order 1925, and (b) to the East Castle area and to the purposes of the Order or some of them all or some of the powers and provisions of the Annfield Plain Order, and to both the Craghead area and the East Castle area all or some of the powers and provisions of the Schedule to the Electric Lighting (Clauses) Act 1899, and to apply such provisions to the undertakings authorised by the Stanley Electricity Special Order 1925 and the Annfield Plain Order respectively as proposed to be extended by the Order, subject to such variations and exceptions as may be contained therein.

6. To constitute the undertaking authorised by the Annfield Plain Order as proposed to be extended by the Order, and the undertaking authorised by the Stanley Electricity Special Order 1925, as proposed to be extended by the Order, and the undertaking authorised by the Tanfield Electricity Special Order 1925, all of which undertakings are situate in the district as constituted by the County of Durham Review Order 1937 and are now vested in the Council as one undertaking for all purposes.

7. To confer upon the Council all or some of the powers of the Electricity (Supply) Acts 1882 to 1936 and the enactments incorporated therewith and to alter vary or extinguish all rights and privileges which would or might interfere with any of the objects of the Order and to confer all other rights and privileges necessary for carrying such objects into effect.

And notice is hereby also given that printed copies of the Order as applied for and of the Order when made may be obtained (at the price of two shillings for each copy) at the offices of the undermentioned Clerk and Parliamentary Agents.

Copies of the Order and of the map showing the Craghead area and the East Castle area and the street within which it is proposed that electric lines shall be laid down within a specified time have been deposited for public inspection at the office of the Clerk of the County Council of the County of Durham at Durham and at the Council Offices, Stanley in the County of Durham.

Any local or other public authority company body or person desirous of bringing before the Electricity Commissioners any objections respecting the application must do so by registered letter addressed to the Secretary, Electricity Commission, Savoy Court, Strand, W.C.2, and despatched on or before the 20th day of July, 1939, and a copy of such Objections must at the same time be forwarded to the undersigned Clerk or Parliamentary Agents.
