RULES PUBLICATION ACT, 1893.

IN THE MATTER OF THE LONDON TRAFFIC ACT,
1924.

The Minister of Transport hereby gives notice under the Rules Publication Act, 1893, that he proposes after the expiration of at least 40 days from this date, in pursuance of the powers conferred upon him by Section 10 of the London Traffic Act, 1924, to make the London Traffic (Prescribed Routes) (No.) (Croydon) Regulations, 1939, in regard to a scheme of roundabout traffic working at the junction of Biggin Way, Downsview Road, Waddington Way, Ingram Road and Virginia Road, Croydon.

WHEREAS the endowments of each of the benefices of Christ Church, Southchurch, and of Saint Augustine, Thorpe Bay, both in the County of Essex and in the Diocese of Chelmsford, comprise an annual amount of One hundred pounds permanently charged on the endowments or some part or parts of the endowments of the benefice of Southchurch, in the said County and Diocese:

And whereas we, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, have been requested by the several incumbents concerned to substitute for each of the said charges an annual sum of the like amount charged on our Common Fund:

Now therefore, we, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, acting in pursuance of the Ecclesiastical Commissioners (Powers) Measure, 1938, Section four, do hereby, subject as hereinafter mentioned, grant out of our Common Fund to the Incumbent of each of the said Benefices of Christ Church, Southchurch, and of Saint Augustine, Thorpe Bay, and to his successors Incumbents of the same Benefice, one yearly sum or stipend of One hundred pounds, such yearly sum or stipend to be calculated as from the 25th day of March, 1939, and to be in lieu of and in full substitution for the said annual sum charged upon the revenues of the said Benefice of Southchurch:

And we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, do hereby appropriate for the benefit of our Common Fund as from the said 25th day of March, 1939, the sums of stock particularly described in the Schedule hereto and now held by us as part of the endowment of the said Benefice of Southchurch to the intent that from and after the same date the endowments of the said Benefice of Southchurch shall be discharged from the payment of each of the said annual charges of One hundred pounds.
