At the Court at *Balmoral*, the 10th day of *August*, 1939.

PRESENT,

The KING's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

WHEREAS by the Burial Act, 1854, it was enacted that, in case it appeared to His Majesty in Council, upon the petition of the Town Council of any borough stating that an Order in Council had been made for closing all or any of the burial-grounds of one or more parishes, being wholly or partly within such borough, that there was difficulty or inconvenience in providing, under the powers of the Burial Act, 1853, requisite places of burial for the inhabitants of such parish or parishes, it should be lawful for His Majesty, with the advice of His Privy Council, to order that powers should be vested in the Council of such borough for providing such places of burial under the provisions of the said Act: Provided always, that notice of such petition, and of the time when it should please His Majesty to order that the same should be taken into consideration by the Privy Council, should be published in the London Gazette, and in one of the newspapers usually circulating in such borough one month at least before such petition was so considered:

And whereas by section 4 (4) of the London Government Act, 1899, it was enacted that any of the adoptive Acts might be adopted in a Metropolitan Borough in like manner as in a Borough outside London, and not otherwise:

And whereas the Council of the Metropolitan Borough of Hackney have presented a petition to His Majesty stating that Orders in Council have been made for closing certain burial-grounds situate within the said Metropolitan Borough, and representing that there is

difficulty and inconvenience in providing, under the powers of the Burial Act, 1853, requisite places of burial for the inhabitants of the said Metropolitan Borough; and praying that powers might be vested in the Council of the said Metropolitan Borough of Hackney, for providing places of burial for the inhabitants of the said Metropolitan Borough, pursuant to the provisions of the Burial Act, 1854, and any Acts amending or extending the same:

And whereas notice of such petition and of the time when it was ordered that the same be taken into consideration by His Majesty's Privy Council has been duly published as required by the above said first recited Act:

Now, therefore, His Majesty is pleased, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, to order, and it is hereby ordered, that powers be vested in the Council of the Metropolitan Borough of Hackney, for providing requisite places of burial for the inhabitants of the said Metropolitan Borough of Hackney, under the provisions of the Burial Act, 1854, and the Acts amending or extending the same.
