- 3. Foreign vessels within the territorial waters of the British Isles are to restrict their use of wireless telegraphy as much as possible so as to avoid interference with British communications.
- 4. Any breach of these regulations renders the Masters of the offending ships liable to penalties and to the confiscation of the wireless apparatus on their ships.

WIRELESS TELEGRAPHY (FOREIGN SHIPS) REGULATIONS, 1908.

In pursuance of Regulation 5 of the Wireless Telegraphy (Foreign Ships) Regulations, 1908, I, His Majesty's Postmaster General, do hereby give notice that in the opinion of one of His Majesty's Principal Secretaries of State an emergency has arisen in which it is expedient for the public service that His Majesty's Government should have control over the transmission of messages by wireless telegraphy; and that the use of wireless telegraphy on board foreign ships, whilst in the territorial waters of Great Britain and Northern Ireland (including the Channel Islands and the Isle of Man) will be subject to such rules as may be made by the Admiralty.
