

Steward, and the other Officers of her Household with a very splendid Retinue; Here the Duke of Modena took his leave of her Majesty, and returned towards Modena, and the Queen went on to Treves, where she arrived the 26th, and intended the next day to set out from thence for Vienna.

Warsaw, Jan. 30. A Great Council is to be held here this week, in which the Bulliest of Elbing will be considered, and his expected the King will then appoint Principals for Treating with those of the Elector of Brandenburg, in order to a friendly adjusting of this Affair. It is now resolved, that the General Diet shall not meet till next year, and it's not improbable but this Assembly may be put off for some longer time; It is said, the Queen of Poland intends to come hither from Saxony about the beginning of May, and that the King will go to meet her in Prussia. We have from *Littuania* a Report of the Death of Prince Sapieha.

Vienna, Febr. 4. We expect every day to receive Advice, that the *Venetian* Ambassador has signed his Treaty with the *Turks*, his Excellency waiting only for Orders from the Republick, which it's believed were sent him by a Courier from *Venice*, who passed some days ago through this City, going to *Carlovoitz*. The Ratifications of the Treaty between the Emperor and the Sultan are getting ready, in order to be forthwith exchanged, till which time the Articles of the said Treaty will not be made publick. An Order has been published here, that all Persons who have in their Custody any *Turkish* Slaves not Christianed, do forthwith deliver them up to Commissioners appointed for that purpose, in order to their being exchanged for the *Germans* that are Prisoners in *Turkey*. The Prince of *Longueval*, and the young Count de *Traune*, are gone from hence to meet the Queen of the *Romans*, who arrived yesterday at *Inspruck* on her Journey hither, and to Compliment her in the Name of the King her Husband.

Wuresburgh, Febr. 9. This day being appointed for the Election of a Bishop of this Place, the Chapter met accordingly, and unanimously made Choice of the Herr *Gressenklaus* of *Voluz*, the Elector of *Mentz*, who was one of the Candidates, having given him his Interest; After which, *Te Deum* was sung, and the new Bishop was Complimented thereupon.

Brussels, Febr. 15. The Electoral Prince of *Bavaria* was interred last Monday in the Church of *St. Regulda*, near the Tomb of the Arch Duke *Albert*. The Baron *Simoni* went from hence last Wednesday, to notify the Prince's Death to the King of *England*; the Count de *Monasterlo* departed the next day for *Spain*, and *Don Alvarez Benito* goes, to-morrow for *France* with the like Commission; And Orders have been sent to the Count of *Doring*, who is at *Munich*, to go and make the like Notification to the Emperor. The Elector of *Cologne* arrived last Sunday at *Treves*, where he met the Elector of *Bavaria*, his Brother, and on Thursday their Electoral Highnesses came hither, but returned again yesterday towards *Treves*. The States of *Brabant* are to meet to-morrow, to consider of divers Matters of Trade.

Hague, Febr. 17. The Count de *Goes*, Envoy Extraordinary from the Emperor, has notified to the States the Conclusion of the Peace with the *Turks*, and the like has been done by the *Sieur Gerdsorf*, Resident from the King of *Poland*. Monsieur de *Mullern* being appointed by the King of *Sweden* to reside at the Court of the Elector *Ratiline* as his Envoy, leaves this Place to-morrow on his Journey to *Dusseldorp*. The Count de *Auersberg*, Envoy from the Emperor to His Majesty of *Great-Britain*, is on his departure for *England*. The Duke of *Wirtemberg* is shortly expected here, to give the States-General an Account of the Condition of their Frontier Garrisons, which he has been to visit. The States-General have published an Order, for a General Fast to be observed throughout the Seven Provinces on the 25th Instant, and the next day a General Collection is to be made for the Protestants, who are expelled from the Vallies of *Piedmont*.

Paris, Febr. 17. N.S. The Ambassador of *Morocco* arrived here the 10th Instant from *Brist*, and was conducted to the House of Ambassadors Extraordinary, and Complimented from the King by the Baron of *Breteil* Introducer of Ambassadors. Another Edict has been lately published here, enjoining the Guardians and Relations of such Children whose Parents were Protestants, to take care they be Educated in the *Roman Catholic* Religion. The Archbishop of *Paris* has published two Orders, the one to forbid the Nuns to converse with any other Men than their Fathers, Brothers, or Uncles, and their Boarders to have Dancing or Musick-Masters; And the other, to prohibit the Priests conversing with any Women, except at the Confessional, and in the Sacrity.

Whitehall, Febr. 12. His Majesty and the whole Court are gone into Mourning for the Death of the Electoral Prince of *Bavaria*.
