The KING's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

WHEREAS by the Special Constables Act, 1914 (4 & 5 Geo. 5. c. 61), as amended by the Special Constables Act, 1923 (13 & 14 Geo. 5. c. 11), power is conferred on His Majesty, by Order in Council, to make Regulations with respect to the appointment and position of special constables appointed under the Special Constables Act, 1831 (1 & 2 Will. 4. c. 41), or under Section 196 of the Municipal Corporations Act, 1882 (45 & 46 Vict. c. 50), and by these Regulations to make such provisions as are mentioned in the Special Constables Act, 1914, as so amended:

And whereas it is necessary to make further provision with regard to the employment of special constables during the present war:

Now, therefore, His Majesty is pleased, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, to order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:—

(1) A special constable appointed before the date of this Order who serves as such in a whole-time capacity during the present war may be granted pay at the rate of 60s. per week, provided that a special constable who is granted pay under the provisions of this Order shall not be granted any allowance in consideration of wages lost under the provisions of clause (b) of subsection (1) of paragraph 7 of the Special Constables Order, 1923.

(2) A special constable shall not be granted allowances in consideration of wages lost under the provisions of clause (b) of subsection (1) of paragraph 7 of the Special Constables Order, 1923, to an amount exceeding 60s. in any week.

(3) This Order may be cited as the Special Constables Order, 1939.

COUNTY BOROUGH OF WEST HARTLEPOOL.

FOOD AND DRUGS ACT, 1938, SECTION 14.

WEST HARTLEPOOL (FOOD) ORDER, 1939.

ON the application of the Council of the County Borough of West Hartlepool the Minister of Health has made an Order called The West Hartlepool (Food) Order, 1939, the effect of which is that Sections 116 and 117 of the West Hartlepool Corporation Act 1931 dealing with the registration of Manufacturers, Vendors, Merchants or Dealers in ice-cream or other similar commodity and the registration of any premises within the County Borough used for the manufacture or sale of ice-cream or similar commodity shall, after the 1st day of October, 1939, no longer be in force.

In place of and in substitution for and addition to those Sections, Section 14 of the Food and Drugs Act, 1938, shall be in force as from the 1st October, 1939. That Section states that no premises shall be used for—

(a) the sale or manufacture for the purposes of sale of ice-cream or the storage of ice-cream intended for sale; or

(b) the preparation or manufacture of sausages or potted, pressed, pickled or preserved food intended for sale,

unless those premises are registered by the Local Authority.

The preparation of meat or fish by any process of cooking shall be deemed to be the preservation thereof.
