DANGEROUS DRUGS ACTS, 1920 TO 1932.

WITHDRAWAL OF AUTHORITIES.

(PATRICK JOSEPH WALLACE).

Whereas Patrick Joseph Wallace, M.B., B.Ch. Irel., whose registered address is Wood-end, Upton, near Pontefract, has been convicted of an offence against the Dangerous Drugs Acts, 1920 to 1932.

And whereas the said Patrick Joseph Wallace cannot, in my opinion, properly be allowed to be in possession of or to supply any drug or preparation to which the Dangerous Drugs

Regulations, 1937, or any drug to which the Raw Opium, etc. Regulations, 1937, apply:

Now therefore, in pursuance of the powers conferred on me by Regulation 7 of the Dangerous Drugs Regulations, 1937, and by Regulation 5 of the Raw Opium, etc. Regulations, 1937, I hereby withdraw from the said Patrick Joseph Wallace the authorities conferred by the said Regulations upon him to be in possession of and to supply the drugs or preparations to which the Dangerous Drugs Regulations, 1937, and the drugs to which the Raw Opium, etc. Regulations, 1937, apply:

And I hereby direct that it shall not be lawful for the said Patrick Joseph Wallace to give prescriptions for the purposes of the Dangerous Drugs Regulations, 1937.
