FOOT-AND-MOUTH DISEASE (INFECTED AREAS) SPECIAL ORDER No. 57 OF 1939.

SUBJECT.

Extends the Foot-and-Mouth Disease Infected Area around Morden and Holt, Dorset, by applying the provisions of the Foot-and-Mouth Disease (Infected Areas Restrictions) Order of 1938 to the revised Area described in the Schedule.

SCHEDULE.

Extended Infected Area.
