pose of choosing and appointing such number of fit and proper persons to be Commissioners for General Purposes for the said Division of Daventry and of persons to supply vacancies amongst such Commissioners, as may be sufficient to increase the number of such Commissioners to any number not exceeding Fourteen, and of persons to supply vacancies amongst such Commissioners to any number not exceeding Fourteen.
