

which have not yet happened the endowments of the said United Benefice shall be charged with two equal perpetual annual rent-charges amounting together to £800 per annum for the endowment of two new Districts, one being the proposed District of which the Church is to be consecrated by the name and style of All Hallows, as aforesaid; and (4) that pending the provision of such permanent endowment a sum of £20,000 out of the proceeds of the said sale or sales shall be invested by us, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, and the income therefrom shall be paid in equal moieties to the Ministers or Incumbents of the said two new Districts:

“ And whereas the District hereinafter proposed to be constituted has been selected as the District for which a Church to be consecrated by the name and style of All Hallows shall be built and endowed as provided by the above-mentioned Order in Council:

“ Now, therefore, with the consent of the Right Honourable and Right Reverend Geoffrey Francis, Bishop of London (in testimony whereof he has set his hand and Episcopal Seal to this Scheme), we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, humbly recommend and propose that all that part of the said Parish of Twickenham which is described in the Schedule hereunder written, all which part together with the boundaries thereof is delineated and set forth on the map or plan hereunto annexed, shall, upon and from the day upon which any Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this Scheme shall be published in the London Gazette, become and be constituted a separate District for spiritual purposes by the name of ‘ The District of All Hallows, Twickenham ’.

“ And we further recommend and propose that the whole right of patronage of the said proposed District and, when such District shall have become a New Parish; then of such New Parish and the nomination of the Minister or Incumbent thereof shall, as provided by the said Order in Council bearing date the 23rd day of April, 1937, be vested in and exercised by the said Dean and Chapter of the Cathedral Church of Christ in Canterbury.

“ And we further recommend that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from recommending or proposing any other measures relating to the matters aforesaid or to any of them in accordance with the provisions of the said Acts, or of any of them, or of any other Act of Parliament.

“ THE SCHEDULE to which the foregoing Scheme has reference.

“ The District of All Hallows, Twickenham, being:—

“ All that part of the Parish of Twickenham, in the County of Middlesex and in the Diocese of London, which is bounded upon the east by the New Parish of Saint Stephen, East Twickenham, upon the north partly by the New Parish of All Souls, Saint Margaret's on Thames, and partly by the New Parish of Saint John, Isleworth, upon the west partly by the New Parish of Saint Philip and Saint James, Whitton, and partly by the New Parish of the Holy Trinity, Twickenham, all in the said County and Diocese, and upon the remaining side, that is to say, upon the south-east, by an imaginary line commencing upon

the boundary which divides the said New Parish of the Holy Trinity, Twickenham, from the said Parish of Twickenham, at the centre of the bridge leading into Marsh Farm Road across the Windsor line of the Western Section of the Southern Railway and extending thence north-eastward along the middle of the said line of railway for a distance of 29 chains or thereabouts to the centre of the bridge which carries London Road across the said line of railway and extending thence north-westward along the middle of London Road for a distance of 5½ chains or thereabouts to the centre of Cole Bridge which carries such road across the River Crane and extending thence north-eastward along the middle of the River Crane for a distance of 24 chains or thereabouts to the boundary which divides the said Parish of Twickenham, from the said New Parish of Saint Stephen, East Twickenham.”

And whereas drafts of the said Scheme have, in accordance with the provisions of the firstly hereinbefore mentioned Act, been transmitted to the Patrons and to the Incumbent of the Parish of Twickenham out of which it is intended that the District recommended in such Scheme to be constituted shall be taken, and such Patrons and Incumbent have respectively signified their assent to such Scheme:

And whereas the said Scheme has been approved by His Majesty in Council:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His said Council, is pleased hereby to ratify the said Scheme, and to order and direct that the same and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the time when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Acts.

And His Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the said Diocese of London.

WHEREAS the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England have, in pursuance of the Act of the 3rd and 4th years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, Chapter 113, of the Act of the 6th and 7th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 37, and of the Act of the 19th and 20th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 104, duly prepared and laid before His Majesty in Council a Scheme, bearing date the 23rd day of November, 1939, in the words and figures following, that is to say:—

“ We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, in pursuance of the Act of the 3rd and 4th years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, Chapter 113, of the Act of the 6th and 7th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 37, and of the Act of the 19th and 20th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 104, have prepared and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council the following Scheme
