### COUNTY OF LONDON.

THE CORONERS (AMENDMENT) ACT, 1926.

#### *Order for the Alteration of Coroners' Districts.*

Whereas by an Order made by one of His Majesty's Principal Secretaries of State on the third day of November, 1930, in pursuance of the power vested in him by section 12 of the Coroners (Amendment) Act, 1926, the County of London was divided into six coroners' districts as set out in the schedule to such order.

And whereas by an Order made by one of His Majesty's Principal Secretaries of State on the sixth day of August, 1932, in pursuance of the said power alterations were made in the area of two of the said districts.

And whereas by section 4 of the said Act it is provided that the right of any person having power to appoint a franchise coroner shall cease on the next vacancy in the office which occurs after the passing of that Act and that for all purposes relating to coroners the area in which the franchise coroner had jurisdiction shall thereupon, if and so far as it is not situated in a borough the Council of which has power to appoint a borough coroner, be merged in the County.

And whereas on the tenth day of May, 1939, a vacancy occurred in the office of franchise coroner for the Liberty of the Tower in the County of London.

And whereas the London County Council has, pursuant to section 12 of the Coroners (Amendment) Act, 1926, and to the Coroners (Orders as to Districts) Rules, 1927, submitted to the Secretary of State a draft Order providing for the alteration of the existing division of the County of London into coroners' districts so as to reduce the number of such districts to five and to include in one of the districts the area which, on the occurrence of the said vacancy, merged in the said County.

Now, therefore, I, the undersigned, one of His Majesty's Principal Secretaries of State, in pursuance of the power vested in me by section 12 of the Act above recited, do hereby order that the existing division of the County of London into coroners' districts shall be altered and that the said County shall be divided into five coroners' districts which shall be named and constituted as set out in the schedule hereto and substituted for the existing districts, and that the area in which the franchise coroner for the Liberty of the Tower had jurisdiction shall form part of the eastern coroner's district.

This Order shall come into operation on the first day of January, 1940.

#### THE SCHEDULE ABOVE REFERRED TO.

1. The eastern coroner's district comprising the Metropolitan Boroughs of Bethnal Green, Hackney, Poplar, Shoreditch, Stepney and Stoke Newington.

2. The northern coroner's district comprising the Metropolitan Boroughs of Finsbury, Hampstead, Holborn, Islington, St. Pancras and the City of Westminster.

3. The south-eastern coroner's district comprising the Metropolitan Boroughs of Bermondsey, Camberwell, Deptford, Greenwich, Lewisham and Woolwich.

4. The south-western coroner's district comprising the Metropolitan Boroughs of Battersea, Lambeth, Southwark and Wandsworth.

5. The western coroner's district comprising the Metropolitan Boroughs of Chelsea, Fulham, Hammersmith, Paddington, St. Marylebone and the Royal Borough of Kensington.
